MESSAGE FROM THE BOROUGH MAYOR

Dear Residents,

I hope you had a good summer and that you managed to attend the various annual cultural and sports activities offered by and in our Borough, such as our Tribute to Seniors, the Ribfest and Strangers in the Night!

My Administration, my colleagues on Borough Council and I will continue to defend the interests of our residents with the government of Québec for as long as necessary and we remain hopeful that the Government will pay attention to our recommendations. Whatever their final decision, we will continue, as we have always done, to integrate solutions into our long-term planning.

MAYOR'S REPORT ON THE FINANCIAL SITUATION OF THE BOROUGH OF PIERREFONDS-ROXBORO

It is with pride that I table the annual report on the financial situation of the borough for the year 2018, the outlook for the current year and the general orientation for the 2020 budget, in compliance with section 144.7 of the *Charter of Ville de Montréal*.

Financial situation as of December 31, 2018

The 2018 budget forecast planned expenditures of \$29,785,500. As of December 31, 2018, actual expenditures amounted to \$30,277,551, compared to the amended budget of \$29,852,500. The negative variation is due to events beyond our control such as severe winter conditions.

Actual revenues totalled \$1,444,890, compared to budget estimates of \$1,296,900. This positive variation is mainly due to contract penalties and to the increase in the number of studies of various development projects. Non-recurring corporate financial adjustments totalling \$533,500 also improve this aspect, bringing the results of the financial surplus to \$256,400. This performance allows the borough to show an unreserved accumulated surplus of \$5,463,444, as of December 31, 2018.

Three-year Capital Expenditure Program 2018-2020

A total of \$5,407,510 was invested as part of the three-year program of capital expenditures in 2018-2020. This amount was allocated for:

- Road rehabilitation works and paving of various streets;
- The maintenance of municipal buildings and equipment to bring them up to standard;
- The implementation of various development works in the parks.

Additional works in the order of \$5,060,000, funded entirely by the Ville de Montréal, were undertaken on borough territory to improve water, sewer and drainage networks as well as for road reconstruction.

Preliminary financial indicators for 2019

The budget allocation for 2019 is of \$31,512,500. The borough expects to meet its commitments in terms of expenditures and revenues.

MAJOR PROJECTS AND ACHIEVEMENTS

FLOODING 2019

Spring 2019 was marked by a dramatic increase in water flows in the Rivière des Prairies. Even larger than in 2017, the 2019 flood caused significantly less damage to waterfront properties, due in particular to the measures quickly implemented by the Borough and Ville de Montréal, thanks to our action and prevention plan developed in response to the 2017 floods.

As of April 3, the Borough took a preventive and proactive approach to raise awareness among all residents, particularly those living along the Rivière des Prairies, to the importance of preparing for the spring flood. In collaboration with the Centre de sécurité civile de Montréal, the evolution of the river level was monitored daily throughout the flood and the Borough quickly implemented tools to communicate adequately with residents: awareness tour by the Mayor, elected officials and people from the Service de sécurité incendie de Montréal; distribution of the guide *In case of a flood, be prepared!* which contains information on the preparation required during spring flooding; distribution of a leaflet indicating how to subscribe to the various information media in the Borough that have been broadcasting the evolution of the situation in real time.

Thanks to the rapid installation of dikes at strategic locations and their regular maintenance by Borough teams, with the collaboration of resources lent by other Boroughs in Montréal and the Canadian Armed Forces, the number of flooded properties remained well below what it could have been. The dedication of hundreds of volunteers from all over the region to assist in prevention efforts and the preparation of sandbags is to be commended. A great outpouring of solidarity that warms the heart in difficult times!



OPENING OF THE NEW PIERREFONDS LIBRARY

It is with great pride that the Mayor and elected officials celebrated the opening of the new Pierrefonds Library on May 23, during a special event attended by more than 300 borough residents.

The opening festivities continued during the open house held from May 23 to 26. More than 14,180 people came to discover this new jewel in the borough. During these four days, the library recorded a total of 6,884 loans and 428 subscriptions.

If you haven't already done so, come and visit your new library, which is a new focal point in our borough, a gathering place for everyone. You will discover a high quality documentary and cultural offer as well as a multitude of interesting activities, each one more interesting than the other.



