MESSAGE FROM THE BOROUGH COUNCILLOR - CAP-SAINT-JACQUES DISTRICT A BICYCLE RIDE IN THE WEST ISLAND, WHY NOT?

Our Borough offers such a unique variety of historical treasures. Furthermore, we have the opportunity to enjoy two great nature parks located at the limits of our territory: Cap Saint-Jacques on the West and Bois-de-Liesse on the East end.

A stroll on boulevard Gouin Ouest, chemin Senneville and chemin du Bord-du-Lac will allow you to admire beautiful ancient houses of this heritage bicycle trail. You will find over a hundred commemorative plaques describing all these jewels of the 18th, 19th and 20th centuries.

A few years back, one of our councillors was a member of the Société du patrimoine de l'Ouest-de-l'Île which produced an index of many historical locations of our area. Members of this organisation, founded in 2002, are very active doing research either on housing estates delimitation by milestones installed in ancient times by the Sulpicians, or with metal detectors trying to discover old chiselled stones, sometimes referring to techniques used over 5000 years ago.

Both Pierrefonds and Roxboro Public Libraries offer conferences allowing us to enrich our knowledge on all those treasures. We also have the opportunity to inform our official archaeologists from the ministère de la Culture, des Communications et de la Condition féminine of our discoveries.

Enjoy a nice ride and keep me informed should you make interesting discoveries.





ROAD SAFETY

Vehicle loop detectors to allow a better traffic flow at traffic lights

What is a vehicle loop detector?

A vehicle loop detector is an intelligent controller that senses the presence of vehicles and changes the traffic light cycle. The electronic mechanism connected to a control box is embedded in the pavement behind the stop line, and is identified on the pavement by a white oval pictogram.

How does it work?

To be detected, a vehicle must remain motionless over the loop for a few seconds. After a delay, which varies according to the intersection, the sensor triggers the request for a green traffic light. Therefore, it's very important to drive the vehicle up to the stop line allowing its detection by the system. If you're waiting to exit a side street or to make a left turn, the traffic light will change to red on the main street and to green on your side allowing you to cross an intersection or turn safely.

Drive safely!

MUNICIPAL BY-LAWS

DOG AND CAT LICENSE RENEWAL

Medals are on sale at the Borough Hall

The Pierrefonds-Roxboro By-law CA 290011 specifies that: "No one can keep a dog or cat within the borough limits without obtaining a permit, in conformity with the provisions of this by-law." It is therefore forbidden to keep a dog or cat without a license in the Pierrefonds-Roxboro Borough.

A permit for a dog and a cat is valid from August 1 of one year to July 31 of the following year. Dog and cat owners must obtain a tag for their animal by filling out the form below. In case of more than one animal at the same address, photocopy as needed or write the information on a sheet of paper.

The maximum number of animals allowed in a dwelling is three (3 dogs, 3 cats or 3 of these animals combined).

The form and the sterilization certificate* must be:

- Mailed to the Borough Hall, 13665, boulevard de Pierrefonds, Pierrefonds (Québec) H9A 2Z4 with the appropriate payment;
- Or brought to the Citizen Services Office of the Borough Hall – where the licenses are sold – from Monday to Thursday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Friday from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m.

Upon receipt of the duly filled and signed form, the tag and the receipt will be given or mailed to the owner.

Dates in this table apply to residential sectors and schools. There is no collection of recyclables in businesses and industries.

Garbage

For buildings of 9 units or more, schools and businesses, the collection is performed twice a week, on Mondays and Thursdays.

Green residues and dead leaves

The only containers accepted are the see-through or orange plastic bags.

Hours

Containers must be placed in front of the building, after 8 p.m. the night before and no later than 7 a.m. the day of pick-up.

COLLECTIONS

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION

Household Hazardous Wastes are not accepted as household garbage or bulky items, nor as recyclable materials. They must be brought to the locations, on the dates and times indicated below. It is strictly prohibited to deposit hazardous wastes on city property, at all times.



If you cannot wait for the next collection, inquire with local merchants. Paint retailers often accept left over paints and garages usually take used oils and old tires.

Ville de Montréal ecocentres enable you to dispose of your HHW anytime free of charge. A proof of residence "Ville de Montréal" and a proof of identity with photo are required to access to the ecocenters. The closest ecocenters are: Acadie \$\frac{100}{2}\$ 514 872-1376 and Côte-des-Neiges \$\frac{100}{2}\$ 514 872-3517. List of all ecocenters is available on: ville.montreal.qc.ca/ecocentres.



AFTER THE RAIN... DISEASES

According to statistics from Environment Canada, rainfall for the month of May 2011 were twice as abundant as usual. These excessively humid conditions allowed several fungal diseases to settle on our trees. These diseases, whose symptoms are sometimes spectacular, are more often than not benign and have little effect on the plant's health in general. Here are some diseases associated with a cool and wet spring.

Anthracnose

This disease caused by a large amount of fungi affects mainly ash, oak and maple trees. The leaves are covered with brown spots early in the season and will sometimes curl and drop prematurely.

White or powdery mildew

This disease particularly affects the Norway maples, especially those with red foliage and several perennial plants that are in a garden. The leaves are covered with white spots that can extend to the entire leaf in a dusty white down. A cool and wet spring is responsible for this infectious disease and then it will develop more rapidly in warm and dry days.

