



EAST COMMUNITY CENTRE TO BECOME GERRY-ROBERTSON COMMUNITY CENTRE

On the Borough Council's recommendation,
Ville de Montréal and the Québec Commission
de toponymie have agreed to name the
East Community Centre "Gerry-Robertson
Community Centre" as a tribute to this great
man who was Pierrefonds Recreation Director
from 1973 until his retirement in 2010.
Gerry Robertson passed away in 2015.

Mr. Robertson has been a pillar in the Pierrefonds community. In addition to his dedication to the well-being of the residents of the former City and the Borough, he was, in turn, Chairman of the Board of Directors of CLSC Pierrefonds for several years, a Director in the West Island Health Network and he was the Director General of the Table de quartier du Nord-Ouest when he passed away. He has been an immeasurable support to the sports, community and cultural associations of Pierrefonds. Thousands of volunteers were able to count on him in the organization of their respective activities.


The East Community Centre was chosen because Mr. Robertson played an important part in the process of analyzing the needs of the sector and building this centre for eastern organizations and citizens. Located on boulevard Gouin Ouest, across the street from the Sunnybrooke train station, the Community Centre was built in 2008 responding to a critical need for adequate municipal facilities in the area.

In addition, it is in this building, surrounded by his Social Development collaborators, that Gerry Robertson ended his career at Pierrefonds.

The new name will become in use during an official naming ceremony in the presence of Mr. Robertson's family and friends in June.

NEW PROCEDURES FOR THE COLLECTION OF BRANCHES

Two free collections each year

As of this spring, new procedures are coming into effect for the collection of branches in the borough.

Given the constant growth of the emerald ash borer and its spread throughout Montréal, it is no longer necessary to dispose of ash branches separately. As a result, the City has not renewed its seasonal branch collection program.

From now on, residents of Pierrefonds-Roxboro will be able to dispose of branches, whether they are deciduous or coniferous trees and regardless of their species, during the **two free collection periods** scheduled in the borough, the first in the spring and the second in the fall. This spring, the collection took place from **May 6 to 19**.

The fall collection will take place from October 14 to 27. The deadline for depositing your branches is October 13.

Branches, with a maximum diameter of 20 cm and a maximum length of 1.83 m, must be placed at the curb, with leaves positioned towards the house and branch stems towards the street.

There is no maximum limit. However, trunks and branches that were logged by contractors are not picked up during this collection. If you are contracting for the pruning or felling of a tree, make sure that the contractor will collect the trunks and branches.

You do not need to contact 311 to register for the collection. Borough teams will systematically visit the territory during the collection periods.

Outside the two free collection periods, residents may dispose of their deciduous tree branches up to a maximum of 5 cm in diameter and 1 m long, by placing them at the curb during the organic waste collection.

It should be noted that branches are not accepted in the collection of bulky items and it is prohibited to dispose of them on vacant lots and in parks at the risk of a fine.

SUBSIDIES TO ENCOURAGE THE USE OF CLOTH DIAPERS

As a measure to promote sustainable development, the Borough announced in 2018 the creation of a subsidy program for families wishing to transition from disposable to cloth diapers.

A result of a partnership with VertCité, the organization that oversees the Éco-quartier Pierrefonds-Roxboro, the program provides grants of up to \$100 each per child for the purchase or rental of cloth diapers, up to a total of \$4,500 per year for the program.

BY-LAWS

TO BETTER SERVE YOU

RELOCATION OF THE PERMIT COUNTER

In order to better serve its customers, the Permit Counter is now located on the ground floor of the Borough Hall, adjacent to the Access Montréal Office (AMO). As a result, service and collection are now available in the same location.

In addition, to make your task easier, several forms are now available online, on the Borough's website, including:

- 1. Request for Study of Acquired Rights
- 2. Request for Minor Exemption
- 3. Application for the Felling of an Ash Tree 4. Application for the Felling of any Other Tree
- 5. Appendix A: Request for an Occupation Usage Certificate Other than Residential

YOU WANT TO BUY A CABANA OR A SHED? HERE'S WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:



This type of building is considered an accessory structure. It is, in fact, a secondary building completely detached from your residence, but erected on the same ground.

General standards in figures

- Maximum number of accessory buildings per lot or of the same type: 2
- Minimum distance to the main building: 2 m
- Maximum height allowed, with a few exceptions: 4 m

Note: An accessory building located in a side yard adjacent to a street or in a backyard adjacent to a street, must be concealed from the street by one of the following two options:

- an opaque fence with a height of at least 1.5 m and not exceeding 2 m
- a dense hedge of evergreen shrubs or a hedge of conifers at least 1.5 m high

GARDEN CONSTRUCTION (SHED, CABANA)

No permit is required, but it is mandatory to comply with current regulations. Here are the main standards:

- Maximum authorized area of an unattached accessory building: 14 m²
- Maximum authorized area if the accessory building is located on a plot of land with a surface area greater than 1,000 m²: 28 m²*
- Minimum distance to the main building: 2 m
- Minimum distance to any property line: 0.3 m
- * A certificate of authorization is required when the area varies between 15 and 28 m².