DESIGNATION OF THE GERRY-ROBERTSON COMMUNITY CENTRE

During a ceremony gathering the family and friends of the former Pierrefonds-Roxboro Recreation Director, Pierrefonds-Roxboro Borough Mayor Dimitrios (Jim) Beis proudly unveiled the new identification sign that officializes the new name of the Eastern Community Centre as the "Gerry-Robertson Community Centre".

Gerry Robertson passed away in 2015 and served as Pierrefonds' Recreation Director from 1973 until his retirement in 2010. He has been a prominent figure in the region's community life, fully and dedicatedly involved with many local organizations. Mr. Robertson played a major role in assessing the needs of the sector that led to the construction of the centre in 2008, and it is therefore a well-deserved tribute that the Borough is paying to him by naming this building in his memory.



MAYOR'S WALK

Over 200 people took advantage of a perfectly sunny day to participate in the traditional Mayor's Walk, held on June 9. By walking alongside Borough Mayor Dimitrios (Jim) Beis and Borough Council members for a distance of 8.2 km on this occasion, the participants expressed their support and their commitment to the cause of mental health. LAUNCH OF THE TRAVELING CART

On June 26, the Borough officially announced the launch of the "Traveling Cart" program, which is intended to collect non-perishable food items during special events, shows and popular gatherings organized by the Borough for the benefit of our local food banks, all year round.

While people show solidarity and generosity during the holiday season, it is important to remember that needs are present all year round. Food banks need everyone's efforts to replenish their shelves and meet the needs of borough families who need food assistance.

The Traveling Cart will be positioned at the entrance of each event organized by the Borough.

CHÂTEAU-PIERREFONDS PUBLIC MARKET

For a third consecutive year, the Borough is offering residents the opportunity to purchase local high-quality fresh or artisanal produce by visiting the Château-Pierrefonds Public Market.

From June 16 until September 29, the market runs every Sunday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. in de Château-Pierrefonds Park (intersection of avenue du Château-Pierrefonds and boulevard de Pierrefonds).

À-MA-BAIE SOLIDARITY MARKET: PAY WHAT YOU CAN!

In collaboration with its local partners, non-profit organizations Vert Cité (Éco-Quartier) and La Corbeille de Pain, the Borough of Pierrefonds-Roxboro is innovating this year with the implementation of a new public service: the À-Ma-Baie Solidarity Market.



The objective of the solidarity market, which is the result of community and citizen mobilization, is to improve access to fresh fruit and vegetables at a fair price for the residents of the neighbourhood, which is geographically remote from food shops. It is a social, economic and ecological approach that aims to improve everyone's food autonomy, but it is also intended as a place for exchanges and meetings that will foster a dynamic, inclusive, participatory and supportive neighbourhood life. Every week, local artists offer musical performances to liven up the public space while community organizations are on site to develop a close relationship with residents.

The market operates on the principle of "Pay what you can". A suggested price is displayed for each item, but the customer can choose to pay the amount he or she is able to pay.

Inaugurated on July 5, the À-Ma-Baie Market is open **every Friday until September 27, between 3 p.m. and 7 p.m., outside the Gerry-Robertson Community Centre.**



INAUGURATION OF WATER GAMES AT CYRIL-W.-MCDONALD PARK

In an effort to better serve the population of Pierrefonds-Roxboro, the Borough inaugurated new water games at Cyril-W.-McDonald Park on July 4. The water games will certainly delight young and old in the area who are looking for an opportunity to freshen up, while having a good time. Water games are accessible through rue Graham and rue Harry-Worth.

CONSTRUCTION OF A 3RD SYNTHETIC SOCCER/ FOOTBALL FIELD AT THE GEORGE SPRINGATE CENTRE



A third synthetic soccer/football field was inaugurated in Pierrefonds-Roxboro. The project was made possible through a partnership with the Lester B. Pearson School Board, owner of the land on which the first field was built, in the George Springate Sports Centre, behind Pierrefonds Comprehensive High School.

The new field, representing an investment of \$5.2 million, also includes the construction of a new athletics track and a long jump track. The attendance capacity has been increased to more than 1000 people and a press gallery with a sound system has been added.

More than 2000 young people play soccer and football in Pierrefonds-Roxboro. Local soccer and football associations as well as students from the school board's schools will have the chance to benefit from this new facility and practice their favourite sports at the end of this summer.

