MAYOR'S REPORT ON THE FINANCIAL SITUATION OF THE BOROUGH OF PIERREFONDS-ROXBORO



It is with pride that I table the annual report on the financial situation of the borough for the year 2017, the outlook for the current year and the general orientation for the 2019 budget, in compliance with section 144.7 of the *Charter of Ville de Montréal*.

Financial situation as of December 31, 2017

The 2017 budget forecast planned expenditures of \$29,112,300. As of December 31, 2017, actual expenditures amounted to \$29,250,805. Compared to the amended budget of \$29,287,666, this represents a saving of \$36,861 despite the exceptional expenditures related to the 2017 spring floods.

Actual revenues totalled \$1,422,130, compared to budget estimates of \$1,456,900, resulting in a variance of \$34,770, largely due to a decrease of various rentals and miscellaneous income during the fiscal year. Non-recurring corporate financial adjustments totalling \$1,129,600 also improve this aspect, bringing the results of the financial surplus to \$1,313,600. This performance allowed the borough to show an unreserved accumulated surplus of \$8,360,339, as of December 31, 2017.

Three-year Capital Expenditure Program 2017-2019

A total of \$3,973,450 was invested as part of the three-year program of capital expenditures in 2017-2019. This amount was allocated for:

- Road rehabilitation works and paving of various streets;
- The maintenance of municipal buildings and equipment to bring them up to standard;
- The implementation of various development works in the parks.

Additional works in the order of \$2,922,000, funded entirely by the Ville de Montréal, were undertaken on borough territory to improve water, sewer and drainage networks as well as for road reconstruction.

Preliminary financial indicators for 2018

The budget allocation for 2018 is of \$29,785,500. The borough expects to meet its commitments in terms of expenditures and revenues.

THE BOROUGH IN PICTURES

Réseau express métropolitain

REM: A NEW NETWORK For greater montréal

The purpose of the Réseau express métropolitain (REM) is to provide rapid and reliable service for the transportation of the population to downtown Montréal, the South Shore, the North Shore, the West Island and the Montréal airport. With its 67 km and 26 stations that will be integrated into the existing public transit (metro, bus and commuter train) networks, the REM will facilitate the mobility of the population throughout Montréal.

Once completed, the REM will become one of the largest automated transportation networks in the world and the largest public transit project in Québec in the last 50 years. To learn more about the REM and the upcoming worksites, visit the website: **rem.info/en**.



VERSAILLES POOL

On May 28, the Mayor and the Borough Council members proceeded with the groundbreaking ceremony to kick off the redevelopment work of Versailles Pool. Representing an investment of \$3.2 million, this project will enable the Borough to provide a second municipal pool to its citizens as the association responsible for the pool recently transferred its rights to the Borough. The first public swimming pool, Valleycrest, was inaugurated in 2014.



MAYOR'S WALK

The traditional Mayor's Walk was held on May 12. Once again this year, more than 200 citizens came to walk alongside Mayor Dimitrios (Jim) Beis, and thus showed their support to the prevention of violence against women.



GARDENING AND ENVIRONMENT Day

On June 2, Pierrefonds-Roxboro residents were invited to participate in the Gardening and Environment Day, organized in collaboration with the Éco-quartier Pierrefonds-Roxboro and the Société d'horticulture et d'écologie de Pierrefonds. As every year, this event attracted nearly 1000 people who showed up, on a beautiful sunny day, to obtain compost, plants, herbs and vegetables.



PUBLIC MARKETS IN PIERREFONDS-ROXBORO

Throughout the summer, Pierrefonds-Roxboro residents were invited to take advantage of the two public markets set up on the territory. For a second year, the d'À-Ma-Baie public market welcomes several local producers from 2 to 7 p.m. every Friday until October 19, at the East Community Centre, offering their fresh or artisanal products. This year, a second market was set up in the western sector of the borough. The Château-Pierrefonds market is open on Sundays, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., until September 9.

CANADA DAY

Canada Day was celebrated in Pierrefonds-Roxboro under an extreme heat wave. Despite the heat and humidity that forced the cancellation of the traditional morning parade, hundreds of citizens joyfully participated in the various activities organized under the theme of science fiction films. Several very colourful floats were on display for the pleasure of the young and the old. Participants were also able to meet movie stars, including some Star Wars characters. The festivities ended with a show by King Melrose and his guest, Stéphanie Bédard, followed by magnificent fireworks.



