As usual, the children had access to inflatable structures, and horse-drawn carriage rides and hot chocolate were also provided. The ice sculpting activity was a huge success. The Borough of Saint-Laurent started 2016 with flair, introducing its new and improved customer services. Under the new format, business hours have been extended at the Citizens' Office, the mobile app has been updated, and a FAQ section and the Infozonage database have been added to the Website.

Citizens' Office

Considered to be the hub of Borough Hall, the Citizens' Office has a staff of 13 employees who handle nearly 70,000 requests a year. Demonstrating its concern for always better responding to workers' and families' needs, the Borough is now keeping the Citizens' Office open until 7 p.m. on Wednesdays.

Message from the Mayor



Dear fellow citizens of Saint-Laurent,

With this unseasonably warm winter nearly behind us, it's tempting to start planning for nice weather. If you've set your sights on a personal overhaul, sign up for the Wellness Challenge, and peruse the list of sports and lei*sure activities* that will be offered this spring and summer. The registration period for most of the activities will begin in mid-March. And don't hesitate to join the hundreds of Saint-Laurent residents of all ages who will enter the Course Saint-Laurent on April 10.

It is always important to get out of our comfort zones by regularly setting new goals. For instance, when adopting its Environmental management system, Saint-Laurent asked all of its employees to reduce their paper consumption by 5%. Cognizant of the fact that new computer equipment and growing information sources had resulted in an increased use of paper, this objective seemed ambitious. Nonetheless, by introducing a number of small initiatives, our employees excelled, reducing their use of letter-sized paper by 29%, and of legal-sized stock by 42% over two years.

These results motivated us to continue along the same. lines For example, we introduced organic waste collection at our municipal buildings. Like the residents of buildings with four units or less, our employees can now help to significantly reduce the quantity of waste sent to landfill sites.

It is also with great pride that on the cover of this issue we have featured the team from the Citizens' Office, which processes approximately 70,000 requests each year. With the impressive number of programs, policies, services, and activities offered by Saint-Laurent, these dedicated employees are required to know a wealth of information on command. Always intent on offering more, we made the decisions to expand the business hours at the Citizens' Office and to improve access to information on a number of the most popular topics among residents. Mobile app

The Borough of Saint-Laurent has just launched a major update of its mobile app. From now on, it provides access to lots of relevant information for tourists and workers as well as for residents.

Among the tools offered are answers to Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ), a calendar of activities that makes it possible for users to create a list of favourite activities, geolocated routes to discover the Borough's attractions, the Borough's latest publications on social media and a number of others. Saint-Laurent's mobile app is available for both iPhones and Androids.

Frequently Asked Questions

Available online at **faq.saint-laurent.ca**, the Borough's Frequently Asked Questions provides clear answers to the questions most often asked by residents, whether about taxes, collections, snow removal, etc. The FAQ's bank of answers will be expanded according to the needs expressed. Saint-Laurent residents are encouraged to consult the new FAQ in order to quickly find the information they need.

Info-zonage

In closing, Saint-Laurent has added the new Infozonage tool to its Website, designed to facilitate the research and accessibility of zoning grids and standards for a given area. Simply enter a street address or lot number to view the corresponding grid.

Accessible at **ville.montreal.qc.ca/saint-laurent/ infozonage,** this free support service will help users save time by quickly obtaining information about the permitted uses for a given property, in addition to surface area, implementation standards, green space densities and ratios, and other specific details that could impact a project.

The Azur train makes its first stop in Saint-Laurent

On Sunday, February 7, in the morning, the first Azur train commissioned by the Société de transport de Montréal (STM) made its maiden voyage. The first contingent of passengers comprised several VIPs including the Mayor of Montréal, Denis Coderre, and the City Councillor for Norman-McLaren, Aref Salem, who is also the Montréal Executive Committee member responsible for transport.

The Mayor of Saint-Laurent, Alan DeSousa, and the City Councillor for Côte-de-Liesse and Majority Leader, Francesco Miele, were at the Côte-Vertu metro station located at the corner of Décarie and Côte-Vertu boulevards to greet the train on its first run through Saint-Laurent.

