MESSAGE FROM THE BOROUGH MAYOR

The month of May brings back the good weather and warm days at long last. After the harsh winter we faced, these mild temperatures are truly welcome. And now it's time to clean up our grounds and prepare our flower and plant beds as well as our gardens to collectively beautify our borough.

For my Borough Council colleagues and myself, the absolute number-one priority is still obviously to serve you better and to improve the means of communication between your Borough, the City and you. With this in mind, I invite you, if you have not already done so, to discover **beta.montreal.ca**, a new online, interactive communication platform that enables you to receive information and submit a request online.

I encourage you to subscribe to Ville de Montréal's **alert and notice service**, which keeps you informed, at all times, by text message or email, about emergency situations that may have an impact on your daily life (boil water advisories, floods, work projects, swimming pool closures, etc.). Subscribing to alerts is free of charge.

To register, go online to **beta.montreal.ca/en**, select "Receive notices and alerts" and create an account. In addition to information on emergency situations, you may also choose the various municipal topics of interest to you. You may save up to 5 addresses where you will receive messages (your home, your workplace or your children's school, for example). This service is being developed and will be phased in, starting with emergency messages.

Your account will also enable you to **submit your requests online** concerning potholes, graffiti, defective street lamps, damaged street furniture, lack of cleanliness or the tree branch collection. The *Montréal – Resident Services* app is also available in a mobile version that can be downloaded in iOS and Android formats.

The Borough also offers you the option of subscribing to the **CodeRED automated call service**. This system makes it possible for the Borough to reach its residents quickly and efficiently in case of an emergency, such as boil water or non-consumption of water advisories, water main breaks, street closures, etc., either by landline or mobile phone, text message or email. If your phone number is in the White Pages of the telephone directory, you do not have to register; you will automatically receive alerts. Registration is required if you want to receive alerts on your mobile phone, by email or text message. Go to our website at **ville.montreal.qc.ca/pierrefonds-roxboro** and select the CodeRED icon.

A while ago, Ville de Montréal adopted a children's policy to recognize the importance of youth in our society. This policy was enhanced this year. Thanks to the increase in the budget allocated to carrying out projects related to children, needy young people in Pierrefonds-Roxboro will benefit from these improvements through concrete projects and actions.

And lastly, I'm sure you have noticed that the expansion of the Pierrefonds Library is progressing well. I am extremely proud of this achievement, which will contribute toward the cultural enrichment of our borough.

But we don't intend to stop there and we are continuing to work on advancing projects to improve the services we offer our residents. In this regard, I can assure you that my colleagues on Council and I are making every effort required to complete, in the near future, the construction of a new aquatic complex next to Borough Hall. Another step has been taken on this project. In March, Council awarded a contract to analyse the soil of the site of the former Pierrefonds Arena where the aquatic and recreational complex will be built.

I hope you enjoy the beautiful season that is finally in store for us. And I look forward to meeting you at the many activities organized in parks and public places this summer.





LAUNCH OF THE RESIDENTS' GUIDE IN CASE OF A FLOOD, BE PREPARED!

On March 15, the Residents' Guide *In case of a flood, be prepared!* was officially issued. Following the 2017 historic flood waters, the Borough decided to take concrete measures to prepare its residents as best as possible. In fact, when a disaster such as the 2017 floods occurs, residents are primarily responsible for their own and their families' safety as well as for safeguarding their property, and so it is important to be self-sufficient enough to cope with the situation.

What to do before, during and after a flood

The information in the Guide consists of several sections. Three of them present recommendations for actions to be taken before the flood, at the time of evacuation, after returning home, and during clean-up operations.

Reminder of information on measures to be taken in the event of an emergency

The Guide also includes information on emergency measures, and in particular, how to create your own emergency plan and what to pack in an emergency kit containing everything you must have in order to be able to meet your own needs for the first 72 hours.

The last section lists resources that can help residents, telephone numbers, online services and message alert services to stay informed.

Distribution to residents

The Guide was distributed to Borough residents living in flood-prone areas. All other residents may consult it online on the Borough's website.

