Redeveloping and Increasing Safety in the Laurentien-Lachapelle Sector

Lachapelle and Chevalier becoming one-way streets

Ville de Montréal hereby wishes to inform you that as part of the work project under way in the Laurentien-Lachapelle sector, rue Lachapelle and rue Chevalier will become one-way streets starting August 24, 2018.

Pavement marking and signage operations will be carried out on the section of rue Lachapelle between boulevard Gouin Ouest and rue De Salaberry in order to establish the new configuration. These measures are aimed at improving the functionality of the existing arterial network at the approach to the Lachapelle bridge.

Marking operations will be carried out at night and may cause temporary adjustments to traffic. The City is urging road users to exercise caution and to remain attentive to the signs installed there.

Impacts

- **Traffic:**
 - rue Lachapelle: Northbound traffic only along rue Lachapelle between rue De Salaberry and the Lachapelle bridge
 - rue Chevalier: Reversal of the one-way direction to be compatible with the new configuration of rue Lachapelle. Traffic will run only from west to east on the section of rue Chevalier between boulevard Gouin and rue Lachapelle.
- **Parking:** Restrictions in the surrounding area as well as in the worksite area. Parking spaces will be set up on rue Lachapelle.
- **Access to buildings:** Maintained for homes and establishments at all times. If you encounter access difficulties, call 514 872-3777 (*Info-Travaux*) and leave your name, address and telephone number. The project managers will call you back as soon as possible.
- **Noise and dust:** Possibility of dust and noise caused by the comings and goings of trucks in the worksite area
- **Public transit:** Service will be maintained, but there may be changes to stops. STM-INFO: 514 786-4636 or stm.info.
- **Waste collections:** Waste and recycling collections will be maintained all throughout the work project. It is important to identify your bins so that they can be returned to the right home or business. Put out your bins as usual on collection days. The contractor will make them accessible for collection and move them as needed. Unidentified bins will not be returned and will remain at the collection point near the worksite after the truck has passed. If your bin is identified, you will find it in front of your home or business as usual, after the collection.

The City is aware of the inconveniences that this work may cause and is taking all necessary measures to keep the impacts to a minimum.