Ultramodern and designed to improve passenger comfort, this first train will be tested for a period of 61 days. If all goes well, the STM may authorize an order for 51 more. Built by the Bombardier-Alstom consortium, the trains will gradually enter into service by September 2018.

Green waste collection

April 18 to November 25

Green waste is collected at the same time as recycling. Residents at buildings **with four units or less** can put their green waste (garden waste, leaves) in the brown bin designed for organic waste collection, directly with food scraps. Surplus items can be placed in paper bags and in reusable containers.

Residents at buildings **with five or more units** who have not yet received their brown bins can discard their green waste (garden waste, leaves) in paper bags or in reusable containers.

Saint-Laurent offers free paper bags at Borough Hall and at the Éco-quartier (maximum 10 bags per year and per building). Proof of residence is required.



Hazardous Household Waste collection (HHW)

Sunday, April 24, 2016 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Municipal workshops

(13001, boulevard Cavendish)

The following materials will be accepted: paint, batteries, motor oil, cleaning products, fluorescent and fluocompact bulbs. It will also be possible to discard used tires (off their rims), gently worn clothing, as well as computer and electronic equipment.

A shredding service for confidential documents will also be offered.



Organic waste collection

Since December, residents at buildings with **4 units or less** have been participating in the new organic waste collection. To view the list of accepted or refused materials, visit **ville.montreal.qc.ca/saint-laurent/ collections** or call the **Info-collecte line at 514 855-6212.**

With the introduction of this new service, household waste collection frequency has been modified to **once every two weeks** because a large quantity of the materials it comprised is now collected as organic waste.

Prohibited compostable plastic bags

It is important to underscore that the organic waste collected in Saint-Laurent is sent to the Mironor composting facility, **which does not accept compostable plastic bags** due to the provincial standards put in place in 2008 by the Ministère du Développement durable, de l'Environnement et de la Lutte contre les changements climatiques (MDDELCC).

Only paper bags are accepted. The use of paper bags is not mandatory, but recommended. It is also possible to wrap organic items in newspaper or cardboard before putting them into a bin, or to use newspaper or cardboard to line the bottom.




Beware of water leaks

Did you know that a leak measuring just 2 mm in diameter represents 350 litres of wasted water per day?

Residents are urged to check for potential leaks in the toilet tanks and faucets that are connected to their plumbing systems.

Avoiding wasting water is a positive gesture for the environment. Moreover, it can generate savings, since the water used by each residence is calculated and billed to the occupant. A regular inspection of the water meter can help to quickly detect plumbing leaks.

Le vernissage de l'exposition lean Soucy, peintre The vernissage of the exhibition entitled clandestin s'est déroulé le 19 décembre dernier en présence d'une quarantaine d'amateurs d'art au Centre d'exposition Lethbridge.

Préparée par le commissaire Sébastien Hudon, cette exposition invitait jusqu'au 14 février les visiteurs à découvrir la riche carrière artistique de Jean Soucy à travers la présentation d'une soixantaine d'œuvres, de nombreux documents et de plusieurs artefacts. Réunies pour la première fois dans une exposition à caractère rétrospectif, ces œuvres étaient, de plus, accompagnées d'un catalogue qui permettait de se familiariser avec un corpus peu étudié de l'histoire de l'art au Québec.

Situé au cœur de la Bibliothèque du Boisé, le Centre d'exposition Lethbridge offre gratuitement toute l'année une programmation d'expositions variées, ainsi que des activités de découverte et d'initiation. Des visites commentées sont également disponibles sur demande.

Jean Soucy, peintre clandestin was held on December 19, drawing attendance of over 40 art lovers to the Centre d'exposition Lethbridge.

Prepared by curator Sébastien Hudon, and on display until February 14, visitors were treated to a alimpse of the rich artistic career of Jean Soucy through an arrangement of some 60 paintings, numerous documents, and several artefacts. Brought together for the first time ever in a retrospective display, the works were also accompanied by a catalogue allowing visitors to become familiar with a little-studied corpus on the history of art across the province.

Located in the heart of the Bibliothèque du Boisé, the Centre d'exposition Lethbridge offers a free year-round program of varied exhibitions, as well as discovery and introduction activities. Guided tours are also available on request.
