Good news for schools

Saint-Laurent's schools made headlines with several major announcements in October. First, three primary schools officially opened their extensions, namely Beau-Séjour, Katimavik-Hébert and Enfants-du-Monde.



The President of the Commission scolaire Marguerite-Bourgeoys, **Diane Lamarche-Venne**, along with the City Councillor for Norman-McLaren District, **Aref Salem**, the Mayor of Saint-Laurent, **Alan DeSousa**, and the City Councillor for Côte-de-Liesse District, **Francesco Miele**, standing in front of the property where the new school will be in 2014.

School in the Bois-Franc sector

Later in the month, on October 28, the Commission scolaire Marguerite-Bourgeoys (CSMB) announced that it had purchased land where it will build the new 28-classroom elementary school in the Bois-Franc sector. The academic institution will be erected at the intersection of Boulevard Cavendish and the future Rue Claude-Henri-Grignon. Approximately 600 students will be able to attend the new school once it is completed. The plans and specifications are presently being prepared, and the work is expected to begin in winter with a partial opening scheduled for September.

Library subscriptions

Also on October 28, principals from English Montréal School Board (EMSB) in Saint-Laurent, a few students, and Saint-Laurent Council members gathered at the Bibliothèque du Boisé to underscore the signing of an agreement between the school board and the Borough. Under the terms of this agreement, the students from four schools under the EMSB located on Saint-Laurent territory will systematically receive Saint-Laurent library subscriptions.

Saint-Laurent council re-elected

The five outgoing Saint-Laurent Council members were re-elected with a solid majority in the municipal elections held on November 3 under Équipe Denis Coderre for Montréal. Accordingly, **Alan DeSousa** maintained his position as Mayor of Saint-Laurent with 10,899 votes, representing a 5060 vote lead over his closest adversary.

With respect to the city councillors, **Aref Salem** was reelected for Norman-McLaren District with 4294 votes, and **Francesco Miele** was reelected in Côte-de-Liesse District with 4559 votes. As for the two borough councillors, **Michèle D. Biron** was reelected for Norman-McLaren District with 4654 votes, and **Maurice Cohen** was reelected for Côte-de-Liesse District with 4881 votes.

It is important to note that 21,005 Saint-Laurent citizens exercised their right to vote out of a registered list of 58,554. This sets the participation rate at 35.87%, which is slightly higher than the 33.07% participation rate in 2009.


City Councillors appointed

Furthermore, the two city councillors representing Saint-Laurent were appointed to the Ville de Montréal Executive Committee. **Aref Salem** will be responsible for transportation and for all related matters throughout the city including: vehicles, taxis, bicycles, traffic, bicycle paths, sustainable mobility, transportation cocktail events, etc., and he will also represent Ville de Montréal in provincial and federal matters such as the Champlain Bridge. **Francesco Miele** was appointed leader of the majority. As such, he will serve as the administration's spokesperson responsible for municipal Council operations, among other things.

Continuity and stability in Saint-Laurent

A member of Saint-Laurent Council since 1990, **Alan DeSousa** expressed that he is very pleased to have once again garnered the trust of the people of Saint-Laurent. On behalf of his colleagues on Council, he thanked those voters who made the trip to fulfil their civic duty.

"In a way, the municipal elections represent the report card the public has given us for our past four years of hard work. We have done our homework and have achieved the objectives we set for ourselves: to open the new Bibliothèque du Boisé, to start construction on the sports complex, to pursue the Saint-Laurent en mouvement cultural project, to uphold the borough as a choice destination for families, and to preserve quality of life and social harmony, with full integrity," Mayor DeSousa explained. "We are committed to pursuing our mission while continuing to improve the quality of the local services we provide."



Montréal Municipal Council

Municipal Council is the main decision-making authority in Ville de Montréal. It is composed of 65 elected officials who are distributed as follows: the Mayor of Montréal, who is also the Mayor of the Borough of Ville-Marie, 18 borough mayors, and 46 city councillors.

