# The New Cultural Centre Now Open

The Côte-des-Neiges-Notre-Dame-de-Grâce Borough now has a facility that truly reflects its identity: pluralistic, peoplefriendly and dynamic. The Notre-Dame-Grâce Cultural Centre opened its doors to the public on February 6, 2016. Close to 3,000 people took part in the full slate of activities held as part of this day of discovery.

More than 90,000 citizens have since visited the new Benny Library, and some 100 people attended the vernissage for the exhibition Danser à Montréal – A Tribute to Iro Valaskakis-Tembeck, which runs until September 11, 2016. ## **Supporting Urban Planning That Favours Health**

Fulfilling our vision of a healthy borough not only calls for promoting healthy nutritional habits, encouraging physical activity and using active transportation. It also requires that by-laws governing land use planning be amended to favour the creation of urban environments that promote healthy lifestyle habits.

In recent months, the Borough has adopted measures intended to modernize urban planning by-laws in order to reflect emerging concerns in the area of health and land use management and spur related development in the following areas: the forest canopy; community gardens; access to healthy foods; the modal aspect of active public transit and of services and businesses within walking distance; greening; public markets; urban heat islands; tree planting; green, grey or white roofs; and urban agriculture. The Borough adopted its health by-law in February 2016.

## White, Green or Pale-coloured Roofs

Planting trees and installing pale-coloured roofs are two preventive measures that can help mitigate heat island effects, and both are known to benefit persons vulnerable to ill-health. Henceforth, residents re-covering a flat roof will be required to err in favour of a white roof, a roof with a sun protection factor of (SPF) 56 or more, or a green roof. For example, the gravel on a multilayered asphalt roof can be replaced with white gravel.



# Record Investments in Road Repairs

In the coming weeks, the Côte-des-Neiges-Notre-Dame-de-Grâce Borough will begin its annual road repair operations. Close to 22 km of road sections will be repaved, for a total investment of \$17M, the highest since the creation of the boroughs in 2002. These work operations are financed through the 2016-2018 Three-Year Capital Works Program (TCWP), with an investment of \$2M, as well as various programs run by the central city. Added to this is the sum of \$2.5M from the Complementary Program of Leveling and Coating (PCPR) 2016.

Work operations under the Road Repair Program (PRR) will be carried out between now and the winter of 2016 on all the street sections cited in the adjacent table. They will include levelling operations to remove layers of asphalt, followed by the repaving of the sections in question. The sidewalks on these sections will also be rebuilt or repaired, depending on their degree of deterioration.

Road repair operations are meant to improve our road infrastructure and ensure the safety of the users of the borough's road network. These operations will be executed using techniques, materials and equipment that are compliant with the environmental standards in force.

Note that certain factors – including weather conditions, technical difficulties and mitigating factors beyond our control – could hinder the borough's ability to complete all the work operations scheduled for 2016. Operations not executed in 2016 will be completed on a priority basis in 2017.

# Dummy Nests to Deter Wasps

During the summer, the Borough fields numerous calls concerning the presence of wasp nests. And while they can (and with reason) be a source of anxiety to some, wasps play a beneficial ecological role as pollinators and formidable predators for a number of harmful insects.

In general, pesticides are required to exterminate wasp nests, but in certain cases, no intervention is required. For instance, when the nest is located more than 10 feet above ground, it is usually tolerated, either because the risk of being stung is low or because the chances of the nest falling to the ground are minimal. Even greater tolerance is practiced come the fall, given that the nests are abandoned as soon as the cold sets in and are not reused the following year.

The extermination of a nest on a building or in a private laneway comes under the responsibility of the owner.

# **No to Pesticides!**

Out of a concern with protecting the environment, the Côte des-Neiges-Notre-Dame-de-Grâce horticulture team initiated a pilot project aimed at deterring the use of pesticides in parks, which are considered sensitive zones. In early summer, therefore, residents may observe dummy wasp nests hung in the trees in the borough's parks. These dummies, which look like real nests, are said to deter wasp colonies, new or established, from taking up residence — a simple and safe means of protecting children and adults alike.







# **600 New 100 New 100 Trees** to Restore the Green Canopy in Côte-des-Neiges-Notre-Damede-Grâce

This year, the Borough plans to plant 600 trees in the public domain across its territory.

As part of efforts to increase the size of the green canopy in Montréal and replace the ash trees devastated by the emerald ash borer, the Borough launched a vast tree planting program. In addition, the Montréal Community Sustainable Development Plan 2010-2015 calls for a 5% increase in the size of the green canopy, from 20% to 25% by 2025.

Number of trees planted In 2014: 548 In 2015: 459 Tree maintenance is carried out by the Borough.

The Borough's objective is to plant 2,740 trees across its territory over the next five years. In order to achieve this, we are soliciting the collaboration of all citizens in order to make Côte-des-Neiges-Notre-Dame-de-Grâce a greener, healthier borough. Residents are thus invited to call 311 and submit a request to have a tree planted in front of their property. We will be glad to process all such requests.

