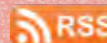

TRIBUTE TO A GREAT LATE MAN

SPRINGATE, George Philip Gregory,
CM, BA, BCL, LL.B, LL.D
1938 – 2019

It is with great sadness that we learned of the passing of Mr. George Springate, at the age of 81, on November 20, 2019, in Ottawa, where he had been residing for several years.

The son of immigrants, Walter Springate and Eleanor Woodhouse, George Springate enjoyed a multi-faceted career spanning 63 years. This included 11 years as a Montréal police officer, while simultaneously earning a BA from Sir George Williams University (now Concordia University) and two law degrees at McGill University. He was later awarded two honorary Doctor of Laws degrees by the University College of Cape Breton and Concordia University.

Over the years, Mr. Springate has also worked as a lawyer, sports commentator for the CBC, journalist for the Montreal Daily News, Professor of Law at McGill University and John Abbott College for more than 30 years, and kicker for the Montréal Alouettes football club that he helped win the Grey Cup in 1970.

He was a member of the National Assembly of Québec from 1970 to 1981. In 1973, he co-founded the Police Technology Department at John Abbott College. Mr. Springate served as a Canadian citizenship judge from 1999 to 2013, the last five years as Canada's Senior Judge, a position he held until his retirement.

In this capacity, he has presided over numerous swearing-in ceremonies for new Canadian citizens in various borough facilities thus welcoming many Pierrefonds-Roxboro fellow citizens into Canadian citizenship. More than 500,000 new Canadian citizens across the country have obtained their citizenship under his reign.

An outstanding citizen of Pierrefonds, he has done a lot to make his community shine over the years. Thanks to him, Pierrefonds had the opportunity to welcome the magnificent Royal Canadian Mounted Police Musical Ride on many occasions. The major events to which he was committed were all held for the benefit of sick or disabled children, a cause that was very dear to his heart.

In 1989, he was awarded the Order of Canada in recognition of his outstanding national contribution and numerous achievements within charitable organizations.

I was very saddened to hear of Mr. Springate's death. We had the pleasure of seeing him one last time, with his wife Judy Gill, a few weeks ago at the inauguration of the George Springate Sports Centre's synthetic multi-sport field named in his honour. It was a very moving encounter with this great man who marked the history of Pierrefonds and the entire West Island. He has touched many people with his generosity, professionalism, integrity and dedication through his many activities and during his rich and successful career.

We will always remember the incredible soul that he was and continued to be throughout his professional and personal life until the end. I was honored to know George for decades throughout my sporting life and career. He will remain a true inspiration for me in my professional as well as personal life. I am proud to keep his legacy alive knowing that he always did what was right and fair for all. We shall never forget him.

In honour of Mr. Springate's memory, the Pierrefonds-Roxboro Council announced that the traditional parade held each year in the borough on the First of July will be renamed The George Springate Canada Day Parade.

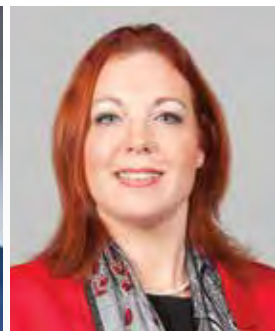

OUR ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2019



PIERREFONDS LIBRARY AWARDED A PRIZE FOR THE QUALITY OF ITS ARCHITECTURE

During the Congrès des professionnels et professionnelles de l'information (CPI) held on October 27, the Pierrefonds Library and Chevalier Morales group in consortium with DMA Architects received the 2019 "Architecture de bibliothèques et de centres d'archives du Québec" award.

The prize was awarded ex aequo to Bishop's University and Lemay Architects for their major library renovation project.

This is the second achievement for the new Pierrefonds Library as it was rewarded by the Canadian Architect magazine in 2015, well before the groundbreaking ceremony.

Every two years, since 2011, the Prize for Library and Archive Architecture is awarded according to analytical criteria relating to innovation, building integration in its environment, the improvement of the services offered, the appropriation by users and aesthetics.

It is with great pride that the Borough received this prestigious award, in collaboration with the architects of the project who were able to create an extraordinary place thanks to its exceptional concept, but also for the atmosphere and ambiance that it created for the citizens. Thank you to Ville de Montréal and the Government of Québec for allowing us to design this unique place that is proving to be already very popular with our population.