A MAIL CARRIER'S MEMORIES, A SERIES OF VIDEO CLIPS ON THE BOROUGH'S HISTORY

As part of Montreal's 375th anniversary celebrations, the Société patrimoine et histoire de L'Île Bizard et Sainte-Geneviève presented a historical and heritage exhibition featuring Marc Locas, an 86-year-old resident and former mail carrier blessed with a wealth of knowledge of the borough's history.

THE BOROUGH REITERATES ITS COMMITMENT TO SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

The borough of Pierrefonds-Roxboro tabled its new 2018-2020 Local Sustainable Development Plan at the March 12, 2018 Council meeting.


In this new Plan, the Borough has a dual objective, namely to continue and enhance certain actions within its 2012-2015 Strategic Plan for Sustainable Development, and to carry out new actions related to the following four priorities:

- 1. Greening the territory, increasing biodiversity and ensuring the sustainability of resources
- 2. Ensuring access to sustainable, healthy, human-scale neighbourhoods
- 3. Reducing greenhouse gas emissions and dependence on fossil fuels
- 4. Transitioning toward a green, circular, responsible economy

The 2018-2020 Local Sustainable Development Plan may be consulted online on the Borough's website or directly at the Citizens' Office, the Roxboro Library and at the library service points at the Pierrefonds Cultural Centre and the East Community Centre.

Some of the achievements under the Borough's first Sustainable Development Plan

- Introduction of reserved lanes on major boulevards for buses, taxis and vehicles with two or more persons on board
- Improvements to the quality of living environments in residential areas
- Implementation of the organic waste collection throughout the territory
- Annual participation of the Borough in the "A tree for my neighbourhood" campaign, in addition to the planting of hundreds of trees on public property





PUBLIC MARKET

Good news! The Public Market will open earlier this year. Residents will be able to stock up on fresh fruits and vegetables every Friday, 2 p.m. - 7 p.m., starting May 25, until October 19, in the parking lot of the East Community Centre.

Once again this year, the market will welcome local producers. Each week, visitors will be able to discover their products, talk with the producers and learn about their practices.

A second site in the western part of the Borough

Residents in the western part of the Borough will also have a public market in their area: A second site has been added in Château-Pierrefonds Park. It will be open on Sundays, 10 a.m. – 2 p.m., July 8 – September 9.

The Borough's partners in this project are the Ma Communauté en santé organization, the Pierrefonds-Roxboro *éco-quartier* and GUEPE.

BY-LAWS



WANT TO ADD A POOL ON YOUR PROPERTY?

A permit from the Permits and Construction Division is required for the construction or installation of an in-ground or above-ground pool. However, construction or installation of a pool cannot begin before a certificate of authorization is issued.

Your application for a certificate of authorization must contain certain information and documents, including:

- 1. a plan to scale showing:
 - the location of the pool and its distance from the property lines and the buildings erected on that property
 - the dimensions and surface area of the lot and pool
 - the location of the deck providing access to the pool
 - existing trees in the projected perimeter of the pool
- 2. the location of mechanical equipment
- 3. the location, details, materials and height of the fence controlling access to the pool and, where applicable, the details of any stairway or ladder providing access to the pool and all details relating to the automatic door closing mechanism allowing access to the pool.

The by-laws include several other stipulations, with regard to the design of the required enclosure, access to the pool and equipment, for example. To know all rules and regulations, contact the Permit Counter (311) or visit the Borough's website.

YOU WANT TO BUY A CABANA OR A SHED? HERE'S WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:

This type of building is considered an accessory structure. It is, in fact, a secondary building completely detached from your residence, but erected on the same ground.

