Meeting with residents on the future public square

On November 13, from 7:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m., the Borough of Saint-Laurent invited residents, merchants, workers and students to take part in the development of a new public square at the corner of Boulevard Décarie and Boulevard Édouard-Laurin, near Côte-Vertu métro station.

Over 275 people had the chance to share their vision of Saint-Laurent's future public square, whether by answering questions or making their own layouts on a plan of the square.

The purpose of this very different public consultation was to give the future users of the public square an opportunity to directly provide the designers with original ideas. expressed his pride upon the announcement of the winners of the 2015 excellence awards presented by the Ordre des architectes du Québec, which included the Bibliothèque du Boisé, garnering top honours with the Grand Prix d'excellence on November 21.

"This project was an ambitious one, given the fact that we favoured innovation and creativity down to the last detail and we are delighted that the panel of judges has recognized our efforts in this regard," stated Mayor DeSousa. "The high number of users of

comments demonstrate that the Bibliothèque du Boisé is an instant success and an invaluable legacy to the Saint-Laurent community. Such prestigious recognition reflects credit on our organization, on our teams as well as on our community as a whole. This honour is a great source of pride for us all."

The Mayor of Montréal, Denis Coderre, added: "We want to congratulate the Borough of Saint-Laurent for having set such high standards for the project to build the Bibliothèque du Boisé—the first library to have benefited

from Ville de Montréal's library renovation, expansion and construction program. Exemplary in its entirety, this project continues to inspire other boroughs and municipalities. As Montréal is UNESCO's City of Design, we believe that investing in quality architecture and design is building the identity of a city that distinguishes itself. So I applaud Mayor DeSousa and the Borough of Saint-Laurent for having chosen to take the path of innovation and for having aimed at excellence in undertaking this project."

Designed by the consortium comprising Cardinal Hardy, Labonté Marcil, and architect Éric Pelletier, the Bibliothèque du Boisé was described by the members of the panel as being "a highly successful building that creates public space both indoors and outdoors." MEETING WITH RESIDENTS ON

"For Montréal's 375th anniversary, we think it is important to build bridges," stated the Mayor of Saint-Laurent, Alan DeSousa. "In fact, by directly sounding out residents on site—residents that will be affected and that will be using the new facilities, we will make sure these grounds will be more frequently used... This consultation built bridges between the designers and the users, and I believe this day was a real success."

Montréal's 375th anniversary

This public square project comes within the legacy of Montréal's 375th anniversary. Moreover, it is one of the first milestones in the network of urban promenades that the Borough of Saint-Laurent would like to set up on its territory. It will form part of the project of cultural neighbourhoods, which aims to offer quality, local cultural activities and encourage residents' cultural participation in developing and improving their living environment.



A budget totalling \$76.6 million for 2016

At a special meeting held on October 6, Saint-Laurent Borough Council adopted its budget for 2016, totalling \$76.6 million. This includes \$60 million in net budget transfers from Ville de Montréal, revenues estimated at \$4.3 million, in addition to an amount of \$11.5 million generated from \$0.05 in tax room as well as the tax on services. To balance the 2016 budget, \$850,000 will also be appropriated from surpluses.

Budget overview

Insofar as operating expenditures are concerned, \$12.5 million will be allocated to general administration, \$1.8 million to public safety and security, and \$21.7 million to transportation, which includes roadwork and snow clearance operations. An amount of \$1.3 million will be devoted to health and welfare, \$4.9 million to enhancements, urban planning and development, as well as \$28.4 million to leisure activities and culture. And lastly, \$6 million will be committed to public health—down \$3.5 million from 2015 due to the transfer of jurisdiction over waste collections to Montréal City Council, since January 1, 2015.

Highlights

Tax on services

For 2016, the Borough will be levying a tax on services, at a rate of \$0.0699 per \$100 of assessed value. On the one hand, the City is transferring to the Borough tax room representing \$0.05 per \$100 of assessed value. Wanting to limit the increase in taxpayers' tax burden to 2%, the Borough will take only \$0.0486 per \$100 of assessed value, for revenues of \$7,961,200. On the other hand, in order to pursue the priorities identified, while keeping within the 2% ceiling on the tax burden increase, the Borough will be adopting a special tax of \$0.0213 per \$100 of assessed value (compared to \$0.022 per \$100 of assessed value for 2015), which represents tax revenues of \$3,502,600.

Sports complex

The opening of the sports complex is slated for next year. In order to be able to provide the services planned, an operating budget of \$1.5 million has been earmarked for this sports complex. "This new building includes a number of sports facilities that will make it pos-

sible to meet the demands of Saint-Laurent's associations and residents for spaces that are in keeping with today's standards," stated the Mayor of Saint-Laurent, Alan DeSousa. "As it may be recalled, Saint-Laurent's population has grown 29% since 2001. No doubt, this new public building will be highly used by Saint-Laurent residents of all ages!"

