

PROTECTION OF A LARGE PARK WITH A RICH BIODIVERSITY IN PIERREFONDS-ROXBORO

Since 2004, Ville de Montréal has provided protection to several hundred hectares of the 10 ecoterritories of Montréal. It is through these actions over the years that the citizens of Pierrefonds-Roxboro borough will benefit from a huge park

rich in biological diversity around the only river still in its natural state on the island of Montréal.

The implementation of the protection of the natural habitats of *Rivière à l'Orme* is a collective success. With funding of \$2.6 millions from Québec Government, Ducks Unlimited Canada, a private organization whose mission is to conserve wetlands and natural habitats, the ecological corridor in the West Island will link the Cap-Saint-Jacques Nature Park to Angell Woods in Beaconsfield. The purchase by Ducks Unlimited Canada of 60 hectares of land in the Pierrefonds-Roxboro borough will establish an ecological strategic link between several sites dedicated for conservation purposes. This new land will be yielded to the Ville de Montréal to ensure its development according to environmental criteria.

This conservation project combining a real estate development illustrates the importance of protecting environment, not as an obstacle to economic growth, but as an added value for development. This project is an example of sustainable development, and I am delighted it takes place here in the Pierrefonds-Roxboro borough.

The ecoterritory is a natural treasure. The beauty of its landscape reveals a wide biodiversity which contains essential elements of a great quality of life in our borough.

On behalf of the members of Council, I am pleased that the citizens of Pierrefonds-Roxboro borough will benefit from the protection of several hectares of natural habitats. It is a legacy for future generations and it is here, in Pierrefonds-Roxboro.




For more than 100 years,

DOG AND CAT LICENSE RENEWAL

The Pierrefonds-Roxboro By-law CA 290011 specifies that: "No one can keep a dog or cat within the city limits without obtaining a permit, in conformity with the provisions of this by-law." It is therefore forbidden to keep a dog or cat without a license in the Pierrefonds-Roxboro Borough.

A permit for a dog and a cat is valid from August 1 of one year to July 31 of the following year. Dog and cat owners must obtain a tag for their animal by filling out the form below. In case of more than one animal at the same address, photocopy as needed or write the information on a sheet of paper.

The maximum number of animals allowed in a dwelling is three (3 dogs, 3 cats or 3 of these animals combined).

If you cannot wait for the next collection, inquire with local merchants. Paint retailers often accept left over paints and garages usually take used oils and old tires.

BRANCHES COLLECTION

This year again, Borough Council has granted residents another grace period offering free collection of branches with the only condition that people call 311 and leave their address with the agent.

The second free collection period is from October 11 to November 11 inclusively.

Branches no more than 5 cm (2 inches) in diameter can be put out for regular refuse collection, all year round, provided they do not exceed 1 m (3 feet) in length and are tied in bundles.

JUST A REMINDER

CHIMNEY SWEEPING

Chimney-sweeping and the cost incurred are the homeowner's responsibility. To prevent fires, have your chimneys inspected and cleaned at least once a year. Always call upon a professional chimney sweep.

For your own protection as well as his, insist on seeing his or her Professional Qualification Certificate and proof of insurance.

You will find professional chimney sweeps in the Yellow Pages.

360 LITRES RECYCLING BINS DELIVERY

The new 360 litres rolling bins will be delivered to your door between August 15 and October 15, 2010. You must use it upon delivery.

CLIENTELE

The recycling bins will be delivered, **free of charge**, in all single-family and multi-family dwellings of 8 units or less in the borough. It will be **deposited in your driveway**. All necessary information concerning recyclable materials and the use of the rolling bins will be provided along with the bin. **64 litres recycling boxes will no longer be collected**. We recommend you keep it for any other purpose. **Do not throw it in your new bin.**

INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE

SCHEDULE

The collection day will remain the same, that is **Mondays** for properties located **West of St-Jean Boulevard** and **Thursdays**, for properties located **East of St-Jean Boulevard**.

LOCATION

The bin must be set out by the curb after 8 p.m. the evening before and no later than 7 a.m. the collection day. **It must be placed on your property, wheels and handle facing your home.** Never place the bin on the sidewalk or street.

