Redesign of Rue Saint-Antoine

Complete closure between Avenue Atwater and Avenue Brewster

Start: week of September 25, 2023

Approximate duration: 5 weeks

Redesign works

- **Starting September, 25**
Rue Saint-Antoine: reconstruction of the roadway, granite kerbs and asphalt paving.

Emergency works

- **Starting September, 18:** maintenance work on the drinking water network lasting approximately two weeks is being carried out as part of another worksite on Avenue Atwater, between Rue Saint-Antoine and Boulevard René-Lévesque.

Traffic

Rue Saint-Antoine

Starting September, 25

- Between Avenue Atwater and Avenue Greene: complete closure. On-site signage will indicate the planned detours.
- Between Rue Vinet and Avenue Atwater: one lane maintained westbound.

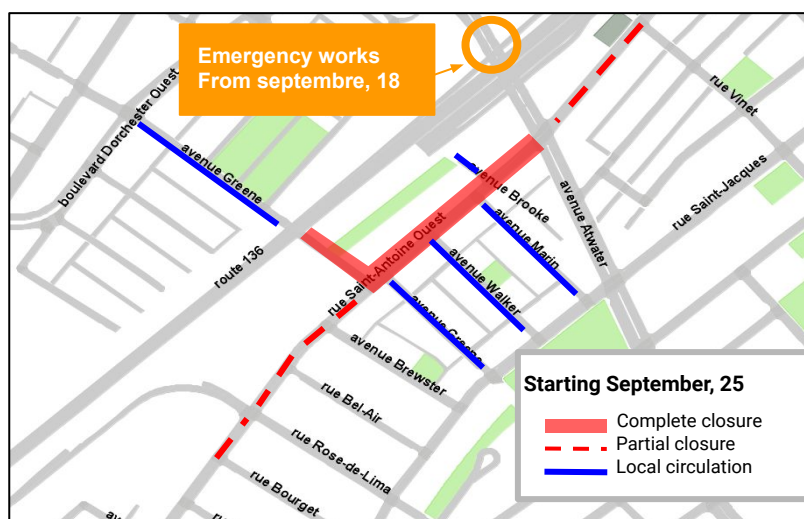
Avenue Greene

- Local circulation possible between Rue Saint-Jacques and Rue Saint-Antoine and between Boulevard Dorchester and Rue Prospect.

Avenue Atwater

Starting September, 18

- Closure of northbound lanes east of the median strip, between Rue Saint-Antoine and Boulevard René-Lévesque. A contraflow lane will be set up on the west side of the median.



**Collection
schedules**

- Usual schedule. Obstructed areas: Place your bins and trash cans, clearly labelled with your address, in the usual location. Containers that are not accessible to collectors will be moved by the contractor.

Work schedule

- Monday to Friday, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- Saturday, 8 a.m. to 7 p.m., and Sunday, 9 a.m. to 7 p.m., if necessary.

- Arrangements have been planned to allow pedestrian traffic at all times.