Borough Manager Dominique Jacob, Division Head – Library Louise Zampini, Culture, Sports and Recreation Manager Francyne Gervais and Borough Mayor Dimitrios (Jim) Beis, celebrate the award received with the library team.

INAUGURATION OF A THIRD SYNTHETIC SPORTS FIELD IN THE BOROUGH

At a ceremony attended by Borough elected officials, the Lester B. Pearson School Board representatives, participants from the local football, soccer and baseball associations, as well as municipal employees, held on September 24, Borough Mayor Dimitrios (Jim) Beis inaugurated the third synthetic sports field in the Pierrefonds-Roxboro borough.

Representing a \$5.2 million investment and thanks to a partnership with the Lester B. Pearson School Board, owner of the field, this new soccer/football field is located at the George Springate Sports Centre, located behind Pierrefonds Community High School.

The ceremony was attended by George Springate, in whose honour the sports centre has been named. A former football player himself - he won the Grey Cup with the Montreal Alouettes in 1970 - Mr. Springate gave a very inspiring speech, motivating and exciting for the young football players present, reminding them of the importance of education and the importance of pursuing their dreams.

The event was all the more an historic moment for our Borough since this was Mr. Springate's last public visit to Pierrefonds-Roxboro. Mr. Springate passed away on November 20, 2019.



THE LAYOUT OF THE CULTURAL PASSAGE ALMOST OVER

Work to complete the development of a cultural transit are well underway and should be completed in a near future.

The passage, which will connect the Borough Hall parking lot and the Pierrefonds Library, is part of the global design of the library grounds. The passage was designed as a park. It includes benches, lighting and trees, as well as landscaped paths leading to the front of the library where a terrace, paths and a wooden rotunda are located.

PIERREFONDS-ROXBORO BECOMES AN ALLIED MUNICIPALITY AGAINST DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

At its regular meeting held on November 4, the Borough Council proclaimed Pierrefonds-Roxboro as an Allied Municipality against domestic violence.

This proclamation is part of Québec's 12-day campaign to end violence against women, led by the Fédération des femmes du Québec and held each year from November 25 to December 6.

Pierrefonds-Roxboro thus becomes the first allied municipality against domestic violence in Montréal's West Island and hopes that all the other regional municipalities will also join this movement. Borough Mayor Dimitrios (Jim) Beis pointed out that he was very proud of this position, which sends a strong and united message to Quebecers that domestic violence is unacceptable.

He expressed his appreciation and congratulations to the West Island Women's Shelter for taking the lead on this great initiative.

THE TRAVELING CART

The Traveling Cart is an initiative from the Borough of Pierrefonds-Roxboro which aims to collect non-perishable goods all year round during special events, shows and community gatherings organized by the Borough to benefit our local food banks. Citizens are invited to give generously since the local food banks will benefit from this program.



PLANTING OF 400 TREES AT THE CLOVERDALE VILLAGE HOUSING CO-OP

On November 9, dozens of volunteers joined Mayor Dimitrios (Jim) Beis and Borough Council members to take up the challenge of planting 400 trees around the Cloverdale Village Housing Co-op.

Realized in partnership with the Borough, GRAME, as part of the "ICI on verdict!" campaign, the Éco-quartier Pierrefonds-Roxboro and of course the members of the Cooperative, the project was aimed at greening the cooperative. However, more than just a simple land beautification initiative, it is the prospect of improving the quality of life of the 866 households living in the cooperative that motivated the project since the newly planted trees will provide shade, freshness and healthier air for the occupants.



POST-FLOOD RECOGNITION EVENT

A magical evening under the sign of human warmth and solidarity!

In recognition of the work, collaboration, mutual assistance and dedication that animated all those involved during the 2019 spring flood, the Borough of Pierrefonds-Roxboro invited the population to a post-flood recognition event on October 10.

During this evening, employees, disaster victims, volunteers, partners and citizens were called upon to reminisce about the events of last spring. In addition to the stunning performances of guest artists Marie-Mai, Jonas and Radio Radio, the audience was treated to several touching testimonies, which highlighted the courage and resilience demonstrated by our community.