BY-LAWS

PERMIT COUNTER

The Permit Counter is located on the ground floor of the Borough Hall, adjoining the Access Montréal Office. To reduce the waiting time to obtain a permit or certificate of authorization, you can make an appointment by calling 311. Leave your name and phone number so that an agent can contact you.

CUTTING DOWN A TREE

A certificate of authorization is required for cutting down a tree when the trunk of the tree has a diameter of at least 10 cm at a distance of 1.3 metre from the ground, or a diameter of at least 15 cm at a maximum distance of 15 cm from the ground. This certificate is issued in one of the following situations:

- The tree is dead or irreversibly withering away.
- The tree must be cut down, based on the findings of an examination by an arborist (also called an arboriculturist), due to an irreversible situation caused by disease, a structural deficiency affecting its solidity or serious damage that it is causing to property.
- The tree is located at a future construction site or 3 metres from that site, except for a sign, an accessory structure or a planned retaining wall. Nevertheless, a tree located between 3 and 5 metres from a future construction site may be cut down as long as it is replaced.
- The tree is located at the site of a future pool or, in a front yard, at the future site of a parking space or driveway, only if no other space is available elsewhere on the grounds for such installations.
- The tree must be cut down due to a risk that it may spread a disease or an invasive alien species, such as the emerald ash borer, and in such a case, it must be replaced.
- The tree must be cut down in order to set up an opening of 5 metres in width providing access to the shore of a body of water, when the slope of the shore is less than 30%.

Forms to require a certificate for cutting down a tree are available on the Borough's website at ville.montreal.qc.ca/pierrefonds-roxboro or at Borough Hall.

TEMPORARY CAR SHELTERS

The installation of a temporary car shelter is permitted from November 1 of one year to April 15 of the following year.

Conditions to be respected

- It is permitted to install only one winter shelter, one drum shelter and one tunnel shelter per single, two- or three-family dwelling.
- Installation is permitted in all yards, more than 1 m from the sidewalk and more than 1.5 metre from the curb or the roadway.
- The shelter must be located in an off-street parking space or in an access driveway leading to the off-street parking space.
- The maximum height is set at 3 metres.
- The structure must be covered with a waterproof and fireproof fibrous synthetic fabric in a shade of white, light grey, light yellow, light beige or light blue.

ON-STREET PARKING DURING WINTER

It is prohibited to park in the borough streets at night between 1 a.m. and 7 a.m., during the winter season, from November 1 to April 1.

On-street parking* is also prohibited at all times of day:

- during a snowfall where the accumulation on the ground is more than 5 cm;
- during snow removal operations;
- for as long as signs or warning signals are visible.

*except on streets where alternative parking is available.



BY-LAW ON ANIMAL CONTROL

Montréal's By-Law on Animal Control sets out a number of rules for behaviour and civic-mindedness to ensure residents' safety and to facilitate cohabitation with animals.

If you live in Montréal and are the owner of a cat or dog, you must obtain and renew a permit each year, before its due date.

Upon obtaining the permit, you will be provided with a medal valid for the animal's entire life.

It must be worn at all times by your dog or cat, unless your cat is microchipped. The medal and the microchip are two methods of identification that allow to contact you if your lost pet is found.

It should be noted that as of January 1, 2020, sterilization and microchipping will become mandatory for dogs and cats over 6 months old. If your pet is already microchipped, you are entitled to a discount on the permit fee.

RALENTISSEZ SLOW DOWN



FOR A SAFE BACK-TO-SCHOOL TIME

Just a few days away from back-to-school time is a good opportunity to remind everyone of the rules to follow in order to ensure the safety of children and motorists.

Children walking to school

- Cross at the street corner or along the crosswalk located nearby.
- If there is a crossing guard, cross at the supervised intersections.
- Obey the pedestrian traffic lights or the regular traffic lights set up at street corners.
- Cross the street only on a green light.
- If there is a crosswalk, but it is not located at a street corner where there are traffic lights, make sure you can cross it risk-free.

Children cycling to school

- Stop your bicycle at a red light or stop sign.
- Ride in the same direction as the traffic.
- Don't use ear buds when driving your bicycle.
- Always wear a helmet.

Motorists

- Obey the speed limit.
- Stop your vehicle at a red or yellow light or at a stop sign, before a crosswalk, at a stop line or near side of a roadway.
- Drive carefully so that you notice the crosswalks that are not located at a street corner. Stop your vehicle so that pedestrians can cross the street.
- Give pedestrians and cyclists the right of way when turning at an intersection.
- Before opening your vehicle door, make sure you can do so at no risk to a cyclist.
- Stop your vehicle more than five metres away from a bus or mini-bus—used for the transportation of school children—when its flashing lights are turned on.

