THE MAYOR, ALDERMEN AND CITIZENS of the City of Montreal duly assembled in Council at the City Hall, in the City of Montreal, on monday the fifth day of July in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty one, by virtue of the authority vested in them in and by an Ordinance of the Governor of the late Province of Lower Canada and the Special Council for the affairs of the said Province made and passed in the fourth year of Her present Majesty's Reign intituled: "An Ordinance to incorporate the City and Town of Montreal" and also by a subsequent Ordinance of the said Governor and Special Council made and passed in the fourth year of Her said Majesty's Reign intituled "An Ordinance to amend the Ordinance to incorporate the City and Town of Montreal",

WHEREAS public inconvenience has been occasioned by the enforcement of the first, third, fifth and ninth clauses of the twenty ninth section of the by-law of the said Council passed on the twenty second day of May last past intituled "By-Law for the better government of the Public Markets and Market Places in the said City and to increase the revenue therefrom", be it therefore ordained and enacted and it is hereby ORDAINED AND ENACTED that the first, third, fifth and ninth clauses of the said Twenty Ninth section of the said By-Law shall be and they are hereby severally repealed.-