SERVICES TO CITIZENS

BY-LAW ON ANIMAL CONTROL

Montréal's By-Law on Animal Control sets out a number of rules for behaviour and civic-mindedness to ensure residents' safety and to facilitate cohabitation with animals.

If you live in Montréal and are the owner of a cat or dog, you must obtain a license and renew it each year, before its due date. Failure to do so within the time limit will result in additional fees being added to the cost of the license, as determined by the applicable By-law on tariffs.

Upon obtaining the license, you will be provided with a tag valid for the animal's entire life. It must be worn at all times by your dog or cat, unless your cat is microchipped. The tag and the microchip are two methods of identification that allow to contact you if your lost pet is found.

It should be noted that as of January 1, 2020, sterilization and microchipping will become mandatory for dogs and cats over 6 months old. If your pet is already microchipped, you are entitled to a discount on the license fee.

NEW PROCEDURES FOR THE PAYMENT OF TAX ACCOUNTS IN PERSON

The Borough is now using a new and safer cashing system that requires the registration of the identification number, and no longer the address, so that the account payable can be tracked in the system.

Citizens who wish to pay their tax bills in person at the Montréal Access Office must therefore present the coupons from their tax bills in order to provide the officer with the number linked to the account. Payments can be made:

- By cheque
- By debit card (check in advance with your financial institution for the limit allowed per transaction)
- In cash. Limit of \$500 per customer per day for security purposes.

It should be noted that payment can also be made by mail, by cheque to the order of Ville de Montréal, as well as at the counter or ATM of most financial institutions.

The Permit Counter is located on the ground floor of the Borough Hall, next to the Access Montréal Office. To reduce the waiting time to obtain a permit or certificate of authorization, you can make an appointment by calling 311. Leave your name and phone number so that an agent can contact you.

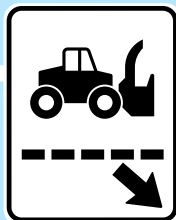

OPERATION SNOW REMOVAL LET'S ALL PITCH IN.



- Show consideration for pedestrians and do not put any snow on the sidewalk.
- Obey the parking regulations and move your vehicle in time.
- Place your garbage cans, bags or containers in your driveway and never on the sidewalk or a snow bank.
- Shovel snow on your residential or commercial land and not in the street.
- Park 30 cm from the sidewalk and place your snow clearance markers 60 cm from the sidewalk or curb, on your own grounds.
- Make sure you remove all objects from your driveway - logs, paving stones, concrete blocks, *Slown Down* lawn signs, etc. - that might be pushed into the street and cause a snowblower breakdown.

BOROUGH'S SNOW CLEARANCE

Less than 2.5 cm: ice melter and abrasives are spread.

More than 2.5 cm: roads and sidewalks are cleared during the snowfall.

If there is an accumulation of at least 10 to 15 cm: a snow loading operation gets underway, ordered by Ville de Montréal, and may take 2 to 6 days to complete, depending on the amount of the snowfall.

ON-STREET PARKING DURING WINTER

It is prohibited to park in the borough streets at night between 1 a.m. and 7 a.m., during the winter season, from November 1 to April 1.

On-street parking* is also prohibited at all times of day:

- during a snowfall where the accumulation on the ground is more than 5 cm;
- during snow removal operations;
- for as long as signs or warning signals are visible.

*except on streets where alternative parking is available.

TEMPORARY CAR SHELTERS

The deadline for removing temporary car shelters is April 15.

WOOD HEATING

Since October 1, 2018, only wood-burning stoves and fireplaces with an EPA or CSA certification to the effect that they do not emit more than 2.5 g/h of fine particles into the atmosphere are authorized throughout Montréal.

Owners of a solid fuel appliance or fireplace must report it within 120 days of purchase. Visit: montreal.qc.ca/woodburning.

Wood heating is one of the main causes of smog in winter. It is now prohibited to use solid fuel heaters during smog warnings.

- Consult the smog warnings issued by Environment and Climate Change Canada through the Info-Smog program: ec.gc.ca/info-smog.
- Check the online weather forecast and the warnings issued by Ville de Montréal on its social media:
Facebook - facebook.com/mtlville/ and
Twitter - twitter.com/mtl_ville.
- Keep an eye on the city's air quality on Montréal's website: ville.montreal.qc.ca, under Environment → Air → Air Quality Surveillance.

