New park facilities for Saint-Laurent families

This summer, the Borough completed major repair works in its parks in order to make Saint-Laurent a choice destination for families. Five new facilities were inaugurated at the Painter, L'Archevêque, Alexis-Nihon, Goulet and Philippe-Laheurte parks.

PARC PAINTER

It was under sunny skies on June 27 that the new facilities in Parc Painter were officially opened. The Mayor of Saint-Laurent, Alan DeSousa, thanked citizens for their patience during the completion of the work. He added: "A total of \$4.6 million was invested in Parc Painter in order to present a recreational offer that is both sufficient and adapted to the

specific needs of the area. This renovation initiative for the park means that users now have access to updated and safe equipment"

Completely renovated and expanded, the chalet in Parc Painter now comprises a multipurpose room that can be used for activities throughout the year, more spacious and better adapted changing rooms, washrooms for persons with reduced mobility as well as a green roof, which is the first of its kind in Saint-Laurent and a valuable tool in the battle against heat islands. Major renovations were also made to the swimming pool, the children's playground, and the petanque area. Last but not least, a huge wadding pool with a sloping entrance was also built to complement the water play area for the enjoyment of local toddlers.

Dear fellow citizens of Saint-Laurent,

We are presenting you with an issue that contains a few more pages than usual. Saint-Laurent Council adopted three new bylaws in recent weeks, and we therefore felt that it was important to convey the relevant information using the communication tools at our disposal.

I encourage you to read the texts pertaining to satellite antennas, rental basement dwellings, and protecting buildings against sewer back-ups and flooding. These relate to concerns that have been shared by the community and Saint-Laurent administration for some time now. We took the time to carefully analyze the best measures to put in place, and the bylaws were part of these. It is possible that their application will require that certain adjustments be made, however over the long term they will help to preserve the quality of the Saint-Laurent environment.

Other topics featured include the **inauguration of several new park facilities.** For many years now, we have been upgrading all of our parks in order to support our significant demographic growth and achieve the objectives set out in our Family Policy. Visiting the parks in recent months provided us with sufficient proof that these facilities have brought happiness to families throughout Saint-Laurent. The parks in our borough were brought to life throughout the summer by the laughter of children who enjoyed the new water play facilities and playgrounds.

It is also with children in mind that we developed a **new road safety campaign** that will be launched around schools in the near future. We cannot be reminded too often the importance of being especially vigilant when it comes to children on the road, especially during the hustle and bustle of the back-to-school season. This clear and well-articulated campaign has already drawn attention from a neighbouring borough which has asked our permission to also use its on its territory.

Our children are everywhere. Let's be careful!

In collaboration with the Commission scolaire Marguerite-Bourgeoys, the English-Montréal School Board and the Service de police de la Ville de Montréal (SPVM), the Borough of Saint-Laurent intends to launch an extensive back-to-school awareness campaign. Its aim will be to remind the public of the importance of driving safely at all times, and particularly near schools.

Accordingly, posters will be strategically erected near the 19 participating schools and across Saint-Laurent territory. Flyers will also be handed out to all parents of students attending Saint-Laurent schools. Finally, a squad comprising members of the SPVM and the Saint-Laurent Urban Safety Patrol will intervene directly in the field to maximize the campaign's results.

Highlights of the General Council Meetings held in July and August

luly

Contract business

Council took the following actions:

- Authorized the launch of a public call for tenders for energy savings projects at the Arena Raymond-Bourque.
- Awarded a contract, valued at a maximum of \$24,717,377.17 to Pomerleau inc. for construction work at the Bibliothèque du Boisé.
- Approved the agreement with the Conseil régional de l'environnement de Montréal (CRE) for the project to fight heat islands in the industrial park, and authorized a financial contribution of \$18,700.