BY-LAWS

PERMIT COUNTER

Residents who need a permit or certificate of authorization may make an appointment to avoid waiting at the Permit Counter. To do so, call 311, leave your name and phone number. An agent will contact you to schedule an appointment.

Appointments are not mandatory. Residents can always visit the Permit Counter at any time. (see page 28 for opening hours)

CUTTING DOWN A TREE? KNOW THE RULES?

A certificate of authorization is required for cutting down a tree when the trunk of the tree has a diameter of at least 10 cm at a distance of 1.3 metre from the ground, or a diameter of at least 15 cm at a maximum distance of 15 cm from the ground. This certificate is issued in one of the following situations:

- The tree is dead or irreversibly withering away.
- The tree must be cut down, based on the findings of an examination by an arborist (also called an arboriculturist), due to an irreversible situation caused by disease, a structural deficiency affecting its solidity or serious damage that it is causing to property.
- The tree is located at a future construction site or 3 metres from that site, except for a sign, an accessory structure or a planned retaining wall. Nevertheless, a tree located between 3 and 5 metres from a future construction site may be cut down as long as it is replaced.
- The tree is located at the site of a future pool or, in a front yard, at the future site of a parking space or building driveway, only if no other space is available elsewhere on the grounds for such installations.
- The tree must be cut down due to a risk that it may spread a disease or an invasive alien species, such as the emerald ash borer, and in such a case, it must be replaced.
- The tree must be cut down in order to set up an opening of 5 metres in width providing access to the shore of a body of water, when the slope of the shore is less than 30%.

Forms to require a certificate for cutting down a tree are available on the Borough's website at **ville.montreal.qc.ca/pierrefonds-roxboro** or at Borough Hall.

TEMPORARY CAR SHELTERS

The installation of a temporary car shelter is permitted from November 1 of one year to April 15 of the following year.

Conditions to be respected

- It is permitted to install only one winter shelter, one drum shelter and one tunnel shelter per single, two- or three-family dwelling.
- Installation is permitted in all yards, more than 1 m from the sidewalk and more than 1.5 metre from the curb or the roadway.
- The shelter must be located in an off-street parking space or in an access driveway leading to the off-street parking space.
- The maximum height is set at 3 metres.
- The structure must be covered with a waterproof and fireproof fibrous synthetic fabric in a shade of white, light grey, light yellow, light beige or light blue.

ON-STREET PARKING DURING WINTER

It is prohibited to park in the borough streets at night between 1 a.m. and 7 a.m., during the winter season, from November 1 to April 1.

On-street parking* is also prohibited at all times of day:

- during a snowfall where the accumulation on the ground is more than 5 cm;
- during snow removal operations;
- for as long as signs or warning signals are visible.

*except on streets where alternative parking is available.



BY-LAW ON ANIMAL CONTROL

Montréal's By-Law on Animal Control sets out a number of rules for behaviour and civic-mindedness to ensure residents' safety and peace and quietness, as well as cleanliness of public property. The By-Law states that all dog and cat owners who live within Montréal's city limits must obtain an annual permit.

The permit is valid anywhere within Montréal's city limits for one year. It must be renewed before the expiry date or late fees will be charged.

The medal (silver, rose-shaped) issued since October 1, 2017 is valid for the life of the animal, although the permit is renewable annually. A replacement fee will be charged if the medal is lost or damaged.

At all times, a dog must wear its medal and be kept on a leash of a 1.85 m maximum length on public property. In addition, any dog weighing 20 kg or more must wear a harness to which the leash is attached.

WOOD HEATING

As of October 1, 2018, only wood-burning stoves and fireplaces with an EPA or CSA certification to the effect that they do not emit more than 2.5 g/h of fine particles into the atmosphere will be authorized on the territory.

Wood heating is one of the main causes of smog in winter. It is now prohibited to use solid fuel heaters during smog warnings.

Watch for smog warnings

- Keep an eye on the City's air quality on Montréal's website: ville.montreal.qc.ca, under Environment→ Air→ Air Quality Surveillance.

It should be noted that the use of solid fuel heaters is exceptionally authorized during power outages lasting more than three hours.



BY-LAWS

According to the By-law on fire prevention, you are required to have chimneys, connecting pipes and flue pipes inspected in order to detect any hazardous condition, at intervals of no more than 12 months, each time you connect an appliance and each time a chimney fire has occurred.