CAUTION FOR A HALLOWEEN FILLED WITH FUN!



On Halloween night, monsters, witches and other creatures will be storming the streets of Pierrefonds-Roxboro. In order to make the celebration enjoyable for everyone and to ensure that it doesn't end up in a disaster, the Borough invites children and their families to respect these fundamental safety rules:

1. Wear short, light coloured clothing with reflective stripes.
2. Use makeup rather than masks.
3. Use a flashlight.
4. Inform parents of their whereabouts and the time of their return.
5. Always ring the doorbell in group or with an adult and always wait outside the house.
6. Walk one side of the street at a time and avoid unnecessary crossings.
7. Cross the streets at intersections and obey road signs.
8. Refuse to approach or board a vehicle without parental permission.
9. Check with parents to ensure that the treats collected are safe to eat.

Drivers: protect children

- Be careful: children can be difficult to see
- Slow down: to have more time to avoid an accident
- Be patient and courteous

NEW RULES FOR SMOKE ALARMS

Since June 20, 2019, significant amendments have been made to *the By-law concerning the Service de sécurité incendie (RCG 12-003)*, in effect since 2012.

The article concerning smoke alarms now requires that all residential buildings built before 1985 must now be equipped with smoke alarms powered by a non-removable lithium battery with a lifespan of 10 years.

Remember that the smoke alarm is not optional, but mandatory. It is the responsibility of each owner to install them in the areas required by the by-law. Owners and tenants have a shared responsibility to ensure its proper operation by carrying out the necessary monthly checks.

In addition, the section concerning the maintenance and good condition of smoke alarms in certain specific occupations (building housing persons requiring evacuation assistance) has also been modified to specify that every room must now be equipped with a smoke alarm connected to an electrical system.

Before purchasing alarms, check to see if they are certified by Underwriters' Laboratories of Canada (ULC), a recognized standards organization. There is also often the CSA logo indicating that some parts of the alarm have been manufactured according to CSA International standards.

To know if a smoke alarm is working properly, simply press the test button for a few seconds to hear the beep. This should be done once a month.

Fire Prevention Week

In 2019, Fire Prevention Week will be held from October 7 to 13 under the theme "You are the first to be responsible!"

Throughout Québec, several activities will be organized to promote safe behaviours to be adopted on a daily basis in order to prevent fires. Every year, the Service de sécurité incendie de Montréal organizes a wide range of activities aimed at increasing fire safety awareness on its territory. SAFETY

WOOD HEATING

As of October 1, 2018, only wood-burning stoves and fireplaces with an EPA or CSA certification to the effect that they do not emit more than 2.5 g/h of fine particles into the atmosphere are authorized on the territory.

Wood heating is one of the main causes of smog in winter. It is now prohibited to use solid fuel heaters during smog warnings.

Declaration of a device or fireplace

Owners of a solid fuel appliance or fireplace must report it in one of the following ways:

- Fill out the declaration form available online at ville.montreal.qc.ca/chauffageaubeis
- Fill out the declaration form available at the Access Montréal Office
- Fill out the declaration form in PDF format available on Ville de Montréal's website and return it by fax to 514 280-4230 or by mail to:

The declaration of a new device must be filed within 120 days of purchase.

- Consult the smog warnings issued by Environment and Climate Change Canada through the Info-Smog program: ec.gc.ca/info-smog.
- Check the online weather forecast and the warnings issued by Ville de Montréal on its social media: **Facebook** - facebook.com/mtlville/ and **Twitter** - twitter.com/mtl_ville.
- Keep an eye on the city's air quality on Montréal's website: ville.montreal.qc.ca, under Environment → Air → Air Quality Surveillance.

It should be noted that the use of solid fuel heaters is exceptionally authorized during power outages lasting more than three hours.

CHIMNEY SWEEPING

According to the By-law on fire prevention, you are required to have chimneys, connecting pipes and flue pipes inspected in order to detect any hazardous condition, at intervals of no more than 12 months, each time you connect an appliance and each time a chimney fire has occurred.

