MESSAGE FROM THE BOROUGH MAYOR

Step by step, in harmony with the Pierrefonds-Roxboro Strategic Plan

Since I began serving the citizens of Pierrefonds-Roxboro, I have said that I would work to ensure that the borough acquire an aquatic and recreational complex. This project has been very important to me from the outset as an elected member of the Pierrefonds-Roxboro borough council, and it is a project that is equally important to a large number of citizens. Indeed, following consultation through a survey of residents, it was clearly demonstrated that this is a priority project for the population of Pierrefonds-Roxboro. Certainly, it is a desire that is frequently expressed when I meet you at various events in the borough.

In March, I announced the adoption of the first step towards the construction of an aquatic and recreational complex in the Pierrefonds-Roxboro territory. This preliminary study will serve to identify current and future needs and to prepare the programming framework and management structure for the future aquatic and recreational complex for the citizens of Pierrefonds-Roxboro. We want to provide the best possible facilities, taking into account the momentum of population growth.

I have thought about this project, talked about it and worked on it, but it doesn't happen alone. It is thanks to teamwork with managers in the borough and with the sports and recreation services of the Ville de Montréal that we are now taking the first steps towards what will be a key venue for all. A multifunctional facility that will greatly contribute to the quality of life of the entire community.

Work on the synthetic soccer field will soon resume at the George Springate Sports Center. Over 2,000 Pierrefonds-Roxboro soccer players will be able to enjoy a modern soccer field by early summer, much to the delight of soccer fans. As well, for the little ones and even for bigger ones, the new water games at Parkinson Park in the Bois-de-Liesse district will be ready. This site, which is also equipped with park furniture, will be a most welcoming place for families. Once again, this project results from a team effort in the borough that will please the families of Pierrefonds-Roxboro.

Now in early spring, our public works teams will have to do a lot to do in cleaning up the streets, as well as parks and green spaces. Similarly, our horticulture department is preparing plans for landscaping the magnificent borough gardens that beautify the streets of Pierrefonds-Roxboro. To add to the beauty of the borough, I am thinking of setting up a community garden to encourage active and family life in the borough, as well as fostering the development of closer ties between neighbours. What do you think about it for your neighborhood?

To strengthen our local economy, I am delighted with a new project to be implemented this summer: the establishment of a public market in d'À-Ma-Baie Park every Friday, from July to September, from 3 p.m. to 8 p.m. This presents a great opportunity to acquire fresh and varied products, to promote local products, and to encourage direct contact with agricultural producers and craftspersons. A gain for residents: a gain for the local economy.

We are continuing to work on several other exciting projects to improve the quality of life of Pierrefonds-Roxboro residents, both in provision of services to citizens and of infrastructure for sports, culture and social development. I would particularly like to draw your attention to our new "Hello Neighbour" service. To increase the safety of seniors living alone, each day a patroller will phone the person living alone, to ensure that everything is going well and that no problem requires immediate intervention. I would like to thank citizens who actively participate in the Pierrefonds-Roxboro borough. It is together with you that we will succeed in making it great to live here.

MAJOR PROJECTS

FIRST STEP TOWARDS THE CONSTRUCTION OF AN AQUATIC AND RECREATIONAL COMPLEX

In March, the borough council granted a mandate to BC2 groupe conseil inc. for the realisation of a pre-architectural design study to identify the citizens needs and define the orientation regarding the services that will be offered of the future complex.

This study includes a telephone survey of residents of Pierrefonds-Roxboro and L'Île-Bizard-Sainte-Geneviève as well as meetings with borough partner organizations in order to find out the specific needs of citizens.

WORKS AT THE PIERREFONDS LIBRARY

A third point of service at the Pierrefonds Cultural Centre

The expansion and renovation of the Pierrefonds library began at the end of April. During the course of the work, residents may choose to borrow and return documents at one of the following three points of service: the Roxboro Library, the Eastern Community Center, and the Pierrefonds Cultural Centre which is open since the end of April.

PUBLIC CONSULTATIONS ON THE FUTURE OF PIERREFONDS WEST

From March 26 to May 2, the Office de consultation publique de Montréal (OCPM) conducted an extensive consultation process in order to highlight the priorities and expectations of citizens

Information sessions were held to familiarize residents with the overall project, which reconciles the conservation of natural environments with real estate development. They were also invited to validate and enhance the proposed vision by submitting a brief. These submissions will serve as a basis for the OCPM to prepare their report, which is the final step in the consultation process.




THE OCPM: LISTENING TO CITIZENS

BY-LAWS



YOU ARE PLANNING TO UNDERTAKE RENOVATION OR CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS?

Submit your request as soon as possible given that the delay required to analyze requests and issue permits or certificates varies depending of the type of project and the number of requests we receive.

For what type of work do I need a permit?

- · Construction of a building
- Transformation of a building, as defined in the Quebec Construction Code
- Alteration, replacement or addition of a building construction element which is subject to a zoning by-law, an architectural implementation and integration plan, or any other municipal regulation
- Relocation of a building
- · Installation of a mobile home
- Compliance work on a building

A certificate of authorization is also required for some types of work. For more information concerning cases when this is necessary, consult the borough website or dial 311.



YOU WANT TO HOLD A GARAGE SALE?

It is obligatory to obtain a permit, valid for two consecutive days in the Pierrefonds sector only. A permit is not required in the Roxboro sector. Sales take place only between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Two permits can be issued per calendar year for the same address. Only objects that have been used or were acquired to be used for domestic purposes by the occupants of the home or building can be sold.

Permit holders must respect traffic by-laws, particularly those relating to street parking, and also follow the borough instructions on posting garage sale signs.

