MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR OF MONTRÉAL

Welcome to the train of the 21st century

A few months ago, the Caisse de dépôt et placement du Québec (CDPQ) presented its project for an electric train spanning the Greater Montréal region: the Réseau électrique métropolitain (REM).

The REM is certainly the largest public transit project since the inauguration of the Montréal métro some 50 years ago. It calls for the construction of an automated, fully electric train operating on a high-frequency schedule over a network spanning 67 kilometres of double lanes and including 24 stations.

This train will connect downtown Montréal to the South Shore, the North Shore, the Trudeau airport and the West Island. From the time it opens, the REM will have a capacity of 150,000 passengers per day, an increase of 65,000 trips compared to current statistics.

This project meets all our expectations in regards to the economy and the environment, but also in terms of providing effective mobility for our citizens.

The project will also exert a considerable impact on our sustainable development, by taking thousands of vehicles off the roads and thus helping meet our objectives for reducing greenhouse gases.

For the citizens of Pierrefonds-Roxboro, the REM project will address concerns raised by the current saturation on the Deux-Montagnes train line, which will see its capacity increase by 25% with the opening of the new network.

Within a mere four years, if all goes well, there will be no more excuses not to climb aboard the train. Montréal will boast one of the world's largest and most beautiful electric train networks.

Montréal's citizens have been waiting 50 years for such a project. It's high time our city was ushered into the 21st century.

MESSAGE FROM THE BOROUGH MAYOR

For progress in our Borough

First off, I wish to again express my thanks to the citizens of Pierrefonds-Roxboro for your patience during the construction work on the streets and sidewalks, sports facilities and parks of our borough. More than \$23.6 million will have been invested this year, including \$19 million by the Ville de Montréal, to offer you a better quality of life and improve services to residents.

Pursuing our mission to further progress in our borough, I invite you to consult the review of the Pierrefonds-Roxboro Strategic Plan for 2015-2018 on the borough website. Among the priority projects, some are already very advanced, such as by-laws on waste management, the development concept for the Saint-Jean sector and expansion of the network of multifunctional and bike paths, while some are even completed concerning development of our tree management plan which aims to highlight the collective wealth of trees.

I am delighted with the implementation of the first phase of the organic waste collection in the East and West sectors of the borough for units with fewer than nine dwellings. I especially thank the residents who enthusiastically welcomed this new service. In regard to the construction of an intergenerational sports complex, the project is still on the drawing board.

For soccer spirit in Pierrefonds-Roxboro

In Pierrefonds-Roxboro, we have more than 2,000 young people who have the soccer spirit. Our youth and soccer associations will have the pleasure of playing their favorite sport on a new synthetic soccer field next summer. This new sports facility will be built on the grounds of PCHS high school, thanks to the partnership we have negotiated with the Lester B. Pearson School Board.

The new playing surface will extend the soccer season by at least two months; games can start earlier in the spring and end later in the fall, since the maintenance of a synthetic field is not subject to the weather. In addition, associations can take advantage of a greater number of hours of play per week.

This is an investment of nearly \$2.5 million that will meet high standards and allow hosting of major events. Work will begin in the fall to be completed before the beginning of summer 2017.

Cycle path network: it's on a roll!

Indeed, it's rolling along smoothly! As of this fall, we will have tripled the extent of our network of cycle paths. 25 kilometers of new bike lanes will be added to the current 12 kilometers. Our experts have identified streets in each sector of the borough where we can develop bike paths, while choosing optimum solutions to connect with the current network and also to review or upgrade existing locations. I invite you to visit our website to consult the borough plans for the new cycle path network.

I wish you a very pleasant autumn and hope to see you on a bike ride on our new cycle paths, as well as in our parks for family activities, and especially at the inauguration of our new synthetic soccer field.

In addressing the angle of history, nature and community spirit of the borough, a webdocumentary featuring 4 video clips will be produced and published online. Artistic creative workshops will allow Pierrefonds-Roxboro youth to create artworks that will serve as starting points to comment the clips.

INTER(SECTIONS) -**375 COLLECTIVE STORIES** by Pierrefonds Community Project

The project will develop a multifunctional space as a facility-type structure «Maze» (labyrinth) with 375 posts to be decorated by citizens of all ages. The project will provide the community endless possibilities for the use of space for social and cultural purposes reinforcing the sense of belonging of its population. For example, this temporary and mobile unit will be used as an open-air art gallery.

PIERREFONDS-ROXBORO FOR THE VOICES OF MONTREAL'S 375[™]

To these three community projects, the borough of Pierrefonds-Roxboro will add its own creation. The borough will realize a project of interpretation via an interactive structure. Citizens of different cultural communities will be invited to share, in the form of video capture, their vision of the borough and express what their cultural identity and background enables them to bring to the community. Touch screens and audio equipment will enable the transmission and dissemination of citizens' testimony.



