Most complaints received at the Borough concern the three bad habits below:

- 1. Failure to comply with the hours for placing waste materials by the curb. Whether household waste, recyclables or green waste, these materials must be placed outside after 6 p.m., the day before the collection, or before 7 a.m. on the morning of the collection (see the collection schedule below). And then there are the illegals—those who dispose of their gar bage anywhere, anytime, with a "no one sees, no one knows" attitude.
- 2. Failure to comply with the Bylaw on dogs, which are prohibited in most parks, public places and along almost all of the waterfront areas (see Bylaw on dogs below).
- 3. Failure to comply with the speed limits on the Borough's streets.

These are some of the many bad habits that adversely affect all residents' quality of life and safety. Civic-mindedness is a matter of respect. Help us help you by reporting to us any infractions of these basic rules of decency.

PLEASE NOTE:

- As much as possible, use paper bags or garbage cans for green waste. Plastic bags will be prohibited, once and for all, starting in 2016.
- In order to fight against the infestation of emerald ash borers, branches must be picked up separately from other green waste. Phone 311 for details on how to dispose of them.

Repairs to tennis courts

Within Ville de Montréal's supra-local sports facilities program, the tennis courts in LaSalle park will be fully renovated:

To dispose of waste materials, bulky items and hazardous household waste, free of charge, you must go to Écocentre LaSalle.

PERMITS AND AUTHORIZATIONS

Information on the various permits and authorizations may be obtained online, at <u>www.lachine.ca</u>, or by phoning the Division des permis et inspections at 514 634-3471, extension 296. We wish to remind you that these permits and authorizations are required before starting your work projects.

Here is the list of permits and authorizations:

- Tree cutting
- Balconies, galleries, verandas
- Accessory buildings, garages, storage sheds
- Special certificate of authorization
- Demolition
- Signs, billboards
- Driveway
- Fireplace or stove
- New construction
- Temporary occupancy of public property
- Swimming pool



BYLAW ON DOGS

Out of respect for all Borough residents, the Bylaw imposes a certain number of rules of conduct on dog owners:

- At all times, dogs must be kept on a leash (under 1.8 metres long) unless they are in a fenced-in property.
- At all times, your dog must wear an ID tag issued by the Borough and valid for the current year. In case a dog runs away, that tag can often guarantee that your dog will be found and returned to you.
- Dog owners must pick up their pets' droppings using a bag and must dispose of it properly.
- In general, dogs are prohibited in parks, playgrounds and public places, except at the following parks:
 - o Promenade du Rail, between 10e Avenue and 29° Avenue, and between rue Victoria and rue William-MacDonald
 - o 55° Avenue, at the corner of Autoroute 20
 - o rue Victoria, at the corner of 40° Avenue
 - o Stoney Point waterfront park, between 45° Avenue and 56° Avenue, 6 a.m. 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. 10 p.m.
 - o Dog park at the corner of rue Victoria and 28^e Avenue (dog run)

Pilot project

A resolution was tabled by Borough Council to lift the restrictions on walking dogs along the waterfront walking trails, except at René-Lévesque park, October 15 and April 15 inclusively, and to have the restrictions maintained the rest of the year.

This pilot project is being carried out February 1, 2015 – April 15, 2016 inclusively; however, Borough Council reserves the right to re-examine the project at any time during the trial period, if necessary.

Dog park

The dog park is located on rue Victoria, near 28° Avenue, and is restricted to members of the *Famille canine de Lachine*, the organization mandated by the Borough of Lachine to ensure proper management of this park.
