

## CALL FOR CANDIDATES

From August 27 - October 14, 2018, the Ville de Montréal is launching a Call for Candidates to attract new members to the Conseil des Montréalaises.

### **MANDATE**

Created in 2004, the Conseil des Montréalaises is made up of 15 volunteers, all women. Its principal mandate is to advise City Council on all matters affecting the quality of life of women in Montreal, including the status of women, equality between women and men, and equality among women. The CM seeks to reflect the composition and diversity (social, economic, ethnic, cultural, geographic and intergenerational) of women in Montreal.

### **SELECTION CRITERIA**

CM members are chosen based on a diversity of personal and professional backgrounds. They are appointed by City Council on the recommendation of a selection committee. Members serve a three-year term, which may be renewed once.

Women who wish to become members of the Conseil des Montréalaises must submit their resume in French, along with the Application Form below.

To become a member of the Conseil des Montréalaises, the applicant must:

1. Have an interest and experience in issues dealing with the status of women and equality between women and men, and among women.
2. Be knowledgeable about municipal issues.
3. Have been actively involved in one or more areas of Montreal's economic, cultural, scientific, union, social, community or educational life.
4. Be available to attend 8-10 CM meetings per year, as well as the meetings of the special committees tasked with addressing specific issues (meetings are held in French).
5. Live in one of the city's 19 boroughs.
6. Have a working knowledge of French (the working language of the CM).

<sup>4</sup> Person with a disability: Anyone with a deficiency causing a significant and persistent disability and who is liable to encounter barriers in performing everyday activities.