Subsidies and financial assistance

Council awarded the following subsidies and financial assistance:

- \$4,221 to the Comité des organismes sociaux de Saint-Laurent (COSSL) for the Entraide laurentienne en sécurité alimentaire project in 2011
- \$378.60 to Parents-Secours du Québec for the participation of one representative in the organization's 34th provincial conference held in Nicolet on June 4 and 5, 2011
- \$5,000 to the Centre d'encadrement pour jeunes femmes immigrantes (CEJFI) for its regular activities in 2011
- \$600 to the Beth Ora Congregation for its annual golf tournament
- \$400 to the Levant organization for its Les Mille et une nuits exhibition from June 29 to September 2, 2011

Bylaws

Council approved several major construction projects, including two residential development projects comprising local businesses and services that will foster urban densification from a sustainable development perspective. Located on a section of the block formed by Rue Grenet, Chemin Laval and Marcel-Laurin and Henri-Bourassa boulevards, the first project will comprise approximately 340 housing units and will allow for the intensification and diversification of activities near the terminal and future Bois-Franc metro station. The second project will be built on Alexis-Nihon and Thimens boulevards and on Rue Lucien-Thimens. Striving to repurpose an outdated and underexploited urban area in the district that will house the new library and sports complex, the development project will contain approximately 154 housing units. These projects represent the first step in the development of larger neighbourhoods surrounding the Bois-Franc station and the Thimens/Lucien-Thimens District.

Satellite antennas

Council adopted a new clause in its bylaws pertaining to the installation of satellite antennas measuring less than I metre in diameter. Also targeting existing antennas, this clause outlined specific installation standards that relate to all housing categories (see Page 8).

Protecting buildings against sewer back-ups and flooding

Council also adopted an order under the terms of the Bylaw on the protection of buildings against sewer back-ups and flooding adopted by Ville de Montréal in May. Drafted by the Service de l'eau, this bylaw covers the entire territory comprising the 16 boroughs, including Saint-Laurent which, to date have all adhered to the new stipulations (see Page 7).



aint-Laurent is proud to provide financial assistance for C-Vert, an innovative project that is being carried out by the Claudine and Stephen Bronfman Family Foundation and supported by several partners. The project offers youths from populated areas, including Saint-Laurent, with the

SCREENING FOR THE EMERALD ASH BORER

Saint-Laurent would like to inform the public that it has implemented preventive measures against the emerald ash borer, with the aim of limiting the impact of a potential infestation in the borough. Insect traps were installed on June 4 in areas that were selected for their vulnerability. The Borough will identify the insects that are trapped and forward the results to the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA), which is the

Canadian organization responsible for protecting plant resources against predators and disease.

Of Asian origin, and with no natural predators in Canada, this destructive insects causes the

decline of all ash varieties.

It does not pose any threat to human or animal health. or to other tree varieties.

Citizens can also help with the detection, even though this is difficult and requires expertise in the fields, by reporting any ash that is in an advanced state of decline in their neighbourhood by calling 311.

PROTECTING BUILDINGS AGAINST sewer back-ups and flooding

In July 2011, Saint-Laurent adopted an order under the terms of the Bylaw on the protection of buildings against sewer back-ups and flooding adopted by Ville de Montréal in May. The properties that are targeted by this bylaw are:


- Buildings where flooding or sewer back-ups have occurred
- Properties where renovation work is being carried out in the basement
- New constructions


Its purpose is specifically to outline the installation of backwater valves to prevent

back-ups and a pit containing a sump pump that drains to the outdoors to prevent flooding.

The installation of these protective devices is a simple, reliable, and effective way to reduce the risks of sewer back-ups and flooding. The protective means that are identified in the bylaw must now be considered to be standard requirement, in the same manner as other security equipment inside buildings.

The backwater valve

The backwater valve can be installed on the drainage water pipes on all plumbing groups of assemblies in the basement of a building, such as toilets, sinks, showers, washing machines, floor drains, etc. The principle of the backwater valve is simple: it allows water running in only one direction, namely to the public sewers. It, therefore, eliminates the risks of sewer back-ups and flooding inside the home. There are various types of backwater valves; each one is recommended for a specific use.

RENTAL BASEMENT DWELLINGS

With a view to offering secure housing and in response to demand for rental housing units on its territory, Saint-Laurent now authorizes basement housing units to be offered for rent however only in two-family and multi-family buildings (3 to 4 housing units).



In spring 2011, the zoning bylaw was amended to authorize this type of housing unit under certain conditions. They must comply with specific criteria to ensure not only the health and safety of tenants, but also, the cleanliness of the premises.

The quality of life and well-being of its citizens being at the heart of its priorities, Saint-Laurent administration intends for this new bylaw to prevent housing units that have the potential to be dangerous, to better inform tenants and owners, and ensure that new basement housing units are compliant and safe.

Owners have three options with respect to complying with the new bylaw:

- They must obtain a certificate for usage authorization if no renovations are necessary to bring the housing unit up to standard.
- They must complete the necessary work in the housing unit to ensure that it is compliant and only continue to rent it under this condition.

