Citizens' Emergency Preparedness Guide

To commemorate the 2013 edition of Civil Protection Week taking place from May 5-11, the Mayor of Saint-Laurent, **Alan DeSousa,** announced the online launch of a new *Citizens' Emergency Preparedness Guide* for the people of Saint-Laurent.

Offering the reminder that safety in the community is one of Saint-Laurent administration's leading concerns, the Mayor explained: «My colleagues on Council and I have intensified initiatives over the past few years to enable the population to fully enjoy the tranquility that comes from a stimulating learning environment where they can thrive. The Urban Security Patrol, which operates at all times, and the adoption of our Emergency, Succession and Mission Plan, are two excellent examples. Nonetheless, our preparations would not be complete without citizen participation. This is why we have revised our Citizens' Emergency Preparedness Guide in order for each and every member of the Saint-Laurent community to be prepared to effectively fulfill his or her role with respect to their personal safety and that of their families, if needed.»

Family Emergency Plan

The guide is available on the Saint-Laurent website in the «Publications» section at the following address: **ville.mon-treal.qc.ca/saint-laurent.** In addition to providing tips on

precautions to take when faced with the most common risks, it also includes new steps to follow to prepare a more complete family emergency plan and emergency kit.

New Urban Safety coordinator

«During the guide's revision, we benefited from the expertise of our new Urban Safety coordinator, **Jean-Charles Gris.** In addition to being involved in the security field and holding a number of university degrees on the topic, including in criminology, Mr. Gris served as a gendarme in various units in France for five years, including a land brigade, a highway patrol, and a riot squad. Needless to say, he is bringing sizable support to the Saint-Laurent administration, thus helping to propel it towards its objectives.»

Is important to remember that the patrol is complementary to the services of the community police, with which it maintains close and ongoing ties. It is operational all year round, 24 hours per day, seven days per week, in order to exert increased surveillance on the territory and ensure compliance with bylaws in a number of activity spheres. An award for Avenue De Saint-Exupéry

The Borough of Saint-Laurent won the award in the **Sécurité routière : aménagements et interventions sécuritaires** (Road safety: safety configurations and interventions) at the latest Gala des grands prix d'excellence en transport organized by the Association québécoise des transports et des routes (AQTR) with its Réaménagement de l'avenue De Saint-Exupéry project. The purpose of the ceremony, which was held on May 29 in Québec, was to underscore projects that are designed to significantly improve safety and transit across the province.

The reconfiguration project on Avenue De Saint-Exupéry started in 2011 with the addition of numerous elements including bicycle lanes, markings indicating the presence of sidewalk openings, and flower planters to delineate the space and protect pedestrians from turning vehicles. In light of positive comments received from citizens and a noted improvement with respect to sharing the road, the markings and flower planters have been replaced with permanent structures at several intersections throughout the district.

These structures provide heightened safety for residents by reducing pedestrian exposure time and requiring vehicles to slow down. The bicycle lanes and delineators made it possible to determine precisely how much space to leave for cyclists, thereby improving their cohabitation with motorists and pedestrians and ensuring that lanes are shared more fairly.

Fighting poverty and marginalization

On May 6, the members of Saint-Laurent Council hosted the representatives of 13 local organizations whose projects received a total of \$243,374 in subsidies under the terms of the Entente de lutte contre la pauvreté et l'exclusion sociale adopted by Ville de Montréal and the Ministère de l'Emploi et de la Solidarité sociale.

The projects were selected following a call for tenders evaluated by a jury that included participation by

the Borough Councillor for Norman-McLaren District, **Michèle D. Biron.** The applications submitted were required to target the population in a specific district, namely the Chameran belt, Crevier/Norgate, Place Benoit or Ward/Gold. Projects that have been selected in recent years have served to improve the offer of services for residents in these specific districts. Nonetheless, they remain vulnerable. Accordingly, the purpose of the funding is to pursue efforts that are already under way.

Recoverable large trash item collection

A recoverable large trash item collection will take place during the first collection day of the month in each sector. Also, a **second collection** of large trash items will take place, exceptionally, in each sector after the moving period:

Monday, July 15: Sector 3

Tuesday, July 16: Sector 2

Thursday, July 18: Sector 4

Friday, July 19: Sector 1

ACCEPTED MATERIALS: Furniture, mattresses, household appliances, wood, construction, renovation and demolition waste, large cardboard items, metal or plastic residue, styrofoam, glass, mirrors and carpets

PROHIBITED MATERIALS: Household waste, televisions, electronics or computer equipment, refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, hazardous household waste (HHW), batteries, tires, branches, dead leaves and green waste





Green waste collection

Green waste collection will continue until November 22. 2013 according to the schedule as recycling collection. Green waste must be placed on the curb in paper bags (not plastic) or in reusable containers. **NEW:** Evergreen branches are accepted in this collection

Collection of tree branches

Call 311 to have them picked up.

Place them outside in bundles without being tied together at the edge of the curb on your property so that the cut end is facing the street.



Ecological gardening is easy!

Gardening is a gratifying activity that is accessible to anyone, as long as sufficient space is available. It is preferable to adopt ecological gardening methods, as these will have a direct effect on the quality of the environment in addition to protecting Saint-Laurent's urban biodiversity.

