PUBLIC CONSULTATION MEETING

Proposed amendment to the Montréal urban agglomeration land use and development plan – Plage de Verdun development project

At its meeting on September 29, 2016, the urban agglomeration council adopted the draft by-law P-RCG 14-029-2 amending the Montréal urban agglomeration land use and development plan (RCG 14-029). The draft by-law has a limited scope over urban agglomeration territory.

In summary, the draft by-law allows for a departure from provisions relating to the floodplain as part of the development project of the Plage de Verdun, situated along the Saint-Lawrence River (parts of lots 3 943 640, 1 619 416 and 1 619 415) at the rear of the Verdun Auditorium in the Verdun borough, located at the southern limit of Rue de l'Église.

PUBLIC MEETING

At the public meeting on December 1, 2016, the *Commission sur le schéma d'aménagement et de développement de Montréal* (standing committee on the Land Use Planning and Development Plan of Montréal) will explain the proposed amendments and, as the case may be, its effects on the urban planning by-laws of the borough. Citizens and representatives of organizations are invited to participate in this public meeting, scheduled to take place as follows:
