Two awards for excellence in architecture

At its Festival of Architecture held from May 24 to 27 in Ottawa, the Royal Architectural Institute of Canada (RAIC) presented an award of excellence to the Mayor of Saint-Laurent, Alan DeSousa, and another to the Bibliothèque du Boisé.

Advocate for Architecture Award

Mr. DeSousa was honoured with the Advocate for Architecture Award, which rewards an individual who makes a public contribution to Canadian architecture other than through the practice of architecture. It recognizes long-term

commitment to the profession at a national, regional, or local level.

The jury selected Mr. DeSousa's nomination for a variety of projects completed in the borough and throughout the Greater Montréal region. Mr. DeSousa was a member of the Ville de Montréal Executive Committee, where, among other duties, he was responsible for economic development and sustainable development. Furthermore, he continues to sit on the Council for the Communauté métropolitaine de Montréal, which comprises 82 municipalities.

Aréna Raymond-Bourque now offers universal access

Since March 3, people with reduced mobility have been able to further benefit from the facilities at Aréna Raymond-Bourque, located at 2345, boulevard Thimens following the completion of a universal accessibility initiative.

Among other things, this initiative involved the installation of an elevator to skating rink A, thereby providing access to the top of the stands, and the construction of a restroom. Certain doors were upgraded, and four parking areas were reconfigured, as were the exterior access roads. Headed by the Service de la gestion et de la planification immobilière under the Ville de Montréal in collaboration with the Borough of Saint-Laurent, the work required an investment of approximately \$915,000.

“Saint-Laurent is making a sustained effort to offer diversified services that are adapted to the needs of its entire population. After Borough Hall and now the Centre des loisirs, among others, I am pleased to announce that Aréna Raymond-Bourque is accessible to people with reduced mobility. Senior citizens, individuals with motor disabilities, and parents of children in strollers can now benefit from this amenity, as can the entire Sports Complex. Also, this summer, we will be upgrading the chalet in Parc Caron”, declared the Mayor of Saint-Laurent, Alan DeSousa.

53 tons of compost distributed

Over 53 tons of compost was distributed to some 300 residents on Saturday, May 13, at the Municipal Workshops. This event was held during International Compost Awareness Week from May 7 to 13.

In addition to leaving with a natural fertilizer, participants were also given a small decorative shrub. Representatives of the VertCit  organization were on-site to distribute information about the dif-

ferent services offered by the  co-quartier and to increase visitor awareness about the importance of participating in the organic waste collection recently introduced in the borough. It is partly thanks to green waste and food waste collected in the brown bins that Ville de Montr al was able to produce the compost that was distributed to citizens. The next distribution will take place on Saturday, October 7.

One Child, One Tree Program

Saint-Laurent celebrated the 7th edition of its One Child, One Tree Program which commemorates the births or adoptions of Saint-Laurent children during their first year. Under the program, a tree for each child is planted on public property. A commemorative ceremony was held on Saturday, June 3, in Parc Philippe-Laheurte, where 41 trees were planted. Each family received an official certificate as well as a fact sheet about the species of the tree matched with their child. Since its creation, the One Child, One Tree Program has led to more than 200 trees being planted in the Marcel-Laurin, Bourbonni re, and Philippe-Laheurte parks.

Contact BioForest to treat your ash tree



Due to problems reported contacting the supplier originally mandated to provide the TreeAzin biopesticide treatment for the emerald ash borer, Saint-Laurent invites the owners of ash trees to directly contact BioForest Technologies inc. The only supplier to provide TreeAzin, this firm supplies and certifies service providers. The treatment must be injected directly into the tree every two years, and has already been used by the Borough to treat virtually all of the ash trees on its territory.

Furthermore, if the tree shows signs of blight, only an expert can determine if the emerald ash borer is to blame, and whether the damage is irreversible. An ash tree with damage to 30% of its branches is generally considered too ravaged to be saved by treatments. In this situation, you must obtain a free tree-cutting certificate from the Borough and cut down the tree as quickly as possible between October 15 and March 15 to prevent the emerald ash borer from spreading.

It is important to remember that in order to ensure its effectiveness, the TreeAzin treatment must be applied between June 1 and August 31.

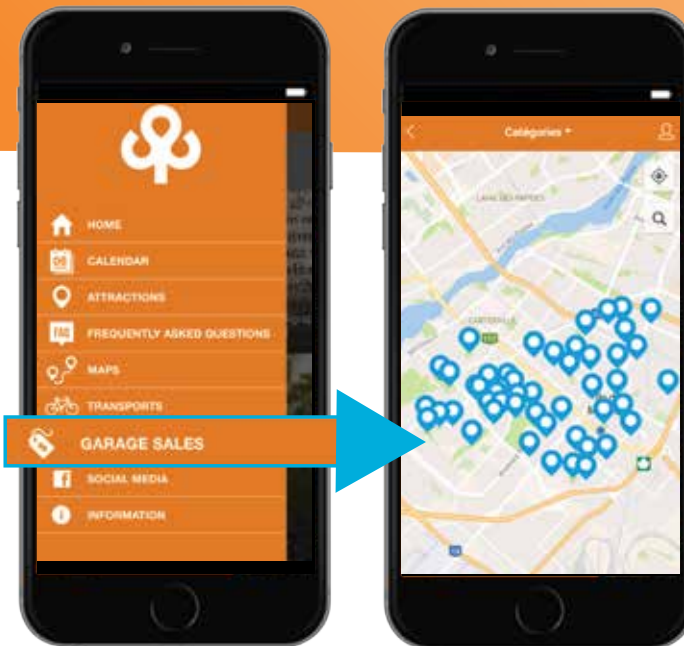

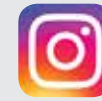

Two awards for excellence in architecture

As an example, his projects have included Montréal's official designation as a UNESCO City of Design; the landscaping of the Bois-Franc sector and the l'Éco-campus Hubert-Reeves; the preservation of Norvick area, and, more recently, his efforts to introduce a national architectural policy.

"It is with a great deal of pride that I am accepting this award on behalf of all of my fellow citizens of Saint-Laurent," the Mayor declared. "With their support, I have invested a great deal of effort into making Saint-Laurent a green and innovative community where quality of life is closely linked to the architectural quality of the built environment. The fact that Mrs. Phyllis Lambert was among previous years' winners in this category makes this distinction all the more meaningful."

Green Building Award

With respect to the Bibliothèque du Bois , the RAIC presented the Green Building Award to  ric Pelletier, the project design architect and senior partner at Lemay. This award recognizes outstanding buildings that are green, and that promote the health and well-being of their users.

The building, which was erected by the team consisting of Cardinal Hardy/Labont  Marcil/  ric Pelletier architect in consortium, opened in 2013. The firms of  ric Pelletier architect and Cardinal Hardy were acquired by Lemay in 2013 and in 2014 respectively, and the latter nominated the building. Certified LEED Platinum, the Biblioth que du Bois  has already garnered some twenty awards both nationally and internationally.

The three-member jury used the following words to explain its choice: "The library offers a variety of welcoming and brightly-lit spaces while optimizing its use of natural light and outdoor views and using natural elements such as wood to create an environment that promotes the health and well-being of its occupants. Through its design and systems strategy, the building's high-performance approach has produced impressive results."