# **Update on Ash Trees**

The emerald ash borer poses an additional challenge to our tree population and its management. In order to stem the spread of the insect, all branches must be shredded, and under no circumstances may felled trunks be transported on borough territory. The Borough stores the ash wood from April to October to prevent further infestations of the pest.

# An Inside Look at the Role Played by Pruners

Because the health of our trees is of vital importance to the borough, a number of city workers, including the borough's team of pruners, are charged with ensuring the health and safety of our trees.

**1 - Request:** Most tree maintenance operations are carried out in response to requests from citizens received at the Accès Montréal offices (311). These requests are typically for pruning operations, grubbing, felling and treatment against insects. Requests for inspection or treatment can also come from emergency services or teams from the borough.

**2 - Triage and inspection:** The foreman gives priority to urgent requests, including those concerning fallen trees, broken branches or other situations deemed dangerous. Regular requests are processed by an inspector who reviews the tree's history before conducting an inspection. Where required, the inspector dispatches pruners, who use a hydraulic platform to access the tree's upper reaches.

**3 - Treatment:** The foremen or forewomen plan the execution of the work operations based on a priority classification system, the need for prior intervention by Hydro-Québec, as well as the availability of the workforce and the required equipment. A variety of interventions may be prescribed, including pruning, guying, felling and grubbing. For each of these interventions, pruning teams may require the following equipment: hydraulic pruning platform (large or small), clambunk skidder, cables and ladders, stumpers, and shredders.

**4 - Cleaning:** A work team with specialized equipment is assigned to shredding branches and recovering debris. In general, debris is removed within two business days of the end of work operations.

# Safety First!

A safety perimeter is created to ensure the safety of employees and citizens, including pedestrians and drivers. These perimeters must be respected in order to facilitate the work of pruners and avoid potentially serious accidents.



While trees may need to be cut down on neighbouring properties, that doesn't mean the work operations will be executed concurrently. The problem may vary in nature from one tree to the next and may require the use of different equipment. Delays may be caused by equipment breakage, bad weather conditions and non-compliance with parking restrictions.

# Collection

## **Collection of Hazardous Household Waste (HHW)**

Dispose of your hazardous household waste on Sunday, May 29 between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. by bringing it to the yard of the municipal roads department at 2140 avenue Madison (corner of Saint-Jacques).

Hazardous household waste includes paint cans, batteries, aerosols, motor oil, car batteries, neon lights, compact fluorescent lamps, propane tanks and chemical products. Electronics (televisions, computers, monitors, fax machines, printers, etc.) may also be dropped off on this special collection day.

UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES must HHW be placed on the curb with household waste, as it poses a sharply increased health risk and hinders the proper function of collection equipment.

Please note that HHW can also be brought to the Côtedes-Neiges ecocentre at any time during the year.

#### **Regular Collections on Public Holidays**

Collections of household waste, heavy objects and recyclable materials will take place according to the regular schedule on the following public holidays: the Journée nationale des patriotes (May 23), the Fête nationale du Québec (June 24) and Canada Day (July 1).

### **Green Waste Collection**

This year, the green waste collection across Côte-des-Neiges-Notre-Dame-de-Grâce territory will take place on Wednesday, May 25, and then on Wednesdays from September 14 to November 16.

Green waste must be placed in paper bags or rigid reusable containers and deposited on the curb (like household waste) between 8 p.m. the day before and 7 p.m. on collection day. It can also be brought to the Côtedes-Neiges ecocentre, located at 6925 chemin de la Côtedes-Neiges.

# The Borough and You



The Citizen Alerts service launched by the CDN-NDG Borough in August 2013 will received a significant upgrade.

The tool will continue to instantaneously broadcast short messages on emergency or priority situations, but citizens will now benefit from a significantly improved version featuring new functionalities, including a much more accurate event geo-targeting function. Subscribers will also be able to receive alerts via SMS, or, in the case of a civil emergency, by telephone.

Citizen Alerts - a bilingual service developed by the borough's communications division in collaboration with the Web design firm Locomotive - has been a big hit with citizens. A user survey conducted in October 2015 showed a satisfaction rate of more than 89%, while 96% of respondents reported that the application was an effective means of communication.

# Making Way for Pedestrians

## A First for the Borough

۲

At the end of June, the Borough will inaugurate a temporary public space alongside chemin de la Côte-des-Neiges, with an adjacent green island between rue du Frère-André and chemin Queen-Mary. This space will connect to a pedestrian corridor built on the sidewalk along rue du Frère-André to provide a link with Saint Joseph's Oratory. Visitors to the Oratory will thus be invited to discover the charms of the neighbourhood, particularly the Côtedes-Neiges village core.

The planning is being carried out jointly with the Association des gens d'affaires de Côte-des-Neiges. An information session will be held for residents of the neighbourhood. The public space will have a local vocation, and it will be designed to encourage residents to make it their own. Measures will be put in place during the summer to mitigate the impact on traffic and parking. Vehicle traffic will be restored in the fall.
