Collecting signatures on the petition - City

TO OBTAIN A PUBLIC CONSULTATION FROM THE CITY

In summary

Under the Right of Initiative to public consultations, you have previously filed with the City a draft petition that has been deemed eligible (Step 1).

You are now at **Step 2**, which involves **collecting signatures on the petition**.

Step 2 : Collecting signatures on the petition

**You must obligatorily use the attached form entitled
Form: Step 2 – Collecting signatures on the petition - City**

Only the form provided by the City may be used. No other form or petition or electronic signatures will be accepted.

- Enter the object of the requested public consultation;

You must obligatorily re-enter the same text as on your draft petition (Step 1);

- Once the form has been filled out, print as many copies as you need;
- Make sure that you collect at least 15,000 signatures from people ages 15 years and over living within the territory of the city;

All the people who sign the petition solemnly declare that they meet those criteria.

- Make sure that you collect the signatures within the 90-day time limit;
The 90-day period begins on the day that the City publishes the notice on its Web site announcing the beginning and end dates for the collection of signatures on your petition.
- Once you have collected the required number of signatures, submit your petition to the City clerk's office at 275, rue Notre-Dame Est, bureau R-134;
- **The City clerk's office will give you a receipt acknowledging your submission;**
- Within 21 days of the filing of your petition, the City clerk's office will inform the contact person in your group of its conformity in terms of the number of signatures required and deadline for collecting them;
- If a conforming petition has been filed, a public consultation must be held.