Montréal's five-year manpower plan

Saint-Laurent's Administration expects to reduce its manpower budget by \$912,600 in 2016, in accordance with Ville de Montréal's five-year manpower plan.

At the same time as the recent transfer of certain Borough responsibilities back to Montréal City Council, the Borough will be conducting a review of its activities, with the aim of guaranteeing that the quality of services offered to the population will be maintained.

Conclusion

The Mayor made a point of mentioning, as a reminder, that each budgetary exercise is an opportunity to reflect on Saint-Laurent's approach in terms of services to residents.

At the same time, he reiterated his commitment to sustainable development: "We will continue to include the principles of sustainable development in all our decisions, whether in relation to the development of new real estate projects, the revitalization of disadvantaged sectors or access to public transit."

Mayor DeSousa also mentioned that he was keeping in mind the challenges associated with the economy and demographic growth: "Economic development and job creation in the Pôle de l'Ouest are the motivation for a number of our major projects, such as the revitalization of the Thimens/Lucien-Thimens sector, the project in the area surrounding the Bois-Franc commuter train station—an area where a métro station will also be located in a few years' time, and Éco-campus Hubert-Reeves. In short, my colleagues on Council and I are confirming our will to make Saint-Laurent an active, attractive, responsible and innovative community for the benefit of each and every Saint-Laurent resident and we believe that the 2016 budget supports this vision."

In order to be better aligned with family schedules, the event will take place from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Participants will be treated to horse-drawn carriage rides, winter games and inflatable structures, hot chocolate, and a few Olympics-themed surprises! In the event of rain or intense cold, the Féerie will be cancelled.

Saint-Laurent remembers

On Saturday, November 7, the Mayor of Saint-Laurent, Alan DeSousa, the City Councillor for Côte-de-Liesse District, Francesco Miele, the City Councillor for Norman-McLaren District, Aref Salem, and the Borough Councillor for Côte-de-Liesse District, Maurice Cohen, laid a wreath at the foot of the Cenotaph in Parc Beaudet to commemorate Remembrance Day. Several quests of honour, as well as air cadets from the 588 Eric Simms and 621 St-Laurent squadrons, also attended the ceremony.



Parc Jerry-Shears

On October 13, the Mayor of Saint-Laurent Alan DeSousa officialized the name of Parc Jerry-Shears, in the presence of Mrs. Esther Shears, wife of the late Jerry Shears, and the City Councillor for Côte-de-Liesse District, Francesco Miele. This park was named in honour of the late Jerry Shears (1926-2011), a former Saint-Laurent resident who distinguished himself in

winning the Lightweight title in the Canadian Boxing Championships back in 1947 and as a member of the International Olympic Boxing Committee. This park, with its mature trees and its children's playground facilities, lies within the area bounded by Chemin du Bois-Franc, Rue Pierre-Dagenais and Rue Robert-Choquette in Nouveau Saint-Laurent.

Organic waste collection

As scheduled, the distribution of brown bins to residential buildings with four or less housing units was successfully completed at the end of November. By the end of this first phase, nearly 18,000 homes will have started participating in the new organic waste collection.

New schedule for trash collection: four or less housing units

Once this step was completed, the new schedule for trash collection entered into effect on November 23. Trash collection now takes place every two weeks, the reason being

that a large amount of the trash previously collected is now discarded using the new organic waste collection.

An award for Centre de transport Stinson

At this year's PMI-Montréal élixir Gala, the STM's Stinson bus garage project received the Project of the Year award in the "Construction and Engineering" category. Awarded each year by the group of project management professionals, these awards recognize excellence in project management in various areas of expertise, particularly as they relate to respecting a project's budget and timetable.


A unique and sustainable project

In operation since January 2015, the Stinson garage is home to 200 standard and 100 articulated buses and handles their maintenance, servicing and storage needs. More than 700 employees work there. The result of integrated design work that involved several STM sectors, the project located on rue Stinson in Saint-Laurent brings together the best sustainable practices in a 38,000 m² building.

Now certified LEED-Gold, the garage is the most sustainable building in the STM's property inventory and the first one of its kind to achieve that level of certification in Québec.

Renewal of cat and dog licenses

Guardians of cats or dogs must obtain a license for each pet, whereupon they will receive a tag that their animal must wear at all times. Licenses are valid from January 1 to December 31 and are available for a fee at the Citizens' Office. Please note that an additional \$10 fee will apply to renewals processed after February 15, 2016. Furthermore, the cost will be reduced by \$5 for any pet that is microchipped.

Neutered cat: \$10* Non-neutered cat: \$20 Cat adopted from a shelter (for the first year): Free

Dog license