MAYOR'S REPORT ON THE FINANCIAL SITUATION OF THE BOROUGH OF PIERREFONDS-ROXBORO

Presented September 12, 2016

It is with pride that I table the annual report on the financial situation of the borough for the year 2015, the outlook for the current year and the general orientation for the 2017 budget, in compliance with section 144.7 of the Charter of the Ville de Montréal. I also attach the following documents:

- List of all contracts involving an expenditure of more than \$25,000
- List of all contracts involving an expenditure of over \$2,000 totalling over \$25,000 for the same supplier
- Table of the remuneration and expense allowances for the Borough Mayor and Councillors. These are in compliance with applicable laws and by-laws

Financial situation as of December 31, 2015

The 2015 budget forecast planned expenditures of \$35,028,500. As of December 31, 2015, actual expenditures amounted to \$35,623,932. Compared to the amended budget of \$36,220,400, this represents a saving of \$596,468. Actual revenues totaled \$1,461,460 compared to budget estimates of \$1,328,300, resulting in a favourable variance of \$133,160, largely due to various rentals and miscellaneous income (disposal of assets) during the fiscal year. Non-recurring corporate financial adjustments totalling \$155,500 also improve this aspect, bringing the results of the financial surplus to \$885,128. This performance allowed the borough to show an unreserved accumulated surplus of \$9,266,614.59 as of December 31, 2015.

Three-year Capital Expenditure Program 2015-2017

A total of \$ 5,873,766 was invested as part of the three-year program of capital expenditures 2015-2017. This amount was allocated to:

- works for road rehabilitation and paving of various streets
- maintenance of municipal buildings and equipment to bring them up to standard
- implementation of various development works in the parks
- renewal of the vehicle fleet

Additional works in the order of \$10,706,964 funded entirely by the Ville de Montréal, were undertaken on borough territory to improve water, sewer and drainage networks as well as for road reconstruction. In addition, new municipal infrastructures totalling \$110,908 were installed as part of new residential projects in the borough. These infrastructures were entirely financed by developers.

Preliminary financial indicators for 2016

The budget allocation for 2016 is \$33,201,800. The borough expects to meet its commitments in terms of expenditure and revenues and to finish the year 2016 with a slight surplus.

General orientation for the 2017 budget

The 2017 budget will be presented at a public meeting to be held on October 3, 2016. In order to meet the expectations of Pierrefonds-Roxboro residents, the budget will be based on the following three main orientations:

- Improving the client experience
- Continued implementation of the Pierrefonds-Roxboro 2015-2018 Strategic Plan
- Efficient management of resources

NOTES Recyclables

Dates in this table apply to residential sectors and schools. There is no collection of recyclables in businesses and industries.

Garbage

For buildings of 9 units or more, schools and businesses, the collection is carried out twice a week, on Monday and Thursday.

Organic Waste

The collection takes place in the sectors where the first phase has been implemented last spring.

GREEN WASTE COLLECTION



The green waste and dead leaf collection will take place every Wednesday until November 23 in the sectors located East of Yuile Park and West of boulevard des Sources. where the organic waste collection has not vet been implemented.

Residents of the sectors where the organic waste collection is in place must place their green waste in the brown bin designated for this collection on the collection day in their sector. Green waste surplus and dead leaves may be deposited outside the brown bin providing they are placed in a proper container.

Accepted Containers

The only containers accepted are paper bags, unwaxed cardboard (kraft) boxes and other rigid reusable containers. Plastic bags are not allowed for the green waste collection neither for the organic waste collection, either inside or outside the brown bin.

Accepted waste

Horticultural waste, leaves, grass and remnants from domestic gardening.

Evergreen Small Branches

Small branches of evergreens (cedar, fir, pine, spruce, etc.), no more than 1 meter long and 5 centimetres in diameter, tied in bundles are accepted in the green waste collection on the dates indicated in the calendar. Outside of this period, these branches will be allowed in the garbage collection.

Refused waste

Food leftovers (allowed only in the brown bin), earth, stones, litter and feces, as well as evergreen branches longer than 1 meter or whose diameter exceeds 5 cm or branches of deciduous trees (maple, ash, oak, poplar, etc.). For more information, please see page 22.

Hours

Containers must be placed at the curb, after 8 p.m. the night before and no later than 7 a.m. the day of pick-up.