It should be noted that the use of solid fuel heaters is **exceptionally authorized during power outages lasting more than three hours.**

WHY HIRE AN ARBORIST?

Trees are majestic and useful organisms that need special care to insure their benefits without threatening your safety and the safety of your belongings. For example, pruning will eliminate the branches that are diseased, dead or dangerous while cabling will add support to branches with weak attachments.

Tree maintenance can be dangerous work, whether for the safety of people or for the tree's health. Therefore, it is advised to hire a qualified arborist.

But how can you tell if an arborist is qualified?

First, the arborist must be knowledgeable about the needs of trees and trained to provide proper care. Poorly maintained trees can lose their value or become dangerous. A good arborist will determine the type of pruning necessary to maintain or improve the health, appearance and safety of trees. Furthermore, he will be able to correct or secure the structure of a tree to reduce the risk of potential damage during storm events. He will recommend the tree removal as a last resort only. In this case, a certificate of authorization is required.

Québec's International Society of arboriculture (SIAQ) suggests some criteria to consider when choosing an arborist:

- Check for membership of a professional organization.
- Ask for a proof of insurance for personal and property damage as well as workers insurance (CNESST). Otherwise, you could be liable for damage or injuries caused during the work.
- Ask for references and consult the SIAQ website to know more about the arborist's reputation.
- Beware of individuals or businesses going door-to-door and offering bargains or work without an invoice.
- Ask for a written quotation that includes the description of the work to be done, the wood management and the site clean-up.
Reminder: Trunks and branches logged by contractors are not picked up by the Borough's branch collections. Make sure the contractor will collect them.
- Ask for several bids to compare the price/quality ratio.

CHRISTMAS LIGHTS CAN HARM PUBLIC TREES

Christmas lights bring colour and a festive touch during the holiday season. However, Christmas lights mounted on public trees, located in the public right-of-way adjacent to your property, **must be removed at the end of the holiday season**. Otherwise, they interfere with the work of pruners who maintain these trees. Often, they end up seriously injuring the trees that are smothered by electric cables. To protect our trees and facilitate our work, we ask for your cooperation in this regard.

AND DO NOT FORGET, IT IS FORBIDDEN:

- To stick, nail or broach anything on a tree on the public domain, under penalty of a fine.
- Damaging or destroying public trees.
- Cutting, pruning or cutting down a tree on the public domain.

These offenses are punishable by a fine of \$500 to \$1,000.

TRANSITIONING TO A «ZERO WASTE» KITCHEN

The Zero Waste movement took Montréal by storm this year! You'd like to get started too, but you're afraid it's too complicated? Do you know that taking the first steps towards Zero Waste can actually be much easier than it may seem?

Here are some tips and guidelines to follow that can help greatly reduce the waste generated in your kitchen on a daily basis:

PLANNING

The key to transitioning towards a Zero Waste lifestyle is planning. Planning in advance your meals and your shopping list are very important steps in assessing how much of each product to buy and avoiding food waste.

REDUCE THE USE OF SINGLE-USE PLASTICS

Be careful to avoid overwrapping and packaging made of single-use plastics. Several grocery stores and markets now offer customers **bulk and unpackaged products**. Bring reusable bags and nets, as well as various containers and Mason jars, to the grocery store. In doing so, you ensure that you eliminate unnecessary packaging and the use of single-use plastics.

Feel free to ask about the policies of your grocery store or market, which products are sold in bulk and which are available without packaging. If you have any doubts about which products you can put directly in your containers, check with the various counters in the store.

DISPOSE OF UNWANTED MATERIAL IN AN ENVIRONMENTALLY FRIENDLY WAY

Located at 3535, rue Sartelon, the Saint-Laurent Écocentre allows residents to dispose of products that are harmful to their health or the environment, such as construction debris, metal, obsolete electronic devices, old clothing and various objects that may have a second life.

From October 15 to April 14, the Écocentre is open from Tuesday to Saturday, from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. This schedule applies to statutory holidays, except the Christmas holidays. During this period, the Écocentre will be closed from December 22, 2019 to January 2, 2020 inclusively.