A NEW POOL?

Before you buy or install an in-ground, above ground or inflatable pool, you must obtain a certificate of authorization. We also recommend that you contact the borough in order to know the by-laws concerning security and development of the site.

Since the security of children is a priority for the borough, inspections will be conducted throughout the summer, in order to make sure that pools are safe and implementation requirements are met.



YOU WANT TO MODIFY YOUR DRIVEWAY?

A certificate of authorization issued by the borough Construction and Building Inspection Department is required to modify or reconstruct your driveway. You have questions? Call 311.

YOU WANT TO HAVE GRAFFITI REMOVED?

A free seasonal graffiti removal service is offered by the borough to owners of commercial and residential buildings if the graffiti is visible from the street.

DO I NEED A PERMIT TO TEAR OFF A HEDGE?

No permit is required to trim, tear off or replace a hedge.

BY-LAWS

USE OF WATER



When is watering allowed?

Watering is allowed for even-numbered addresses on even-numbered dates and odd-numbered addresses on odd-numbered dates, as follows:

- hand-watering is allowed at any time
- between 8 p.m. and 11 p.m. with a portable lawn sprinkler or a soaker hose
- between 3 a.m. and 6 a.m. with an automatic sprinkler system, equipped with a humidity sensor, during the night

You are using a hose or equipment connected to the water supply system? You have to follow these rules:

- it is prohibited to fill a pool between 6 a.m. and 8 p.m. However, between April 1 and May 15, you are allowed at any time
- washing paved surfaces (e.g.: asphalt), patios and outside walls is prohibited, except during construction and landscaping work or as a sanitation measure. However, between April 1st and May 15, you are permitted to do so at any time.
- it is prohibited to let water trickle onto the road or onto neighbors' properties
- all decorative ponds with waterfalls, water fountains or water jets must have a water recycling system
- air cooling and refrigeration units operating on water and with no water recycling system are prohibited. Existing units may be used until 2018.

NEW PROCEDURE IN CASE OF SEWER BACKUP

Each owner is responsible for the maintenance of the entire length of the sewer connection from the inside of the building to the point of connection to the main public sewer (sanitary and pluvial).

In the case of a blockage

The owner must call upon a plumbing contractor of his or her choice who will evaluate the situation. As a result of the evaluation:

If the blockage is on the private domain:

The owner must carry out the necessary work to unblock the connection and bear the costs.

REMINDER: It is necessary to obtain a permit for work on the private domain. If an excavation is required, a permit is also required.

If the blockage is on the public domain:

The owner can make a request for corrective work of the part of a sewer connection that is in the public domain, when certain conditions are met (see Regulation 15-085, Chapter 2).

The request for corrective work must include:

- Corrective application form (in French) duly completed by the owner or contractor. (See By-law 15-085, Schedule A)
- The completed Inspection Report (in French) showing the failure and its location. (See By-law 15-085, Schedule B)
- A video in digital format (on a USB key) allowing for the observation
 of the failure and its location.

*Good to know...

Following a blockage located on the public domain, the owner can file a claim with the Bureau des réclamations of Ville de Montréal to obtain reimbursement of the sums paid to his private contractor.

The Public Works department does not intervene in the case of sewer backup.

IMPORTANT:

No employee intervenes in case of sewer backup.

NUISANCE AND ORDER

To maintain order and ensure the peace of residents, it is forbidden to use bells, whistles, chimes or other noise producing items or machines (such as radios, sound-systems, televisions or musical instruments) outdoors between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m.

COLLECTIONS

TIPS & ADVICE FOR THE SUMMER

With the summer season and the hot weather, the management of organic waste can be a challenge. Here are some tips and tricks to make it easier!

Indoor

- Avoid disposing of liquids in your countertop bin.
- Wrap food with newspaper or place them in a paper to repel insects.
- Freeze or refrigerate food waste such as meat and fish and place them in the brown bin on collection day.
- Place newspaper at the bottom of the countertop and brown bins to absorb excess liquid.
- Sprinkle a little baking soda or place a charcoal briquette in each bin to limit odours.
- Clean your bins regularly with a solution of vinegar and water.
- Sprinkle salt in your bin to kill white worms.

Outdoors

- Place the brown bin in front of your home for weekly collection, even if it is not full.
- At all times, avoid leaving it in the sun.
- To discourage squirrels, apply a cough syrup around the lid of your bin (over-the-counter in pharmacies and supermarkets).

BRANCH COLLECTION

The branch collection takes place between April and October. Consult the interactive map on the borough's website (ville.montreal.qc.ca/pierrefonds-roxboro) to obtain the schedule for your neighborhood.

Branches must be placed ends toward the street and leaves toward the property.

END OF THE HOME COMPOSTING PROGRAM

Since the collection of organic waste is now available throughout the borough of Pierrefonds-Roxboro, the home composting program has ended.

Since 2005, the borough has distributed over 1,500 compost bins through this program, which has diverted tons of organic waste from landfills.

From now on, the purchase of compost bins at a reduced price will be possible at any time at the Pierrefonds-Roxboro Éco-Quartier located at 13, rue du Center-Commercial in Roxboro.

LEARN ABOUT THE BENEFITS OF GRASSCYCLING!

Grasscycling is the process of cutting the grass and leaving the grass clippings on the lawn. As it decomposes, the cut grass acts as a protective layer on the lawn and enriches it with many nutritious elements. It's a real natural fertilizer!

The result

The lawn is healthier, more resistant to disease and requires less watering, since the composition of grass clippings is 80% water.

Trees on the public domain

It is forbidden to stick, nail or staple anything on a tree on the public domain, under penalty of fines.






