PUBLIC CONSULTATION

Draft 2017-2022 Heritage Action Plan

The *Commission sur la culture, le patrimoine et les sports* invites citizens as well as representatives of organizations and institutions to take part in a public consultation on the city's draft 2017-2022 heritage action plan titled *S'ancrer dans l'identité urbaine montréalaise*.

This action plan is in line with the Heritage policy adopted in 2005, whose major orientations remain relevant. It targets issues that concern today's Montrealers and that require an immediate response from the city. The new action plan updates the intervention practices and means of action in regards to heritage, in order to meet the challenges that arise in a society that has evolved considerably since the adoption of the policy.

The public consultation will be held in three parts. The first, an information session, will be intended for the presentation of the draft action plan, as well as a public question period. The second part will be the hearing of opinions and briefs. The adoption of recommendations by the committee will be the object of the third part:
