The Memorial of the undersigned
Proprietors of Real Estate, and others,
Citizens of Montreal.

Respectfully Represents—

That the Streets of Montreal are
admittedly too narrow for the extensive
and increasing population of the City;
and Your Memorialists have observed
with pleasure, the laudable exertions made
by The Council to remedy so serious an
evil, by increasing the width of the
Streets whenever possible.

That Notre Dame Street being
the leading thoroughfare of, and through
the City, much, and hourly inconvenience
is experienced from the Circumstance
of its being too narrow for the
extensive traffic and business carried
on in it, and the ceaseless passing to
and

and fro, in Vehicles and on foot, occurring there. That consequently every possible opportunity should be seized to widen the Street, and no attempt be permitted to diminish its breadth.

That with a view to the immediate and future improvement of that ^{part} of the Street lying between, Bonsecours Street and Dalhousie Square, The proprietors on the West Side thereof, have in Building hitherto retired their houses ~~Set back~~ from the Street; whereby its aspect has been considerably improved, and the public comfort and convenience have been greatly promoted. That the efforts made by these Proprietors for the amelioration of that part of the City, are now however about to be marred, and the regularity of the Street destroyed by the Several Proprietors of the lots forming the Western Corner of Bonsecours and Notre Dame Streets and extending towards Dalhousie Square, / M^r Alexander Delisle, M^{rs} De Montenack. M^r Rodier, and M^r Beaudry / who are immediately about to build thereon, flush with the

the

the Street, and without retiring from the line of it, as those already referred to, have judiciously and liberally done.

Your Memorialists consequently pray that you will adopt such measures as may be necessary to compel the four Proprietors above named to retire the buildings about being erected by them, to the line of the premises.
