Impacts of Canada Post's decision to eliminate home mail in urban areas for the population of Montréal

The Commission sur le développement social et la diversité montréalaise will hold a public meeting on the impacts of Canada Post's decision to eliminate home mail in urban areas for the population of Montréal.

This consultation will allow the Direction de la diversité sociale, the Direction de l'urbanisme and the Direction des travaux publics to present the information available regarding the installation of community mailboxes in densely populated urban areas, as well as their analysis of the situation. The members of the commission wish to learn more about the impacts of the elimination of home mail delivery for the citizens of Montréal, especially regarding seniors and persons with disabilities or reduced mobility concerned by:

- the consequences of this decision;
- the location of the community mailboxes (installation, accessibility, parking, traffic, safety);
- the maintenance of community mailboxes (cleanliness, snow removal, lighting).