An extensive assortment of tools, materials and accessories are available on the market for all of your natural gardening needs. The use of a domestic composter, for instance, can help you to obtain natural and free fertilizer. Along the same things, herbicycling, which entails leaving the grass clippings where they land during mowing, is one of the easiest and most profitable ecological gardening methods available! Also important to remember is the fact that for several years now, the use of pesticides has been **banned** on the territory.

Biodiversity Week

Sustainable parking facilities rewarded

In May, Saint-Laurent had the honour, at the Palais des congrès de Montréal, of being presented with the **Ovation municipale Award from the Union des municipalités du Québec (UMQ)** in the Environnement et développement durable category, for its bylaw entitled «Bylaw on the configuration of parking spaces from a perspective of sustainable development».

Adopted in 2009, this bylaw is in line with the Borough's Local Sustainable Development Plan. Among the reflections leading to its creation we must mention the objective of adapting to the real needs of businesses, stores and the owners of multifamily housing units, as well as of helping to eliminate urban heat islands by reducing the size of our carbon footprint by adding greenery. Several strategies have been proposed, namely decreasing the minimum number of parking spaces required, establishing a maximum number of parking spaces (unlimited under the old bylaw), eliminating the obligation to provide parking spaces, and requiring

more underground parking facilities for residential use.

The impact of this bylaw is not limited to the Borough of Saint-Laurent. In fact, several of the measures it proposes are mirrored by the *Bureau de normalisation du Québec (BNQ)* in its guide entitled *Lutte aux îlots de chaleur urbains – Aménagement des aires de stationnement,* (Eliminating urban heat islands – Configuration of parking areas) a document that is intended for urban designers in Québec.

This Ovation municipale Award, presented by the UMQ, represents the third distinction obtained for this project in as many years, in the wake of the 2011 National Municipal Environment Award presented by the Canadian Association of Municipal Administrators, and the Mobilité durable (Sustainable Mobility) Award from the Association québécoise du transport et des routes (AQTR) in 2012

New Trucking Plan to ensure peace for residents

Saint-Laurent has begun implementing its Trucking Plan, which from now sets the ground rules for truck traffic across the territory. This plan indicates the routes heavy vehicles should take as well as traffic schedules that must be followed, except in the case of local deliveries.

«The purpose of introducing a trucking network across the Saint-Laurent and Montréal territories is to ensure tranquility for residents, to better serve the commercial and industrial zones, and to optimize the positioning of an integrated network», declared the Mayor of Saint-Laurent, **Alan DeSousa.**

This bylaw will also facilitate truck traffic, and truckers will benefit from enhanced traffic control signals and a detailed map, thereby enabling them to follow more easily the stipulated itineraries. The tranquility in residential neighborhoods will also improve, since transit traffic involving these types of vehicles is now prohibited in these areas. The installation of approximately 400 additional signs has already begun and will be completed by the end of summer 2013.

An oasis of freshness in the city

To commemorate World Environment Day on June 5, the Borough of Saint-Laurent unveiled a pilot project involving the introduction of a freshness oasis at the intersection of Cavendish and de la Côte-Vertu boulevards. Composed of 10 trees and more than 300 indigenous shrubs, the oasis aims to demonstrate the significant temperature variances in real time, on a solar-powered electrical panel, between surfaces planted with trees and the roadway.

Accordingly, on June 5, the two temperatures reported were 24°C compared with 15°C. This phenomenon can be explained by the fact that mineralized surfaces absorb and store solar power. The project therefore demonstrates that the most effective and simple solution to fight heat islands in urban settings is to increase the number of green spaces and trees on the territory.

For several years now, the Borough of Saint-Laurent has been increasing such initiatives. The annual planting of some 1000 trees by its teams, and the adoption of a bylaw on the configuration of parking spaces that promote sustainable development (See Page 6), are prime examples.

The product of an initiative of Saint-Laurent, and pooling of efforts by several partners including Savaria, Techno-Contact and the Comité Écologique du Grand Montréal, the project received a subsidy under the 2012 edition of *TD Green Streets headed* by Tree Canada. The latter strives to promote good practices in terms of sustainable development projects relating to trees in urban settings.

The microchip – protection for your pet!

There is a simple and effective way to protect your pet or to even be reunited with it if it wanders too far. The microchip is an electronic device the size of a tiny grain of rice that is inserted under the animal's skin. It is a capsule containing a unique identification number that is linked to a database containing important information about the animal, including its owner's contact information.

In order to provide cat and dog owners with the opportunity to acquire a microchip for their pet at a reduced price, the Borough of Saint-Laurent, in collaboration with the Association des techniciens en santé animale and the SPCA Montréal, is holding a microchip clinic on **Sunday, September 29** from

10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Centre des loisirs (1375, rue Grenet).

Residents who are interested must register online on the Saint-Laurent Website at the following address: **ville.montreal.qc.ca/saint-laurent/animal control** before August 23, 2013. Costing \$20, the fee for the procedure must be paid on-site in cash or using a credit or debit card. The fee includes microchip implantation by qualified personnel.

IMPORTANT: Registrations will not be accepted onsite. Only animals wearing the Borough tag will be microchipped. Nonetheless, tags can be purchased at the site.
