By-Law to amend By-Law No. 333, entitled "By-Law to prevent the obstruction of pedestrians or traffic and the disturbance of the public peace in the streets, lanés, highways and public places in the City."

(Adopted 23th December, 1907)

At a special meeting of the City Council of the City of Montreal, held in the City Hall, this twenty-third day of December, one thousand nine hundred and seven, after the observance of the formalities prescribed in and by the act of incorporation of the said City, at which meeting a majority of the members of the whole Council are present, viz : His Worship the Mayor H. A. Ekers, Esq., in the chair, Aldermen Payette, Larivière, Proulx, Yates, Clearihue, Major, Dagenais, Robillard, Labrecque, Turner, Bumbray, Gallery, Lavallée, Lapointe L. A., Stearns, Lévy, DeSerres, Leclair, Lapointe N., Giroux, Mercier, O'Connell, White, Laviolette, Gadbois, Robinson, Ward, Martin J. B. A., Nault, Séguin, Martin M., Marin, Lévesque, Houllé, Guay, David, Roy, Molson.

It was ordained and enacted by the said Council as follows :

Sect. 1.—By-Law No. 333 is amended by adding, after Sect. 2, the following sections :

“(2a) Every person found lying or loitering in a state of intoxication in the streets, lanes, public places, fields, yards or other places, in the City, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

(2b) Every person strolling or loitering at night in the streets, lanes, fields, yards or other places in the City and who cannot satisfactorily account for his presence there or refuses to do so, shall also be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.”

Sect. 2.—This by-law shall be considered as forming part of by-law No. 333, which it amends, as to the penalty and to all other intents and purposes.