In addition, it is strongly recommended to do business with a private chimney sweeping company registered with the Régie du bâtiment du Québec. We invite you to visit the Association des professionnels du chauffage website at poelesfoyers.ca to learn more on this subject.

- Show consideration for pedestrians and do not put any snow on the sidewalk.
- Obey the parking regulations and move your vehicle in time.
- Place your garbage cans, bags or containers in your driveway and never on the sidewalk or a snow bank.
- Shovel snow on your residential or commercial land and not in the street.
- Park 30 cm from the sidewalk and place your snow clearance markers 60 cm from the sidewalk or curb, on your own grounds.
- Make sure you remove all objects from your driveway - logs, paving stones, concrete blocks, etc. - that might be pushed into the street and cause a snowblower breakdown.

BOROUGH'S SNOW CLEARANCE

Less than 2.5 cm: ice melter and abrasives are spread.

More than 2.5 cm: roads and sidewalks are cleared during the snowfall.

If there is an accumulation of at least 10 to 15 cm: a snow loading operation gets underway, ordered by Ville de Montréal, and may take 2 to 6 days to complete, depending on the amount of the snowfall.

SUBSIDIES TO ENCOURAGE THE USE OF CLOTH DIAPERS

The Borough offers a subsidy program for families wishing to transition from disposable to cloth diapers. A result of a partnership with VertCité, the organization that oversees the Éco-quartier Pierrefonds-Roxboro, the program provides grants of up to \$100 each per child for the purchase or rental of cloth diapers, up to a total of \$4,500 per year for the program.

REMINDER OF THE BY-LAW ON THE USE OF PESTICIDES

The use of pesticides presents a risk to public health and environmental quality. The use of pesticides outside buildings is prohibited by by-law 04-041.

Despite this interdiction, some products considered to be of low toxicity are authorized at all times. There are also exceptions in cases where prohibited pesticides may be authorized, such as in the case of an infestation recognized by a Borough Inspector. In this instance, spreading is conditional on the issuance of a temporary permit by the Borough.

Do you entrust the maintenance of your lawn to a professional?

Just like you, companies must comply with municipal pesticide regulations. They must obtain a temporary pesticide permit before they can use the product on your property. When choosing your contractor, ask about their practices and the products they plan to use to maintain your property. **Remember that you could be held responsible for illegal pesticide applications on your property.**

MYTHS AND REALITIES ABOUT TREES

Some phenomena related to tree growth in cities are still unknown. There is often a significant difference between common myths about trees and the real causes of certain phenomena.

Here are four problematic situations whose origin is sometimes wrongly attributed to trees:

MYTH #1

Roots puncture or clog sewer pipes.

Reality

The roots are devoid of water detectors. They develop and proliferate where they are provided with favourable conditions. The roots thus slip through the open joints of obsolete pipes or pipes damaged by wear and tear but cannot perforate the pipes. Rather, their presence indicates a lack of impermeability in the domestic sewer system.

MYTH #2

Roots are a threat to the lawn

Reality

It is rather the dense shading of some tree species, not their roots, that often prevents the turf from growing under their branches. On the other hand, shade from trees reduces the ground temperature and protects the lawn during hot weather. Under dense shade or through surface roots, it is preferable to arrange a plant bed suitable for this condition rather than laying out grass.

MYTH #3

Roots lift sidewalks and asphalt and can damage foundations.

Reality

Sidewalks or asphalt are damaged or lifted by the passage of time, by the action of the weather (freeze-thaw cycles), by heavy machinery, or because of poor construction quality. Several factors can cause cracks in a foundation such as the nature of the soil, soil impermeabilization, prolonged periods of drought, etc. All of these factors can contribute to soil receding and lifting the foundation resulting in cracks.

The roots, on the other hand, are unable to exert pressure on anything. Instead, they mold themselves to the objects with which they come into contact.

MYTH #4

Tree crowns should be cut regularly to limit their height growth.

Reality

In all cases of height pruning of a tree, no more than one quarter of the top should ever be removed. Beyond this limit, the tree can become vulnerable to insects and diseases, especially if large branches have been cut. In addition to losing some of its nutrients and undergoing great stress, the topped tree will create more branches to protect itself. Result: it will quickly return to the same height, but with weaker branches.

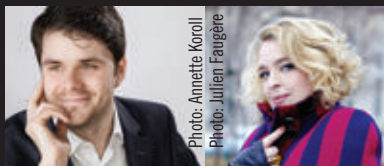
