Rehabilitation work on main and secondary water pipes

On Rue Westcroft, between Rue Sherbrooke and Avenue Elm

Work will begin in summer 2023 and end in fall. The grey iron pipes installed in 1964 need work in order to secure the transport and distribution of water in the area.

The work site

Expected duration: 90 days

The work involves the rehabilitation of drinking water mains.

To limit inconvenience to the public, this project incorporates work planned by the City of Beaconsfield. As such, during this project, secondary water pipes will be reconstructed and two fire hydrants will be replaced.

Traffic obstructions

On-site signage will provide instructions to follow during the work (detours, speed limit, parking, local traffic, etc.).

Parking

Parking spaces will be used temporarily for equipment and to ensure a safe perimeter around the work site. Check the signage in the area as it may be changed as needed.

Accessibility

Access to homes and businesses will be maintained and pedestrian corridors will be provided if sidewalks must be obstructed.

Location of work



If you are planning a move, are planning to have work done on your property, or for any other situation that should be reported to the person in charge of the work, call 311 to speak with an agent.

Rehabilitation work

Reconditioning via the liner technique consists of lining the internal wall of a pipe with a flexible membrane coated with resin (liner). This minimal-excavation technique extends the life of a pipe by more than 50 years, minimizes obstructions, work time and the use of polluting and expensive machinery.

These are the steps:


- Preparing the pipe and taking measurements to make the membrane (liner) Making the liner
- Liner construction
- Inserting and installing the liner inside the pipe
- Fixing the liner to the pipe wall through the hardening process
- Testing for leaks and restoring service

A temporary water supply system will be installed to provide the buildings with water for the duration of the work.

How to prepare: keep informed

- You will receive a detailed notice a few days before the work begins.
- Follow construction sites by borough on the Info-travaux map.