General standards in figures

- Maximum number of accessory buildings per lot or of the same type: 2
- Minimum distance to the main building: 2 m
- Maximum height allowed, with a few exceptions: 4 m

Note: An accessory building located in a side yard adjacent to a street or in a backyard adjacent to a street, must be concealed from the street by one of the following two options:

- an opaque fence with a height of at least 1.5 m and not exceeding 2 m
- a dense hedge of evergreen shrubs or a hedge of conifers at least 1.5 m high



GARDEN CONSTRUCTION (SHED, CABANA)

No permit is required, but it is mandatory to comply with current regulations. Here are the main standards:

- Maximum authorized area of an unattached accessory building: 14 m²
- Maximum authorized area if the accessory building is located on a plot of land with a surface area greater than 1,000 m²: 28 m²*
- Minimum distance to the main building: 2 m
- Minimum distance to any property line: 0.3 m
- * A certificate of authorization is required when the area varies between 15 and 28 m².

DOMESTIC GREENHOUSE

- Maximum area: 14 m²
- Minimum distance from side or rear property line: 2 m

BY-LAWS

ARE YOU FAMILIAR WITH WATER USE REGULATIONS?

When can I water?

It's easy to remember! Even addresses on even dates and odd addresses on odd dates. But only when it doesn't rain.



Manual watering is permitted at all times



With a removable sprinkler or soaker hose: 8 p.m. – 11 p.m.



By means of an automatic system, equipped with a moisture sensor: at night, 3 a.m. – 6 a.m.

BY-LAW ON THE USE OF WOOD-BURNING STOVES AND FIREPLACES

As of October 1, 2018, homeowners must stop using their wood-burning appliance or fireplace unless it is EPA-or CSA-certified to emit no more than 2.5 grams/hour of fine particles into the atmosphere.

How do I know if my device is certified? Information on certification appears on a plate directly attached to the device, on a certificate provided with the device or in its instruction manual.

However, the use of solid fuel appliances or fireplaces is exceptionally permitted during power outages lasting more than three hours.

You use a hose or equipment connected to the water system? There are rules to follow: Filling a swimming pool

- \boxtimes Not allowed 6 a.m. 8 p.m. starting May 16
- ☑ Permitted at any time from April 1 to May 15

Washing paved surfaces (e.g., asphalt), patios or exterior walls

- Prohibited, except during construction or landscaping work or for health reasons
- ightharpoonup Permitted at any time between April 1 and May 15

Other regulations

- ≥ No water may run off onto the street or onto neighbouring properties.
- ☑ All landscaped basins with a waterfall or water spray must be equipped with a water recirculation system.
- ☑ The use of air conditioning/cooling units operating with water and no recirculation loop is prohibited.

PERMITS COUNTER OUR STAFF, YOUR GUIDE, YOUR ADVISOR!

Allow time for a permit or certificate of authorization to be issued. To avoid delaying the start of your work, contact us or come and meet with us as soon as you decide to renovate.

The nearest ecocentre, located at 3535, rue Sartelon in the Borough of Saint-Laurent, is where all types of materials must be brought so that they can be processed as ecologically as possible.

SPECIAL REPORT (FIRST PART) WHY ARE WE PLANTING TREES?

As you may have noticed, the Borough is stepping up its efforts to plant trees in public rights-of-way on streets and in parks. These planting operations are part of the program to increase canopy (the area covered by tree crowns) and replace ash trees destroyed by emerald ash borers. These planting operations are carried out, among others, for...

... OUR HEALTH

A study conducted in 15 American counties showed a significant correlation between the loss of thousands of ash trees killed by emerald ash borers and the increase in the mortality rate due to lung and heart disease.

Several theories have been put forward to explain why the massive loss of trees tends to be one of the factors promoting the onset of diseases. Here are some of them:

Trees are powerful filters

Trees filter pollutants, such as fine dust, ozone and heavy metals. They reduce the presence of gases that worsen smog conditions.

Trees are relaxing!

Looking at trees helps relieve mental fatigue or stress, by prompting relaxation of the nervous system, lowering cortisol levels as well as increasing positive emotions and may even contribute toward a faster recovery of hospitalized patients.

The positive impact of shade

Trees help alleviate health problems associated with extreme heat episodes. The shade they provide is very effective protection against the sun's UV rays, thereby reducing the risk of skin cancer and cataracts.

