

ACCEPTED MATERIALS

- Refrigeration, freezing and air conditioning units containing halocarbons (refrigerant gases)
- Household appliances
- Electronic products (e.g. computers, cellphones, printers, audio systems, televisions, DVD or VHS players, etc.)
- Articles to be reused
- Large upholstered furniture (e.g. sofas, armchairs, mattresses, etc.)
- Paper, cardboard, glass containers, plastic containers and metal containers
- Ferrous and non-ferrous metals
- Used bicycle tires, car tires and inner tubes (84 cm or less)
- Construction, renovation and demolition waste (e.g., wood; gypsum; asphalt shingles; aggregates of less than 60 cm in diameter made of brick, mortar or stone, asphalt or concrete waste; uncontaminated soil, etc.)
- Household hazardous waste (HHW) (e.g. paint, oil, solvent, pesticide, chlorine, etc.)
- Green waste and conifer branches (directives may vary according to the season*)
- * Deciduous branches are not accepted in order to fight the Emerald Ash Borer.



DONATION CONTAINER

Every ecocentres has a donation container where you can deposit clothing, linen and household accessories (i.e. bed sheets, towels, table cloths, kitchen linen, etc.)

BEFORE THROWING AWAY, THINK ABOUT REUSE!

Furniture, household items, books, toys, sports items and other objects that are still useable may be left at one of the ecocentre reuse centres (same opening hours as the ecocentres). These donations are sent to organizations or businesses that work in the field.

ACCESS AND FEES

Agglomeration residents

- All residents on the Island of Montreal have access to the ecocentres.
- They must show up in person with proof of residency and a photo identification card.
- The service is free, except for construction materials exceeding 12 m³ per year, with the excess charged at \$25 /m³.
- Maximum of 15 loads per year for construction materials, except at the LaSalle ecocentre, where visits are unlimited.

Contractors and self-employed construction workers*

- Fees:
- > Construction materials: \$25/m³
- > Metals: free
- No household hazardous waste (HHW) accepted
- Maximum 15 loads per year, except at the LaSalle ecocentre, where visits are unlimited
- Accepted vehicle length varies from one ecocentre to another. It is preferable to check ahead of time by phone or online before visiting.
- * Must be accompanied by a resident of the agglomeration or show proof that their business is located on the Island of Montreal.