COLLECTIONS

BRANCHES COLLECTION AS PART OF THE EMERALD ASH BORER CONTROL PLAN

It is forbidden to dispose of deciduous tree branches (such as maple, ash, oak, poplar, etc.) and evergreen tree branches longer than 1 meter and more than 5 cm of diameter in the green waste, organic waste or garbage containers. These branches must be disposed of separately.

Garden maintenance done by the citizen

The borough offers a free collection service of branches resulting from regular garden maintenance done by the citizen. In this case, branches must be placed ends toward the street and leaves toward the property.

No need to call 311

Borough teams will drive through the whole territory to carry out a systematic collection.

Delay

Depending on weather conditions, a period of six weeks is to be expected once the branches are placed along the street.

Deadline

This free service is offered until Friday, October 28 inclusively.

ATTENTION TREE FELLING AND MAINTENANCE PERFORMED BY A CONTRACTOR

The contractor is responsible for the management of branches and trunks of trees he fells or maintains.

CONSTRUCTION AND RENOVATION SCRAP MATERIALS

If you wish to dispose of such materials (restricted to wood, plaster, rubble, stone, concrete, asphalt shingles and metal):

- Call the Citizen's Office at 311;
- A borough representative will visit you and provide a cost estimate for the pick-up;
- Pay the amount of the estimate at the Borough Hall.

There is a \$30 service charge and a fee of \$53 per square metre for all types of materials.

Refuse must be placed on the pavement in front of your property on a surface that does not exceed one metre deep or block a catch basin. The deadline for pick-ups of scrap materials is the last Friday in October. This service is not available during the winter months.

LICHEN ON TREES... IS IT DANGEROUS?

Many people mistakenly believe the lichen that grows on tree trunks is a form of mold indicating the presence of disease. In fact, the lichen is a composition of algae and fungus that uses trees as a growing medium. The lichen is not a parasite. It does not affect the tree health in any way. In fact, this is a good indicator of the air quality since lichens do not tolerate the presence of pollution. Therefore it is useless to try to eliminate them.





As part of the efforts to increase the index of the Montréal canopy (ratio between the land area covered by tree crowns and the total land area) and replacement efforts of ash trees killed by the emerald ash borer, the Ville de Montréal has launched an extensive tree planting program on public property.

The planting of thousands of trees is planned over the span of 10 years on Montréal streets and parks. This program includes, wherever possible, the planting of a tree on the public right of way in front of private residential homes that do not have any. Maintenance of trees planted will be provided by the Ville de Montréal.

It is difficult to foresee when the borough will plant a tree in front of your home. However, if planting a tree on the public right of way is of interest to you, we encourage you to share your interest with the borough by calling 311. For the sake of improving biodiversity, the choice of tree species will be at the borough's discretion.

IT IS THE RIGHT TIME TO TRIM OR FELL DOWN AN ASH TREE

Although an ash tree can be felled at any time, the ideal period is between September 15 and April 15. If an ash tree is felled between April 15 and September 15, the wood must be transformed on-site or stored for disposal after September 15. Moving the wood is formally prohibited under the by-law between April 15 and September 15. Residents are required to transform the wood or dispose of it on one of the city's site after September 15. Ash wood cannot be stored and used for heating.

Felling an ash tree during the period when adult ash borers are active (April 15 to September 15) is subject to the same requirements as disposal of ash debris. As well, fresh cuts on ash trees during this period may attract females seeking weakened ashes to lay their eggs. Pruning ash trees is best done between September 15 and April 15. END OF ELECTRONIC WASTE COLLECTION AT THE ÉCO-QUARTIER AS OF JANUARY 2017

The Éco-quartier Pierrefonds-Roxboro will stop accepting electronic devices such as televisions, computers, radios, toasters, vacuum cleaners, drills, cameras and cell phones in January 2017. The citizens of Pierrefonds-Roxboro now have a new Ecocentre nearby, located in Saint-Laurent, which will accept all of these objects, and more. However, the Éco-quartier will continue to accept light bulbs, batteries and ink cartridges. **Renaissance Donation Centres in Pierrefonds** (14891, boulevard de Pierrefonds, 514 696-4961) and **des sources** (4917, boulevard des Sources, 514 684-7691) will continue to accept these electronics as well as microwaves, furniture and used clothing.

Located at **3535, rue Sartelon**, the **Ecocentre Saint-Laurent** started operating in June. It is better equipped than the Eco-quartier for the collection of electronics, household hazardous waste and other reusable materials.

The Ecocentre Saint-Laurent also accepts other materials such as refrigeration appliances, large appliances, recyclables, metal, tires, electronics, construction waste, hazardous household waste and green waste.