The Executive Committee

Reporting directly to Municipal Council, the Executive Committee is formed of 11 members and the Mayor of Montréal. He exercises authority over local entities (local services offered on City territory) and agglomeration competencies (agglomeration services offered to the entire population of the Island of Montréal). He is responsible for preparing a variety of documents, including budgets and bylaws, etc., which are submitted to Municipal Council for approval.

Copper theft causes damage to streetlamps

Due to a long series of thefts of underground copper wiring used to power its streetlamps, the Borough of Saint-Laurent is asking its citizens to be watchful in order to limit the damage that until now has caused countless power failures as well as thousands of dollars in equipment repairs.

In an effort to resell the copper contained in electrical wires, thieves do not hesitate to force the access panels at the bottom of the streetlamps open and pull out the buried wires. Since these actions are normally carried out in two steps, citizens



can prevent power outages by quickly calling the Borough of Saint-Laurent at **311** if they notice that the access door is open or has been pushed in.

Furthermore, they are asked to notify the Service de police de la Ville de Montréal by calling **911** if they notice individuals not appearing to be acting in an official capacity at the base of a streetlamp.

BIODIVERSITY IN SAINT-LAURENT



Helping the birds in winter

Saint-Laurent is home to a rich biodiversity whose members live here for all of the year or only during the summer months. The last issue of this newsletter provided tips on how to support migrating bird and insect species prior to their migration departure. With the arrival of winter, it is important to also think of the birds that stay behind in spite of the characteristics of the season.

The best thing to do is install a feeder, which will help to increase birds' chances of survival in the coming months. It should be placed it in the shade near evergreen trees. With respect to choosing the right feed, sunflower seeds are highly recommended as they appeal to a wide variety of birds. Another idea is to alternate these with suet, because suet provides fats, which are a valuable



commodity in winter. In closing, the golden rule is to continue to feed the birds until spring.

Renewal of cat and dog licenses

Guardians of cats or dogs must obtain a license for each pet, whereupon they will receive a tag that their animal must wear at all times. Licenses are valid from **January 1 to December 31** and are available for a fee at the Citizens' Office.

Cat license*

Neutered cat: \$10** Non-neutered cat: \$20 Cat adopted from a shelter (for the first year): Free

Dog license*

Neutered dog: \$25**
Non-neutered dog: \$50
Service dog for person with a disability: Free
Dog adopted from a shelter (for the first year): Free

Special dog license***

Special license to keep three dogs: \$50 Special license for dog walkers (more than two dogs) : \$100

The cost of licenses will be reduced by \$5 for pets implanted with a microchip.

A \$5 fee will be charged for the replacement of a tag that has been lost or destroyed.

*An additional \$10 fee will be charged for licenses renewed after February 15.

**New: A \$5 discount is granted to residents aged 65 or over for a permit for a sterilized dog or cat.

***The cost of a special license is in addition to the cost of a regular license.

Important: Keeping more than four animals—all species combined–is prohibited





In addition, the Borough is one of the few to participate in the **Jessica Campaign** by outfitting its heavy vehicles with lateral side guards to protect pedestrians and cyclists.

Citizens

Snow-removal is an activity where the valued cooperation of residents can make a real difference. That's why we recommend following these steps:


- Pay attention to special signs.
- Place waste and recycling bins at the entrance to the driveway, as close as possible to the street, never on the sidewalk or snowbank (or wait for the next collection if your bins are not full).
- Place stakes along the edge of the property a minimum of 1,5 metre from the inside edge of the sidewalk.
- Maintain a minimum 30 centimeter space between the edge of the sidewalk and the parked vehicle in order to allow snow removal vehicles to access the sidewalks (including folding in the side-view mirrors).











BYLAWS

For residential properties that have <u>sufficient</u> space for snow disposal, it is against the law to dump snow on public property.

For residential properties where space on private property is insufficient, snow can be dumped in the street, prior to snow removal operations being carried out as long as the following conditions are met:

- Snow may be dumped on the edge of the street in front of the owner's building, on the side of the street where the building is located.
- Dumped snow must not impede pedestrian or vehicle traffic, or block access to a building or driveway.
- The height of snow banks that are created must not exceed 2 metres from the curb and sidewalk.