RECYCLABLES

Place all recyclables unsorted **in the bin**.

Help us keep the streets clean, **make sure the container lid is closed** and that it **does not overflow**. In addition, the container lid must be free of debris (recyclables, snow, etc.).

Do not place any recyclable materials outside or beside the bin, as employees of the contractor will only empty the bin and not recover any products placed nearby.

MOVING

If you plan on moving, the bin, being City property, **must be left on the premises**.



GREEN [LINE] INVASIVE ALIEN SPECIES

Purple Loosestrife (*Lythrum salicaria*): Invasive but less harmful than we thought

Native to Europe and Asia, Purple Loosestrife is a beautiful plant growing approximately 1 meter high with purple to magenta flowers, in spikes. Its long lasting and abundant bloom as well as its easy maintenance are horticultural qualities that were responsible of the public's interest in garden centers. Even in 1829, Canadian nurseries were selling its seeds.

Purple loosestrife has rapidly spread in natural wetlands, following railroads, highways and waterways construction. Today, it is omnipresent along waterways, like the Saint-Laurent River. Its invasive properties come from its abundant seeds production (2.7 millions seeds were reported on a single plant). Furthermore, the plant does not have any predators in North America. It is practically impossible to eradicate since it has a thick, deep root carpet. The plant can also regenerate from burned root segments. Because of these abilities, Purple Loosestrife has for a long time been considered as a pest, a scourge, a monster. **But is it as bad as we might think?**

Recent studies have shown that, in Québec, its impact on biodiversity is not too important, in comparison with other alien species. Although it is invasive, it does not outcompete other marsh

plants species and does not affect batrachians or birds species. According to observers, Purple loosestrife is more an indicator of disturbance than the cause of a problem. Its population is declining and major infestations are becoming rare.

However, **we should avoid planting it in our garden** for ecological concern, especially when living near a wetland.

Common Reed (*Phragmites australis*): a tall invader of wetlands

Existing in North America for more than 3000 years, it is mostly from the end of the 1950's that Common reed had took by storm Québec's territory. The important road development projects have disturbed natural habitats resulting in the remarkable expansion of Common reed population. We can notice its presence following highways everywhere in Québec, from Abitibi to Gaspésie regions.



Common reed is a tall grass plant of 1.5 to 2.5 meter high with purple to brown feather-shaped flowers. It is easily propagated by its rhizomes (underground stems) which can regenerate a colony from small fragments. When it is established in wetlands, Common reed forms dense and monocultural colonies that quickly overwhelm available space. Colonies are impenetrable, leaving the area of low value to wetland fauna and flora.

Common reed adapts to periods of flooding and drought and tolerates a wide range of temperature. It is considered as one of the most difficult invasive species to control. Its eradication is the subject of many researches as the situation is judged out of control.

Don't forget to clean your canoes, boats, motors and all-terrain vehicles when you visit areas infested by invasive species.

LEAF BLOTCH OF HORSE CHESTNUT (*GUIGNARDIA AESCULI*)

At the end of the summer, we often notice the presence of brown lesions on horse chestnut leaves. In some cases, they are symptoms of summer drought, heat or air pollution. In other cases, they are caused by a fungal disease called "leaf blotch of horse chestnut".

The disease overwinters in dead leaves and spreads to trees during the following spring. Infection occurs during spring wet days. In summer, orange brown lesions surrounded by yellow appear. The tree then looks "burned". The leaves dry and drop prematurely. Tiny black spots are visible on affected leaves. Generally, the disease is mostly of aesthetic concern and does not affect the health of trees seriously. However, repeated infections could create a stress that favors infections by other pathogens.

To maintain the infected tree's vigor and to prevent disease infection, it is recommended to remove the grass under the tree and replace it by compost and mulch. It is also suggested to

fertilize the tree with 100% natural fertilizers (seaweeds, compost, chicken manure, etc.). Rake and destroy infected leaves. You can also keep them for the green waste and dead leaves collection during fall. The disease will be destroyed during the large scale composting process.

