What can you drop off?

Ecocentres aren't dumps! Only recyclables are accepted.

- Refrigerators, freezers and air-conditioners containing halocarbons (coolant gases)
- Information and communications technology devices (computers, printers, sound systems, televisions, DVD or VHS players, etc.)
- Items that could be reused
- Bulky upholstered items (sofas, armchairs, etc.)
- Recyclables: paper, cardboard, and glass, plastic and metal containers for household use
- Ferrous and non-ferrous metal items
- Bicycle tires, inner tubes and worn-out automobile tires measuring 33 inches or less
- Construction, renovation and demolition waste (wood, gyproc, asphalt shingles, aggregate less than 45 cm in diameter consisting of brick, mortar, stone, asphalt or concrete, uncontaminated soil. etc.)
- Household hazardous waste (HHW) (paint, oil, solvents, pesticides, bleach, etc.)
- Green waste



Before you throw it away - can it be reused?

All ecocentres have a reuse centre. Residents wishing to dispose of items that are still in useable condition can drop them off at a reuse centre. These donations will be given to reuse organizations or companies.

> It makes your visit to the ecocentre simpler and faster.

Separated materials are worth more: they can be passed along to specialized recyclers.

Residential rates

Only Montréal Island residents have access to ecocentres.

Proof of residency AND photo ID are required.

Per year

12 m ³	free
Over 12 m ³	\$25 / m³

Maximum of 15 visits for construction material, except at the LaSalle Ecocentre, where there is no limit on the number of visits allowed.

Commercial rates

Small businesses and self-employed workers with their place of business on Montréal Island (proof required) are subject to the following rates.

The only materials accepted from commercial businesses are metals and construction debris.

Construction material\$25 / m³Maximum of 15 visits per year, except at theLaSalle Ecocentre, where there is no limit onthe number of visits allowed.

Metal: unlimited, free

Non-profit organizations may make an unlimited number of free visits.