In addition, it is strongly recommended to do business with a private chimney sweeping company registered with the Régie du bâtiment du Québec. We invite you to visit the Association des professionnels du chauffage website at poelesfoyers.ca to learn more on this subject.



- Show consideration for pedestrians and do not put any snow on the sidewalk.
- Obey the parking regulations and move your vehicle in time.
- Place your garbage cans, bags or containers in your driveway and never on the sidewalk or a snow bank.
- Shovel snow on your residential or commercial land and not in the street.
- Park 30 cm from the sidewalk and place your snow clearance markers 60 cm from the sidewalk or curb, on your own grounds.
- Make sure you remove all objects from your driveway logs, paving stones, concrete blocks, etc. that might be pushed into the street and cause a snowblower breakdown.

BOROUGH'S SNOW CLEARANCE

Less than 5 cm: ice melter and abrasives are spread.

More than 5 cm: roads and sidewalks are cleared during the snowfall.

If there is an accumulation of at least 10 to 15 cm: a snow loading operation gets underway, ordered by Ville de Montréal, and may take 2 to 6 days to complete, depending on the amount of the snowfall.

PRIORITIES

A level of service must be reached depending on the priority of streets (three levels). These levels are determined according to a combination of the following characteristics:

PRIORITY 1

Major streets, major commercial streets, bus routes, reserved lanes, hospital entrances, narrow streets, etc. (i.e. boulevards de Pierrefonds, Saint-Jean, des Sources)

PRIORITY 2

Collector streets, local commercial streets, regular bus routes, etc. (i.e. rues Pavillon, Sainte-Anne, Perron)

PRIORITY 3

Local streets, industrial sectors, etc. (i.e. rues Baldwin, Hélène, Dauville)

SAFETY



A few weeks ago, the Borough of Pierrefonds-Roxboro launched its new road safety campaign. Signs that could be installed on front lawns were distributed free of charge during an awareness day on August 18. Residents who were unable to attend this activity can pick up their signs at the Citizen's Office.

FOR A SAFE BACK-TO-SCHOOL TIME

Just a few days away from back-to-school time is a good opportunity to remind everyone of the rules to follow in order to ensure the safety of children and motorists.

Children walking to school

- Cross at the street corner or along the crosswalk located nearby.
- If there is a crossing guard, cross at the supervised intersections.
- Obey the pedestrian traffic lights or the regular traffic lights set up at street corners.
- Cross the street only on a green light.
- If there is a crosswalk, but it is not located at a street corner where there are traffic lights, make sure you can cross it risk-free.

Children cycling to school

- Stop your bicycle at a red light or stop sign.
- Ride in the same direction as the traffic.
- Don't use ear buds when driving your bicycle.
- Always wear a helmet.

Motorists

- Obey the speed limit.
- Stop your vehicle at a red or yellow light or at a stop sign, before a crosswalk, at a stop line or near side of a roadway.
- Drive carefully so that you notice the crosswalks that are not located at a street corner. Stop your vehicle so that pedestrians can cross the street.
- Give pedestrians and cyclists the right of way when turning at an intersection.
- Before opening your vehicle door, make sure you can do so at no risk to a cyclist.
- Stop your vehicle more than five metres away from a bus or mini-bus—used for the transportation of school children—when its flashing lights are turned on.

NOVEMBER 4, BACK TO STANDARD TIME!

Under the Québec Legal Time Act, time must be changed twice a year:

the 2^{nd} Sunday of March, the time must be brought forward by one hour (change to Eastern Daylight Saving Time or Summer Time);

on the 1st Sunday of November, the time must be set back one hour (back to Eastern Standard Time). This fall, the time will change during the night of November 3 to 4. Therefore, at 2 a.m., you will have to go back one hour and it will then actually be 1 hour.



Time change, battery change!

When changing the time, remember to check your smoke alarms! The Service de sécurité incendie de Montréal invites you to take advantage of the return to standard time to check the proper functioning of your smoke alarms and reminds you that it is mandatory to have a functional smoke detector in your home.

Take advantage of the time change to inspect your device and change the battery, or to install one. These are simple actions that can save lives.

CAUTION FOR A HALLOWEEN FILLED WITH FUN!

On Halloween night, monsters, witches and other creatures will be storming the streets of Pierrefonds-Roxboro. In order to make the celebration enjoyable for everyone and to ensure that it doesn't end up in a disaster, the Borough invites children and their families to respect ten fundamental safety rules.

