



CALL FOR CANDIDATES

From August 27th to October 14th, 2018, the Ville de Montréal is accepting candidacies of individuals committed to serve as member on the Conseil jeunesse de Montréal (CjM).

MANDATE

The Conseil jeunesse de Montréal is composed of 15 volunteer members with no formal party affiliation, between the ages of 16 and 30, who are representative of the geographic, linguistic, social and cultural diversity of Montreal's youth. Members of the CjM advise the mayor and the city's executive committee on youth issues to ensure that the interests of 12 to 30-year olds are taken into account in municipal decision-making.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To become a member of the Conseil jeunesse de Montréal, the applicant must::

- 1. Show an interest in youth issues and in improving the lives of young Montrealers.
- 2. Be between the ages of 16 and 30.
- 3. Be available to attend monthly CjM meetings (8-10 per year) as well as meetings of its committees tasked with addressing particular issues (about 3 hours per week).
- 4. Live in Montreal or have owned a business in Montreal for at least one year.
- 5. Furthermore, to allow new voices to be heard, to prevent the accumulation of representational functions and to ensure the non-partisan nature of CjM, the applicant shall not be a board member of the Forum jeunesse de l'île de Montréal, or on the executive committee of a political party or union.
- 6. Have a working knowledge of French (the working language of the CiM).