Maple Tar Spots (Rhytisma acerinum)

The symptoms of this disease are well known and easily recognizable. The maple leaves are covered with black spots, which look like tar in late summer. The leaves may fall prematurely.

Scabs (Venturia sp.)

This disease affects fruit and ornamental trees such as hawthorn, apple and decorative crabapple trees. Before the end of June, black spots appear on the foliage which may turn yellow and fall prematurely. A severe infection may cause the leaves, the flowers and the fruit to fall.

Prevention above all

Although these diseases generally do not affect the tree's survival, a repetitious infection can affect their strength and make them more susceptible to other pathogens. Here are a few recommendations to diminish the risk of an infection:

- Prune trees so as to allow better air circulation inside the crown;
- Avoid the use of synthetic nitrogen fertilizers on your lawn and focus more on a natural fertilizer;
- Since these diseases can hibernate on leaves, we recommend that you gather the dead leaves from the infected trees and place them in the green waste collection

rather than put them in your composter where the heat will not suffice to eliminate the disease.

PHOTOSENSITIZING PLANTS

In nature as in a garden there are plants that contain phototoxic substances that will be transformed with the ultraviolet rays of the sun and may become irritating or even toxic to the skin. The phytophotodermatitis (a skin reaction caused when in contact with a plant followed by exposure to the sun) is not an allergic reaction and can affect anyone.

The symptoms will appear within 24 to 48 hours after contact with the skin and are characterized by redness, burns or blisters that can leave marks for months. The severity of the reaction depends on the amount of the substance on the skin, the intensity of the ultraviolet radiation and the duration of sun exposure.

Among the phototoxic plant variety in the garden are dill, celery, carrot, marigold, fennel and anise. In nature, be wary of the sap of wild parsnip and giant hogweed.

In order to prevent the above mentioned problems, wear gloves while gardening and always wash hands after gardening. In nature, the best way to prevent such irritations is to clearly identify the plants that cause dermatitis, these being the wild parsnip, the giant hogweed and also poison ivy (the last one being an allergic reaction in this case) and to prevent the skin from being in contact with the sap of these plants.

If you believe that you have been in contact with a photosensitizing plant, wash the affected areas with soap and avoid exposing those areas to sunlight by covering them for at least 48 hours and then use sunscreen in the future. In case of a severe irritation, which is rare, it is best to consult with a pharmacist or your doctor.

GRUB SCREENING

While the population of European chafer has declined significantly over the past two years, these beetles are still present in the area. Their larvae, commonly called white grubs, are to be screened at the end of August at least in order to take appropriate action before seeing any damage appear. Here is an effective method to screen for grub:

 Using a shovel or a sod cutter, set a patch at approximately 30 cm by 30 cm;



- Remove the patch of grass and earth to a depth of about 10 cm or more if the soil is very dry;
- Sift through the removed layer of earth and the roots all the way up to the crown of this sample;



- Count the amount of European chafer larvae for this surface (about 1 square foot) to determine the degree of infestation and determine the need for an intervention;
- Repeat this exercise at different areas in your yard. It's possible that the infestation is local.

In general, experts agree that a healthy lawn tolerates the presence of white grubs. If there are more than five grubs per square foot, it is best to intervene, especially if there has been damage in the past.

In 2011, la Patrouille bleue members are proud to report that they've sensitized 1528 citizens and handed out 1610 pamphlets on the reduction of drinking water consumption.

Indeed, with their blue campaign T-shirts, banners, pamphlets, and posters in hand, our five patrollers could not go unnoticed. Beginning May 14, they crisscrossed many West Island boroughs and cities.

The Patrol's main mission was to sensitize as many citizens as possible to the value of simple (but so very important) actions they can take to preserve such a crucial resource, our water.

ECOLOGICAL GARDENING DAY: STARRING COMPOST!

On a beautiful sun-filled day, June 4, 2011, the Borough of Pierrefonds-Roxboro, along with the Eco-Quartier of Pierrefonds-Roxboro and the Société d'horticulture et d'écologie de Pierrefonds, organized an Ecological Gardening Day at the Riverdale School-Park.

Results of the household hazardous waste collection 2011

16,327 kg of Household Hazardous Wastes were diverted from landfills thanks to the participation of **747 families** in the household hazardous waste collection.

Strengthened by la Patrouille verte 8-members, along with volunteers, the Pierrefonds-Roxboro éco-quartier participated to this successful event. Its team was responsible for the welcoming of residents, who came in large numbers to get flowers, tree seedlings, mulch, and compost, all distributed free of charge by the borough.

The éco-quartier participated also to three kiosks: one on the recovering of rainwater, a second distributing native trees, and a third on vermicomposting. It also distributed grass seeds (courtesy of la Ferme québecoise), as well as root growth supplement, white and green bean seeds, and clover mix, in addition to 480 transparent bags for leaf collection in the fall (thanks to the support of the Optimist Club of Roxboro), and 100 bags of vermicompost (thanks to the support of la Pépinière de l'ouest).

At the end of the day, the éco-quartier had supervised a draw for a rainwater barrel, a compost bin and a water saving kit. All in all, however, the star of the day was undoubtedly the compost. Citizens, armed with their shovels, containers, and wheelbarrows, scraped the asphalt to the very last bit.

On a beautiful spring day, the Pierrefonds-Roxboro éco-quartier had its big spring cleanup on April 30, 2011.