- 1. To be clearly visible, wear light-coloured clothing with reflective stripes.
- 2. Wear short clothing to avoid tripping.
- **3.** Use makeup rather than masks to see and hear properly.
- 4. Use a flashlight to see better and be more visible.
- 5. Inform parents of their whereabouts and the time of their return.
- **6.** Always ring the doorbell in group or with an adult and always wait outside the house.
- 7. Walk one side of the street at a time and avoid unnecessary crossings.
- 8. Cross the streets at intersections and obey road signs.
- **9.** Refuse to approach or board a vehicle without parental permission.
- **10.**Check with parents to ensure that the treats collected are safe to eat.

Drivers: protect children

- Be careful: children can be difficult to see
- Slow down: to have more time to avoid an accident
- Be patient and courteous

SPECIAL FILE (PART 2) WHY ARE WE PLANTING TREES?

As part of the plan to strengthen the canopy and replace fallen ash trees, the Borough plans to plant more than 450 trees this fall.

As you may have noticed, the Borough is stepping up its efforts to plant trees in public rights-of-way on its streets and in its parks. These planting operations are part of the program to strengthen tree canopies (the area covered by tree crowns) and to replace ash trees destroyed by emerald ash borers. These tree planting operations are being carried out for the following reasons, among others:

OUR INFRASTRUCTURES AND OUR ECONOMY

- Trees in urban areas intercept rainwater by means of their foliage as well as limit direct runoff to stormwater drains when they are located near such impervious areas as asphalt and pavement. They also absorb a lot of water from their roots, decreasing the amount of runoff as well. This, in turn, reduces not only the amount of water to be treated, but also the risk of flooding, broken pipes and overflows.
- Asphalt shaded by trees has a longer life than when exposed to the sun.
- Depending on their location, trees can create a more comfortable climate in buildings. They can reduce the need for air conditioning by up to 50%. If well oriented, they can also reduce heating needs in winter by 15%.

- Trees modify the impact of winds; they block, direct, channel and filter air flow.
- The presence of trees increases the value of neighbouring properties. The average increase is estimated between 5 and 10%. These properties also gain added value at the time of resale, because buyers are often willing to invest more for the same type of property as elsewhere, if a property is located in a wooded area.
- Trees and forests directly or indirectly create thousands of jobs and many woodlands are of high interest for tourism, two significant contributions to the economy.
- Trees have a monetary value that can be determined by competent evaluators. In the event of a claim or damage by a third party, compensation may be paid by insurers or obtained through legal action to cover the loss of value.

A TREE FOR MY NEIGHBOURHOOD (FALL 2018 EDITION)

This spring, the Éco-quartier Pierrefonds-Roxboro sold 95 native trees measuring 1.5 m or more as part of the *A Tree for My Neighbourhood* campaign. This program, in existence for six years, is the result of a partnership between Ville de Montréal, the Regroupement des Éco-quartiers and the Société de verdissement du Montréal métropolitain (SOVERDI).

For an additional cost, you can have the tree delivered to your home and even planted.

MAJOR AMENDMENTS TO EMERALD ASH BORER BY-LAW 15-040

In June 2018, Ville de Montréal made major amendments to the By-law on privately owned ash trees.

Here are the most important changes:

NEW RULE

Obligation to cut down a dying ash tree by December 31, upon receiving notification to do so.	Obligation to submit an application for a certificate of authorization to cut down an ash tree within 30 days of receiving notification to do so.
Obligation to cut down an ash tree within 60 days after obtaining a certificate of authorization to do so.	The deadline is now 180 days .
Financial assistance to cut down and-replace a tree limited to residential properties of 5 units or less.	This financial assistance is now available to all private owners .
The financial assistance to treat private ash trees covers 50% of the costs or \$3 per centimetre of a treated ash tree. Maximum financial assistance over a 2-year period: \$2,000 per property.	Financial assistance for such treatment has been increased to \$4 per centimetre, or at least 66% of the cost of treatment. Maximum financial assistance over a 2-year period: \$4,000 per property.

In the spring, the Borough of Pierrefonds-Roxboro announced the creation of a subsidy program for families wishing to make the transition from disposable diapers to cloth diapers. The result of a partnership with VertCité, the organization that oversees the Éco-quartier Pierrefonds-Roxboro, the program provides grants of up to \$100 each per child for the purchase or rental of cloth diapers, with a maximum of \$4,500 per year for the entire program.
