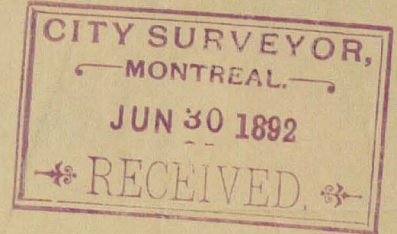

Dear Sir,

Complaints have been made that the side-walk on Burnside Place - recently opened from Guy Street - is not of a sufficient width to accommodate the public, and the people using this street, and I have been informed that the City authorities will lay a proper side-walk on this street, provided that their action in so doing will not be at any time subsequent construed as being an act of possession on the part of the City.

I therefore write you this note stating that, as proprietor of the land on this Street, I should be glad to see a proper side-walk made on the upper side of it, and beg to state that any action you may take in putting down this side walk will not bind the City to take possession of this street, or will be construed as an act of possession on the part of the City in the future