The power of attraction of trees

The presence of trees on the streets and in parks encourages residents to walk and participate in various physical activities there.

The Emerald Ash Borer rides again!

More than 1,000 trees have been planted in the Borough since 2016. However, within the same period of time, over 700 trees were cut down.

Of this number, 500 were ash trees, located on public property, infested by emerald ash borers or because they were untreatable. There are moreover many ash trees on private property that are also infested with emerald ash borers.

Residents who would like a tree planted in front of their property must notify the Borough by calling 311.


COLLECTIONS ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW!

WHEN AND WHERE TO PLACE YOUR BINS OR BAGS

- No later than **7 a.m.** on the day of the collection, but no sooner than **7 p.m.** the day before
- In front of the building, in your driveway or on your property, as close as possible to the street or sidewalk

PLEASE NOTE:

Bins are not allowed on the street so that street cleaning operations can be carried out properly.



RECYCLING

WHAT IS ACCEPTED

☑ Paper, cardboard and packaging

Newspapers, magazines, books, paper bags, cereal boxes, milk and juice containers, etc.

☑ Containers

Bags, plastic containers (except no. 6 plastic), glass jars and bottles, metal cans, aluminum containers, etc.

WHAT IS NO. 6 PLASTIC?

Coloured or transparent rigid plastic or foam polystyrene used to make various objects and containers.

Examples?

Some may well surprise you! In fact, a number of these items are found in the recycling bin every week:

Rigid polystyrene

- mushroom trays
- transparent containers with a hinged lid for fruits and vegetables
- single-serving yogurt containers (remove aluminum foil lids)
- transparent dome packaging and black base for pastry and other ready-to-eat food
- small containers of milk and coffee cream

Expanded polystyrene

- protective packaging for electronic or household appliances
- food trays for meat, fish and poultry
- egg crates
- · containers with hinged lid
- single-use plates and bowls
- flats for annual flowers and others
- glasses for coffee and hot drinks

BRANCH COLLECTION

April to October

Consult **ville.montreal.qc.ca/pierrefonds-roxboro** or call 311 to find out the dates planned for your sector.

REMINDER

- Branches should not be tied.
- Branches should be neatly placed at the curb.
- Leaves must be on the side of the property.

COLLECTIONS

ORGANIC WASTE (INCLUDING GREEN WASTE)

WHAT IS ACCEPTED

✓ Raw or cooked food

Fruits and vegetables, poultry, meat (with bones), fish and seafood, egg shells, pasta, bread, coffee, cheese, etc.

✓ Soiled paper and cardboard

Newspapers, facial tissues, paper towels, soiled food boxes (pizza boxes and others), etc.

✓ Green waste*

Leaves, twigs, vegetable plants, fruit tree waste and gardening waste, branches less than 5 cm in diameter and 1 m in length, etc.

✓ Miscellaneous

Ashes, animal food, hair, feathers, etc.

WHAT IS REJECTED

- Recyclable and household waste
- □ Diapers and sanitary napkins
- Animal litter, etc.

TIPS AND TRICKS FOR THE SUMMER

KITCHEN COUNTER BIN (INDOORS)

To keep your bin dry

- Avoid pouring liquids into your kitchen counter bin.
- Put newspaper at the bottom of the brown bin to absorb small amounts of liquid runoff.

To prevent odours

- Sprinkle some baking soda or place a charcoal briquette in each bin.
- Clean your bins regularly with a solution of vinegar and water.

To kill or repel insects

- Pour table salt to kill white grubs.
- Wrap your waste materials in newspaper or in a paper bag to repel insects.
- Freeze the remaining meat, bones and fish and put them directly inside the brown bin on the day of collection.

BROWN BIN (OUTDOORS)

To prevent bad odours and repel insects

- Take out your brown bin every week for the weekly collection, even if it is not full.
- Do not leave your outdoor bin in the sun.
- Sprinkle some baking soda or place a charcoal briquette in the bin.

To keep animals away

• Spray cough ointment or essential oils under the lid of your bin.