DOMESTIC GREENHOUSE

- Maximum area: 14 m²
- Minimum distance from side or rear property line: 2 m

BY-LAWS



WANT TO ADD A POOL ON YOUR PROPERTY?

A permit from the Permit and Construction Division is required for the construction or installation of an in-ground or above-ground pool. However, construction or installation of a pool cannot begin before a certificate of authorization is issued.

Your application for a certificate of authorization must contain certain information and documents, including:

- 1. a plan to scale showing:
 - the location of the pool and its distance from the property lines and the buildings erected on that property
 - the dimensions and surface area of the lot and pool
 - the location of the deck providing access to the pool
 - existing trees in the projected perimeter of the pool
- 2. the location of mechanical equipment
- 3. the location, details, materials and height of the fence controlling access to the pool and, where applicable, the details of any stairway or ladder providing access to the pool and all details relating to the automatic door closing mechanism allowing access to the pool.

The by-laws include several other stipulations, with regard to the design of the required enclosure, access to the pool and equipment, for example. To know all rules and regulations, contact the Permit Counter (311) or visit the Borough's website.

ARE YOU FAMILIAR WITH WATER USE REGULATIONS?

When can I water?

It's easy to remember! Even addresses on even dates and odd addresses on odd dates. But only when it doesn't rain.



Manual watering is permitted at all times



With a removable sprinkler or soaker hose: 8 p.m. – 11 p.m.



By means of an automatic system, equipped with a moisture sensor: at night, 3 a.m. – 6 a.m.

You use a hose or equipment connected to the water system? There are rules to follow: Filling a swimming pool

- \boxtimes Not allowed 6 a.m. 8 p.m. starting May 16
- ✓ Permitted at any time from April 1 to May 15

Washing paved surfaces (e.g., asphalt), patios or exterior walls

- Prohibited, except during construction or landscaping work or for sanitary reasons
- ✓ Permitted at any time between April 1 and May 15

Other regulations

- ☑ No water may run off onto the street or onto neighbouring properties.
- All landscaped basins with a waterfall or water spray must be equipped with a water recirculation system.
- ☑ The use of air conditioning/cooling units operating with water and no recirculation loop is prohibited.

TREES ON THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY

The Borough of Pierrefonds-Roxboro is responsible for the maintenance of trees located in the right-of-way of a public road in accordance with the by-law dealing with cleanliness, public property and street furniture.

It is therefore prohibited for residents to intervene on trees located in the municipal right-of-way.

Damaging, pruning or cutting down a tree on public property as well as nailing, stapling or fixing anything to it is punishable by a fine ranging between \$500 and \$1.000.

The inventory of public trees is continuously updated by our inspectors to include new plantations, felling and maintenance needs for each tree.

To report a public tree requiring maintenance, contact us by phoning 311 or via the Borough's website. An inspection by our qualified employees will be carried out to determine the nature of the work to be done. Response times can vary depending on the urgency, ranging from a few hours to over a year.

It should also be remembered that several rules apply to private trees and thus it is recommended to entrust their maintenance to competent arborists. The Société internationale d'arboriculture du Québec is a good reference. Visit: **siaq.org**.

What is the municipal right-of-way?

This is the portion of land owned by the City that is located between the edge of the roadway and the boundary of adjacent properties. The City may use this land for its public facilities and for tree planting. It varies from one street to another.

How to measure the right-of-way?

Refer to your certificate of location for an accurate measurement of your property boundary.

All building owners are responsible for maintaining the municipal right-of-way (grass and cleanliness).

COLLECTIONS YOU NEED TO KNOW!

WHEN AND WHERE TO PLACE YOUR BINS OR BAGS

- No later than 7 a.m. on the day of the collection, but no sooner than 7 p.m. the day before
- In front of the building, in your driveway or on your property, as close as possible to the street or sidewalk

PLEASE NOTE:

Bins are not allowed on the street so that street cleaning operations can be carried out properly.

TIPS AND TRICKS FOR THE SUMMER

KITCHEN COUNTER BIN (INDOORS)

To keep your bin dry

- Avoid pouring liquids into your kitchen counter bin.
- Put newspaper at the bottom of the brown bin to absorb small amounts of liquid runoff.

To prevent odours

- Sprinkle some baking soda or place a charcoal briquette in each bin.
- Clean your bins regularly with a solution of vinegar and water.

To kill or repel insects

- Pour table salt to kill white grubs.
- Wrap your waste materials in newspaper or in a paper bag to repel insects.
- Freeze the remaining meat, bones and fish and put them directly inside the brown bin on the day of collection.

BROWN BIN (OUTDOORS)

To prevent bad odours and repel insects

- Take out your brown bin every week for the weekly collection, even if it is not full.
- Do not leave your outdoor bin in the sun.
- Sprinkle some baking soda or place a charcoal briquette in the bin.

To keep animals away

• Spray cough ointment or essential oils under the lid of your bin.