Finally, prune the tree to open the crown and allow a better drying of the leaves, water being responsible for the spring infection.

No treatment is effective to control and cure the disease. Prevention is the only way to reduce infections.

ECOLOGICAL GARDENING DAY 2010: A TOTAL SUCCESS!



The ecological gardening day took place on June 5th at the Roxboro Park. This year, vehicles were denied access close to the compost piles, which ensured the security of all, as well as the conviviality of the site. We had also invited organisations such as Union Saint-Laurent Grands Lacs and the Canadian Food Inspection Agency, both of whom had the mandate to inform the public on the exotic and invasive species. The D.D.O.-Roxboro Comity for a healthy environment as well as RÉSEAU environment were present to educate citizens on the dangers of pesticides and on responsible water

consumption. The Société d'horticulture et d'écologie de Pierrefonds, partner of the event, promoted gardening and its activities.

Many came to the Éco-quartier Pierrefonds-Roxboro kiosk, who was also a partner of the event, in order to receive free perennial and annual plants and also to obtain pertinent information regarding composting, the use of rain water, and recycling. Tomato plants were given to children, thanks to the Club Optimiste de Roxboro. The kiosk of the Green Line of the borough was also very busy; many were interested in the control of white grubs, weeds, and ants.

We asked the participants what environmental practices they would be willing to adopt after the ecological gardening day, and here are some of the answers we received:

- To re-use and recycle more.
- To compost or compost more and more efficiently.
- To reduce their consumption of tap water and to use rain water.
- To plant trees, to grow their own vegetables, and to make their yard better by planting flowers. To divide their perennials and to share them with neighbours and friends.
- To control insects, diseases and weeds with natural products and prevent infestations by improving the health of the soil.
- To watch out for the presence of invasive or dangerous plants or insects.

Congratulations to Ms. Miryam Anglade and to Ms. Diana Jean who respectively won, through the draw, a water barrel and a composter.

A VEGETABLE GARDEN FOR THE CHILDREN IN PIERREFONDS-ROXBORO

The Pierrefonds-Roxboro éco-quartier began a vegetable garden project in May 2010, with the goal of educating children on the subject of gardening and urban agriculture.

The garden was designed in such a way that groups of children from schools and day camps could reserve a time slot to come garden and pick some vegetables, giving those who may never have had the opportunity to try gardening the chance to get their feet wet and their hands dirty, while learning about urban agriculture, greening and plant accompaniment. The decision to use planting boxes was taken for several advantages that it gives us: the ability to use a smaller amount of land more efficiently, elimination of the need to test for the soil type, the raised boxes facilitates maintenance and increased ease of rotation of the garden to help enrich the soil.



Due to the garden's geometric formations and its ordered setup, visitors will enjoy its aesthetic character. Gardening tools, gloves, a board and chairs are provided in order to teach the children in a natural setting. A composter and a rain barrel are also part of the décor in order to teach children about valorizing organic matter and to teach the importance of recovering rain water to use for the plants in a garden. Several pieces of furniture, which were picked up off the street, were used as elements in our garden; a wooden chair, which has a cucumber plant climbing it, being one example.

We would like to invite group leaders to contact us at the éco-quartier in order to reserve a time slot and bring their groups to take part in some gardening and a short course on horticulture and agriculture.

Many species of fruits and vegetables were planted; some examples are radishes, tomatoes, beans, peppers, fine aromatic herbs, cabbage, nasturtium, carrots and lettuce.

This summer the Green Patrol was composed of three students. They distributed information to all the day camps in Pierrefonds-Roxboro, informing the monitors of the gardening activities offered by the éco-quartier.

The Patrol also spent a great deal of time informing citizens on waste management and, more accurately, on how to valorize green waste, compost, as



well as how to create ZERO WASTE day camps. Time was also spent discussing how to recuperate and use rainwater in order to best adapt to climate change and the dry conditions that were seen this year.

As is the case each year, the patrollers went door to door, biked across the territory, set up many information kiosks and distributed thousands of flowers to the citizens of Pierrefonds-Roxboro.
