



## CALL FOR CANDIDATES

From April 18<sup>th</sup> to May 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2016, Ville de Montréal will be accepting candidacies for membership on the Conseil interculturel de Montréal (CiM).

The Conseil interculturel de Montréal is a consultative body composed of fifteen volunteer members. Its main function is to advise and formulate opinions to city council and to the executive committee regarding municipal services and policies to be implemented, in order to encourage the integration as well as the participation of members of different cultural communities in political, economic, social and cultural life.

The members of the Conseil interculturel de Montréal are chosen in such a way that the group in its entirety reflects Montreal's diversity. They are appointed by city council on the recommendation of a selection committee. Members serve a three-year term, which can be renewed once.

#### SELECTION CRITEREA

To become a member of the Conseil interculturel de Montréal, the candidate must:

- 1. Show interest for intercultural relations and have experience in this field;
- 2. Have knowledge of municipal areas of activity as well as urban issues;
- 3. Actively participate in one or more of the following aspects of Montreal life: economic, cultural, scientific, community or educational;
- 4. Be available to participate in council meetings (from eight to ten per year) as well as in meetings with the special committees in charge of examining particular issues;
- 5. Be a resident or own a business in one of the city's 19 boroughs;
- 6. Have a working knowledge of French (the working language of the CiM).