DOGS AND CATS : FOR YOUR ANIMAL'S WELL-BEING, GET A PERMIT

A LOST ANIMAL MAY BE FOUND QUICKLY THANKS TO THE PERMIT RECORDS KEPT BY THE CITY

Obtaining a permit is mandatory. The by-law in force states that no one can keep a dog or a cat without obtaining the permit required. This permit must be obtained within 15 days after acquiring the dog or cat or the day when the dog or cat reaches the age of 3 months, the longest period applies.

NUMBER OF CATS AND DOGS

The maximum number of animals allowed in a dwelling is four while limiting the number of kept dogs to a maximum of two.

However, it is possible to keep a maximum of three dogs by obtaining a special permit delivered by the borough.

These restrictions do not apply when an animal gives birth. In this case, the puppies and kittens can be kept for three months.

PERMIT DURATION

The permit is issued on an annual basis. It is valid from January 1 to December 31 of each year and must be renewed before its expiration date.

PROCEDURE FOR OBTAINING DIFFERENT TYPES OF PERMIT

BY-LA

REGULAR ANNUAL PERMIT

Citizens wishing to renew a regular permit or apply for a new one must complete the form below and mail it to the Borough Hall along with the certificate of sterilization. Permits can also be obtained or renewed in person at the Borough Hall (see page 2 for address and business hours).

SPECIAL PERMIT AUTHORIZING TO KEEP THREE DOGS

It is possible to apply for a special permit to keep three dogs in a dwelling provided:

- 1. the dogs are sterilized and vaccinated against rabies;
- 2. the keeper does not reside in a building of three dwelling units and more;
- 3. the permit application must not be related to a dangerous dog or presented by a dog keeper who has been convicted of a nuisance according to the by-law on animal control.

Since October 3, 2016, a new by-law on animal control has come into force in all Montréal boroughs. This by-law now regulates animals everywhere in Montréal.

BY-LAWS

WINTER SHELTERS

- It is permitted to install one winter garage, one winter doorway shelter and one winter tunnel on a single property between November 1 and April 15;
- Shelters have to be installed at least 2 m from the edge of the street or the roadway and at least 1 m from the sidewalk as the case may be;
- The structure of these shelters will have to be covered in a tone of white fibrous synthetic canvas, waterproof and fireproof;
- ✓ The maximum height of a winter shelter is 3 m.

PERMITS AND CERTIFICATES OF AUTHORIZATION

A permit or a certificate of authorization is not always required to carry out some maintenance work.

To maintain order and ensure citizens' peace, it is forbidden to use bells, whistles, chimes or other noise producing items or machines (such as radios, sound-systems, televisions or musical instruments) outdoors between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m.

PARKING RESERVED FOR HANDICAPPED PERSONS

According to the Road Safety Code, it is prohibited to park a vehicle in a parking space reserved for handicapped persons unless such vehicle displays a sticker or plaque issued for a handicapped person.

PARKING RESERVED FOR FIRE VEHICLES

The Canadian Fire Prevention Code prohibits parking of a vehicle in such a way as to block access to fire department vehicles in places where a sign indicates the No Parking zone.

SNOW CLEARANCE



RESIDENT AND THE BOROUGH... WORKING TOGETHER IS A MUST

Operation Snow Clearance: let's adopt good habits.

- Show consideration for pedestrians and do not put any snow on the sidewalk.
- Obey the parking regulations and move your vehicle in time.
- Place your garbage cans, bags or containers in your driveway and never on the sidewalk or a snow bank.
- Shovel snow on your residential or commercial land and not in the street.
- Park 30 cm from the sidewalk and place your snow clearance markers 60 cm from the sidewalk or the edge, on your own ground.
- Make sure you remove all objects from your driveway logs, paving stones, concrete blocks, etc. - that might be pushed into the street and cause a snowblower breakdown.

The Borough's snow clearance operations

- Less than 5 cm: ice melter and abrasives are spread.
- More than 5 cm: roads and sidewalks are cleared during the snowfall.
- Subsequently: after snow clearance, a snow loading operation gets underway, decreed by Ville de Montréal, and may take 2 to 6 days to complete, depending on the amount of the snowfall.

PRIORITIES

A level of service must be reached depending to the priority of streets (three levels). These levels are determined according to a combination of the following characteristics:

PRIORITY 1

Major streets, major commercial streets, bus routes, reserved lanes, hospital entrances, narrow streets, etc. (i.e. de Pierrefonds, Saint-Jean, des Sources).

PRIORITY 2

Collector streets, local commercial streets, regular bus routes, etc. (i.e. Pavillon, Sainte-Anne, Perron).

PRIORITY 3

Local streets, industrial sectors, etc. (i.e. Baldwin, Hélène, Dauville).