■ They must no longer rent the housing unit if they do not intend to complete the work.

An inspector from the Permits and Inspections division will follow up on the matter.

It is important to mention that this bylaw only applies to basement rental housing units. Nonetheless, if the unit is occupied by tenants and some articles of the bylaw are not being respected, the building owner may face one or more fines, plus applicable expenses.

Existing rental basement dwellings are now prohibited in single-family homes. Consequently, new basement units may not be created in this type of building with a view to being rented.

Regulation

SATELLITE ANTENNAS IN SAINT-LAURENT Residential use

To be on the same wavelength...

With the rapid growth in the transmission of satellite television services over the past decade, satellite antennas have quickly spread throughout the borough of Saint-Laurent. Despite their usefulness, these antennas constitute visual pollution that hampers quality of the Saint-Laurent environment.

Accordingly, in July 2011, Saint-Laurent administration adopted a new bylaw provision pertaining to the installation of satellite antennas with a diameter of less than one meter on residential buildings. Also targeting **existing antennas**, this includes specific installation standards.

Number of antennas

Maximum of **one antenna** per housing unit or main building.




Buildings with 4 units or less

A single satellite antenna is permitted per unit. These must be installed in accordance with the following parameters:

- On a wall other than a wall facing the street.
- On a lateral wall, installed on the back half of this wall.
- On a gabled roof, on condition that it is located on a rear gable and no section surpasses the highest point of the roof by more than one metre.




• On a **flat roof**, on condition that it is located at least two metres from the outside walls, and no further forward than the halfway point of the side walls. For buildings located at an intersection, this rule applies to all façades. Furthermore, the height of the antenna on its stand may not exceed one metre.



Authorized height

Maximum of one metre from the highest point of the roof (excluding the chimney).



Buildings with 5 or more units

• For existing buildings:

One satellite antenna is permitted per unit. Antennas must be placed on the roof so as to not be visible from the street, or placed inside the perimeter of a balcony without exceeding the height of the top of the balcony railing.

For new buildings:

One satellite antenna is permitted for each **main building.** It must be installed on the roof so as to not be visible from the street.

Examples of permitted locations



Examples of locations NOT permitted

- On the front façade of a building
- On a side wall overlooking a street (for example, in the case of a building located at an intersection)
- On a support other than the antenna base
- On a fence
- On a railing
- On the ground



Antenna may only be installed at the discretion of the building owner.

Furthermore, installation is conditional to the owner first obtaining a certificate of authorization from the Permits and Inspections division. Fees apply.



Yellow Pages Directory

In order to reduce the use of paper, for several years now, the Yellow Pages Group has invited residents who no longer wish to receive the directory to register their names for its Distribution Opt-out Program. Requests that are made in the fall will be honoured for the distribution of the 2012 issue. The group's different environmental initiatives and the increased use of the **YellowPages.ca** website has resulted in a 25% decrease in the Group's use of paper over the past two years.

Highlights of the General Council meetings held on July and August

Contract business

Among other things, Council authorized the issue of public calls for tenders for the development of the green space surrounding Lake E, in the Bois-Franc District, to the east of Boulevard Cavendish, and for repairs to a section of Rue Vérité.

It was also recommended the Municipal Council award contracts totalling \$3,157,579.49 to Doncar Construction inc. for repairs to the waterworks and sewer system along sections of Cardinal, Barré and de la Sorbonne streets.

Administration and finance

Council authorized the signing of an agreement with Les Développements Jean Gascon inc. for the development of an ecological design concept for the public spaces in the Challenger residential development located in Nouveau Saint-Laurent. The Borough will also ensure that the work is carried out in compliance with the principles of sustainable development and will strive to improve the concept by integrating ecological development options such as the installation of aluminum lamp posts equipped with electroluminescent diodes (LED).

Subsidies and financial assistance

Among other things, counsel granted the following subsidies and financial assistance:

- \$8,000 to the Centre des femmes de Saint-Laurent for 2011
- \$3,700 to the Centre Soutien Jeunesse de Saint-Laurent for 2011
- \$300 to the Fondation du cégep du Vieux-Montréal for Opération Nez Rouge in 2011
- \$500 to the Beth Ora Congregation as "Lifetime Partner" to benefit the Montréal Children's Hospital Foundation
